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Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From the Charm Squares:

Cut each charm square in half horizontally and vertically to yield 2-1/2" squares.

From Fabric A, cut:

one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

twelve 2-1/2" squares. Add these to the squares cut from the charm squares for a total of 180 2-1/2" squares.

Set Fabric B aside for the Embroider the Blocks section.

From Fabric C, cut:

two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty-six 2-1/2" squares.

nine 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: eighteen 1-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles. eighteen 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" rectangles.

From Fabric D, cut:

ten 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: six 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" vertical sashing strips. Sew the remaining strips together, then subcut: two 2-1/2" x 50-1/2" top/bottom borders. four 2-1/2" x 46-1/2" strips—two horizontal sashing strips and two side borders.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

Embroider the Blocks

Step 1: Embroider the nine different blocks from the Fabric B panel. Use red embroidery floss, with one thread for all outline stitches; two threads for Lazy Daisy and French knot stitches.

Step 2: Hand wash and rinse the blocks after embroidering. Let dry flat. Press right side down on a towel or wool pressing mat. **Trim each block to 8-1/2" square.**

Assemble the Blocks

Step 3: Gather one embroidered square, two 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric C rectangles, two 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" Fabric C rectangles, four 2-1/2" Fabric C squares, and twenty 2-1/2" squares in a variety of fabrics cut from the charm pack.

Step 4: Select five of the 2-1/2" squares cut from the charm pack. Arrange the squares in a single row. Sew the squares together and press. Make four rows.

Step 5: Sew a 2-1/2" Fabric C square to the end of two of the rows, then press.

Step 6: Sew the 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric C rectangles to the two sides of the embroidered square, then press the seams outward.

Step 7: Sew the 2-1/2 x 10-1/2" Fabric C rectangles to the top and bottom of the unit, then press the seams towards outward.

Step 8: Sew the two shorter pieced rows to the left and right sides of the unit, then press the seams towards the center.

Step 9: Sew the two longer pieced rows to the top and bottom of the unit, then press the seams towards the center.

Step 10: Repeat to make nine blocks.
















Assemble the Quilt



Step 11: Arrange the blocks into three rows of three blocks. Place a 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" vertical sashing strip between each block.

Step 12: Sew the blocks and vertical sashing strips together to form rows. Press the seams towards the sashing strips.

Step 13: Place a 2-1/2" x 46-1/2" horizontal sashing strip in between each of the rows.

Step 14: Sew the pieced rows and sashing strips together to form the quilt center. Press the seams towards the sashing strips.

Step 15: Sew the side borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!

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
