Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, fussy cut:

six 10" squares for the Block Centers

From Fabric B, cut:

three 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 3-1/2" x 43" strips*

*If your fabric has 43" of usable print available, then cut two 3-1/2" x 43" strips instead.

From each of Fabrics C, F and G, cut:

one 10" square for a Block Center

From Fabric D, cut:

six 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 3-1/2" x 62" side Border 3 strips

two 3-1/2" x 57" top/bottom Border 3 strips

eleven 3" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

six 3" x 13" block sashing strips

four 3" x 43" row sashing strips

two 3" x 54" side Border 1 strips

two 3" x 48" top/bottom Border 1 strips

From Fabric E, cut:

five 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty 2" x 10" rectangles for the Block Borders

From Fabric H, cut:

four 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

four 2" x 10" rectangles for the Block Borders

Set aside the remaining two strips for the strip pieced units.

From Fabric I, cut:

four 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

four 2" x 10" rectangles for the Block Borders

Set aside the remaining two strips for the strip pieced units.

From Fabric J, cut:

two 2" x WOF strips. Set aside for the strip pieced units.

From Fabric K, cut:

four 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

four 2" x 10" rectangles for the Block Borders

Set aside the remaining two strips for the strip pieced units.

From Fabric L, cut:

three 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

four 2" squares for the Block Corners

Set aside the remaining two strips for the strip pieced units.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Blocks



Step 1: Gather:

four Fabric K squares

the Fabric C square

four Fabric E border strips

Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 2: Sew the units together to form the rows. Press the seams toward the Fabric E borders.

Step 3: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

The resulting Block will measure 13" square.

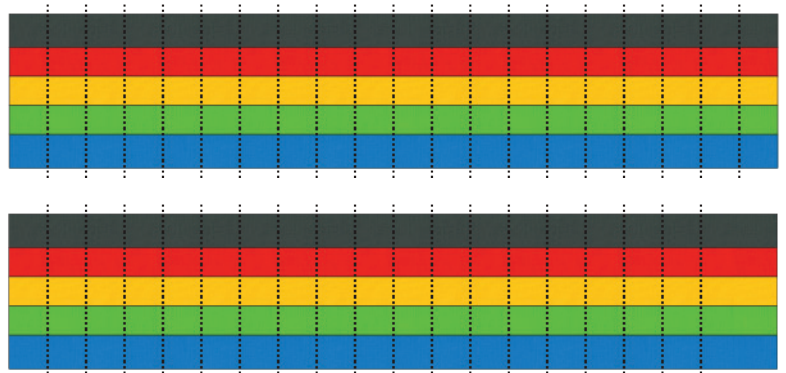
Repeat Steps 1-3 to make a total of nine Blocks, noting the fabric combinations in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Assemble the Strip Pieced Border

Step 3: Sew together, along the longest edge, in this order:

Fabric J + Fabric K + Fabric L + Fabric H + Fabric I

Press the seams to one side. Repeat to make a second strip set like this. Subcut the strip sets into thirty 2" x 8" units.



Step 4: Sew the eight units together, as shown. Using a seam ripper, remove one square from the end, which will leave a 59" long strip for one side Border 2 unit. Repeat to make a second unit like this.



Step 5: Sew seven units together, as shown, to form one top/bottom Border 2 unit. Repeat to make a second unit like this. Trim each of these units to 51" long.



Assemble the Quilt



Step 6: Arrange the Blocks together as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew each row together, using sashing strips between each block. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make three block rows.

Step 7: Sew the sashing and block rows together, including sewing a row sashing strip to the top and bottom edges of the quilt center. Press seams open or to the sashing.

Step 8: Sew a Fabric B strip to the top and bottom edges of the quilt center. Press seams to one side.

Step 9: Sew the side Border 1 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 1 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 10: Sew the pieced side Border 2 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the pieced top and bottom Border 2 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 11: Sew the side Border 3 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 3 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
