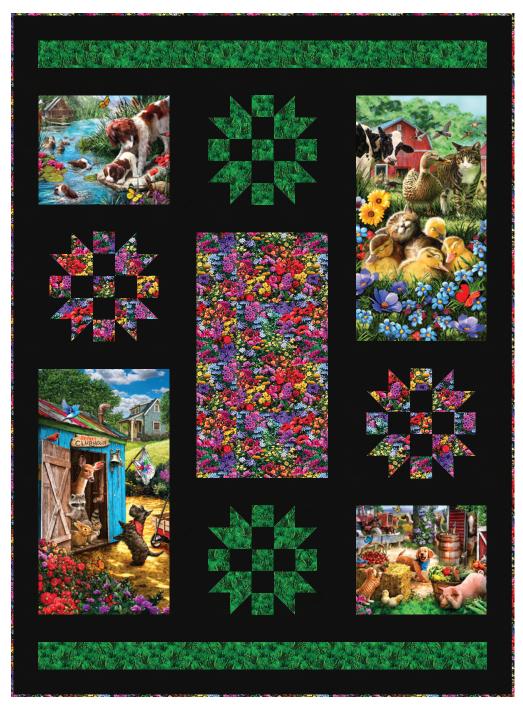

Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, fussy cut:

two 10-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles two 12-1/2" x 23" rectangles

From Fabric B, cut:

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight 3" squares for the HSTs
two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
eighteen 2-1/2" squares
one 12-1/2" x 23" rectangle

From Fabric C, cut:

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight 3" squares for the HSTs
two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
eighteen 2-1/2" squares
two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:
two 3" x 41-1/2" strips

From Fabric D, cut:

fourteen 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 sixteen 3" squares for the HSTs
 six 3" x 12-1/2" rectangles
 Trim four WOF strips to make:
 four 3" x 41-1/2" strips
 Sew the remaining six WOF strips together, end-to-end, then trim:
 two 3" x 63" side outer borders
 two 3" x 48" column sashing strips

two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 thirty-two 2-1/2" squares

two 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 eight 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" strips

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Blocks

Step 1: Pair a 3" Fabric B square with a 3" Fabric D square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2-1/2" square. Repeat to make sixteen B/D HSTs.



Step 2: Repeat Step 1 with the 3" Fabric C and D squares to make sixteen C/D HSTs.



Step 3: Gather the following 2-1/2" units: eight Fabric D nine Fabric B eight B/D HST

Arrange in five rows of five, following the Block Assembly Diagram. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the diagram. Sew the squares together to form rows, pressing the seams in opposite directions every other row. Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the row seams to one side. The block should measure 10-1/2" square at this point.

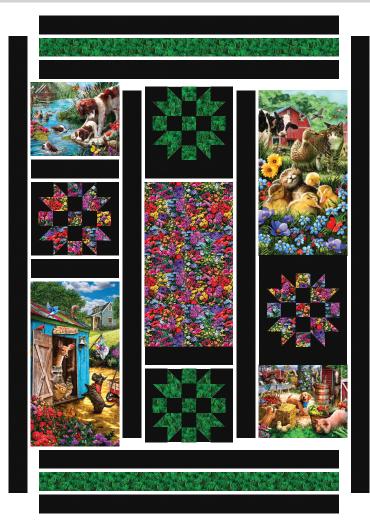
Step 4: Sew a 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" Fabric D strip to the left and right edge of the block. Press.

Repeat Steps 3 and 4 to make a second Block from Fabric B and two blocks from Fabric C. Each block will measure 12-1/2" x 10-1/2".





Assemble the Quilt



Step 5: Sew a 41-1/2" Fabric D strip to both long edges of a 41-1/2" Fabric C strip. Press. Repeat to make a second unit like this. Set aside.

Step 6: Arrange the quilt center, following the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew the quilt center together in columns, placing a 3" x 12-1/2" Fabric D sashing strip between the blocks. Press toward the sashing.

Step 7: Sew the three quilt center columns together, sewing a 3" x 48" Fabric D column sashing strip between each column. Press.

Step 8: Sew a completed Step 5 unit to the top and bottom edges of the quilt center. Press.

Step 9: Sew a 3" x 63" Fabric D strip to the left and right edges of the quilt. Press.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
