### Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

# **Cutting Instructions**

#### From Fabric A. cut:

three 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixty-three 2" squares

#### From each of Fabrics B-I, cut:

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nine 1-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

nine 1-1/4" x 8" rectangles

sixteen 1-1/4" x 6-1/2" rectangles

sixteen 1-1/4" x 5" rectangles

sixteen 1-1/4" x 3-1/2" rectangles

nine 1-1/4" x 2" rectangles
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The B-I fabrics will be referred to as "blue/tan" in the instructions.

#### From each of Fabrics J-Q, cut:

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nine 1-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
nine 1-1/4" x 8" rectangles
sixteen 1-1/4" x 6-1/2" rectangles
sixteen 1-1/4" x 5" rectangles
sixteen 1-1/4" x 3-1/2" rectangles
nine 1-1/4" x 2" rectangles
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The J-Q fabrics will be referred to as "pink/green" in the instructions.

#### From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

# Assembling the Blocks

**Step 1** Use the quilt assembly diagram for making each of the blocks, positioning each print exactly as shown. Check your seam allowance before starting!



Starting with the 2" square Fabric A white roses in the center, add pink/green 1-1/4" x 2" rectangles to opposite sides. Press toward the center.


**Step 2** Add blue/tan 1-1/4" x 3" rectangles to the opposite sides of the Step 1 unit. Press to the outside of the block.




**Step 3** Add pink/green 1-1/4" x 3" rectangles to the matching side of the unit from Step 2. Press toward the outside of the block.



**Step 4** Continue in this manner until the block measures 8" unfinished. Repeat for each of the blocks, using the full-size quilt image as a guide for fabric placement. Make 63 blocks. (There will be a few rectangles left over.)



# Assembling the Quilt



**Step1** Arrange the blocks in nine rows of seven blocks each. Sew the blocks together in each row. Press the seams so they alternate in every other row. Join the rows. Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
