

Finished quilt measures: 85" x 85"



Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

two 5" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen 5" squares

From Fabric B, cut:

two 5" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirteen 5" squares
eight 2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then cut:
two 2" x 72-1/2" top/bottom inner borders
two 2" x 75-1/2" side inner borders

From Fabric C, cut:

two 5" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twelve 5" squares

From Fabric D, cut:

two 5" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirteen 5" squares

From each of Fabrics E-H, cut:

two 5" x WOF strips. Subcut:
fourteen 5" squares

From Fabric I, cut:

one 5" x WOF strip. Subcut:
seven 5" squares

From Fabric J, cut:

fourteen 5" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one hundred six 5" squares**

From Fabric K, cut:

thirteen 5" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one hundred one 5" squares**

From Fabric L, cut:

eight 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then cut:

two 5-1/2" x 75-1/2" top/bottom outer borders

two 5-1/2" x 85-1/2" side outer borders

****Note:** the directional print on this fabric may not be right reading in all places in the quilt, but will blend in nicely as a background. If you wish to make it right reading in the entire quilt, you will need to cut each square in half along the diagonal (some cut left to right and others cut right to left) and piece the HSTs individually, referring to the Quilt Assembly Diagram. For speed, you can assemble as instructed below and let the fabric be facing all directions when it is pieced together.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

nine 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a Fabric A square with a Fabric J square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 4-1/2" square. Repeat to make thirty-two A/J HSTs.



Step 2: Repeat Step 2 to make:




twenty-six B/J HSTs



twenty-four C/J HSTs



twenty-six D/J HSTs



fourteen I/J HSTs



twenty-eight H/K HSTs



twenty-eight E/K HSTs



twenty-eight G/K HSTs



twenty-eight F/K HSTs



ninety J/K HSTs

Assemble the Quilt



Step 3: Arrange the blocks into eighteen rows of eighteen blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Tip: You can also assemble the quilt top in nine rows of nine four-patches, rather than individual rows.

Step 4: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 5: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Step 6: Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 7: Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
