

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 43" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 2-1/2" squares.

From Fabric B, cut:

four 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 2-1/2" squares. twenty 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles.

From each of Fabrics C and D, cut:

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: ten 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles. ten 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles.

From each of Fabrics E and G, cut:

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: six 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles. six 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles.

From Fabric F, cut:

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: seven 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles. seven 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles.

From each of Fabrics H and J, cut:

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: six 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles. six 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" rectangles.

From Fabric I. cut:

four 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: seven 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles. seven 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" rectangles.

From each of Fabrics K and M, cut:

four 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: six 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" rectangles. six 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles.

From Fabric L, cut:

five 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: seven 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" rectangles. seven 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles.

From each of Fabrics N and P, cut:

four 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: six 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles. six 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" rectangles.

From Fabric O, cut:

five 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: seven 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles. seven 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" rectangles.

From each of Fabrics Q and S, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: six 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" rectangles. six 2-1/2" x 16-1/2" rectangles.

From Fabric R, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: seven 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" rectangles. seven 2-1/2" x 16-1/2" rectangles.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

Assemble the Blocks

Note: For all block types, press seams after sewing each piece. Press toward the darker fabric. Repeat Steps 1-7 for each block type (colorway).

The A Blocks (Pink)



Step 1: Sew a 2-1/2" Fabric A square to a 2-1/2" Fabric B square. With the Fabric B square on top, sew a 4-1/2" Fabric B strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 2: Sew a 4-1/2" Fabric C strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric C strip on top, sew a 6-1/2" Fabric C strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 3: Sew a 6-1/2" Fabric E strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric E strip on top, sew a 8-1/2" Fabric E strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 4: Sew a 8-1/2" Fabric H strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric H strip on top, sew a 10-1/2" Fabric H strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 5: Sew a 10-1/2" Fabric K strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric K strip on top, sew a 12-1/2" Fabric K strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 6: Sew a 12-1/2" Fabric N strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric N strip on top, sew a 14-1/2" Fabric N strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 7: Sew a 14-1/2" Fabric Q strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric Q strip on top, sew a 16-1/2" Fabric Q strip to the left edge of the unit.

Repeat to make six 16-1/2" square A Blocks.

The B1 Blocks (Purple)



Step 1: Sew a 2-1/2" Fabric A square to a 2-1/2" Fabric B square. With the Fabric B square on top, sew a 4-1/2" Fabric B strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 2: Sew a 4-1/2" Fabric C strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric C strip on top, sew a 6-1/2" Fabric C strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 3: Sew a 6-1/2" Fabric F strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric F strip on top, sew a 8-1/2" Fabric F strip to the left edge of the unit.


Step 4: Sew a 8-1/2" Fabric I strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric I strip on top, sew a 10-1/2" Fabric I strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 5: Sew a 10-1/2" Fabric L strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric L strip on top, sew a 12-1/2" Fabric L strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 6: Sew a 12-1/2" Fabric O strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric O strip on top, sew a 14-1/2" Fabric O strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 7: Sew a 14-1/2" Fabric R strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric R strip on top, sew a 16-1/2" Fabric R strip to the left edge of the unit.

Repeat to make four 16-1/2" square B1 Blocks.





Step 1: Sew a 2-1/2" Fabric A square to a 2-1/2" Fabric B square. With the Fabric B square on top, sew a 4-1/2" Fabric B strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 2: Sew a 4-1/2" Fabric D strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric D strip on top, sew a 6-1/2" Fabric D strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 3: Sew a 6-1/2" Fabric F strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric F strip on top, sew a 8-1/2" Fabric F strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 4: Sew a 8-1/2" Fabric I strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric I strip on top, sew a 10-1/2" Fabric I strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 5: Sew a 10-1/2" Fabric L strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric L strip on top, sew a 12-1/2" Fabric L strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 6: Sew a 12-1/2" Fabric O strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric O strip on top, sew a 14-1/2" Fabric O strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 7: Sew a 14-1/2" Fabric R strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric R strip on top, sew a 16-1/2" Fabric R strip to the left edge of the unit.

Repeat to make four 16-1/2" square B2 Blocks.

The C Blocks (Blue)



Step 1: Sew a 2-1/2" Fabric A square to a 2-1/2" Fabric B square. With the Fabric B square on top, sew a 4-1/2" Fabric B strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 2: Sew a 4-1/2" Fabric D strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric D strip on top, sew a 6-1/2" Fabric D strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 3: Sew a 6-1/2" Fabric G strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric G strip on top, sew a 8-1/2" Fabric G strip to the left edge of the unit.


Step 4: Sew a 8-1/2" Fabric J strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric J strip on top, sew a 10-1/2" Fabric J strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 5: Sew a 10-1/2" Fabric M strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric M strip on top, sew a 12-1/2" Fabric M strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 6: Sew a 12-1/2" Fabric P strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric P strip on top, sew a 14-1/2" Fabric P strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 7: Sew a 14-1/2" Fabric S strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric S strip on top, sew a 16-1/2" Fabric S strip to the left edge of the unit.

Repeat to make six 16-1/2" square C Blocks.



Step 8: Arrange the blocks into five rows of four blocks each. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 9: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 10: Sew the rows together to form the quilt. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is now complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
