# Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.


## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## **Cutting Instructions**

#### From Fabric A, cut:

twelve quarter square triangles, using Template 1, following the cutting diagram shown here.



- 3- Layer four of the stripes RSU on top of each other. Be very careful they all line up as closely as possible.

  4- Place a ruler or make a template that is a 11.25 square cut twice diagonally. The diagram below shows where the templates were placed in the quilit shown on the pattern cover.



#### From Fabric B, cut:

two 7" squares. Cut each square once along the diagonal, creating a total of four triangles.

#### From Fabric C, cut:

four 1-1/2" x 15" rectangles\*

\*Note: these are left longer than necessary, to allow for trimming

#### From Fabric D, cut:

four 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

four 3-1/2" x 20" rectangles, for Piece D

two 3-1/2" x 14" rectangles, for Piece E

two 3-1/2" x 17" rectangles, for Piece F

#### From the Binding Fabric, cut:

four 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Assemble the Fabric A Blocks

**Step 1:** Arrange four identical triangles as shown to form Block 1. Sew triangles together in pairs, pressing seams in opposite directions. Sew the pairs together, pinning and nesting the seams. Press. Trim to 10-1/2" square.



**Step 2:** Arrange four identical triangles as shown to form Block 2. Sew triangles together in pairs, pressing seams in opposite directions. Sew the pairs together, pinning and nesting the seams. Press. Trim to 10-1/2" square.



**Step 3:** Arrange four identical triangles as shown to form Block 3. Sew triangles together in pairs, pressing seams in opposite directions. Sew the pairs together, pinning and nesting the seams. Press. Trim to 10-1/2" square.



**Step 4:** Sew a Fabric C strip between a Fabric B and Fabric D/ Piece D unit, centering each piece along the length. Press. Repeat to make four units like this.




Step 5: Trim the Step 5 units along the angled edges, as shown.



## Assemble the Table Runner

**Step 6:** Arrange the Blocks and the Step 5 units following the Assembly Diagram. Sew the triangle units to the Blocks as shown, aligning the right angles. Press.


**Step 7:** Trim the Block/triangle units as shown. Then sew the Block units together. Press. Sew the E and F units, press and trim.



Your table runner is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
