Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From each of Fabrics A-P, cut:


two 5" squares thirty-two 2" squares.

Additionally, from **Fabrics B**, **D**, **F and J**, cut one 2-1/2" square for the HSTs

Note: You will not use sixteen of the 2" squares from each of Fabrics P and G, or one of the 5" squares from each of Fabrics H and O.

From Fabric R, cut:

six 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim: two 3-1/2" x 57" side outer borders two 3-1/2" x 54" top/bottom outer borders



From Fabric Q, cut:

three 5" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 5" squares Trim the remainder of the last strip to 2-1/2" wide, then subcut: four 2-1/2" squares for the HSTs
five 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim: two 2-1/2" x 53" side inner borders two 2-1/2" x 48" top/bottom inner borders
fifteen 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixty-seven 2" x 5" rectangles one hundred twenty 2" squares

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 2-1/2" Fabric Q square with a 2-1/2" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2" square. Repeat to make:



one Q/B HST



one Q/J HST



one Q/D HST




one Q/F HST

Assemble the Stitch and Flip Units


Note: The steps in this section involve stitching in marked diagonal lines. You may mark a diagonal line on your 2" squares used here, if you wish, or simply eyeball the stitching lines.

Step 2: Place a 2" Fabric B square at the left end a Fabric Q rectangle, right sides together. Note the orientation of the marked diagonal line shown here. Sew on the marked line, then trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Repeat on the right end with a 2" Fabric D square.



Step 3: Referring to the fabric placement and pairings in the Quilt Assembly Diagram, repeat Step 2 to make a total of eighteen units. These will be used around the outermost pieced edge of the quilt center.


Step 4: Place a 2" Fabric B square in the upper right corner of a 5" Fabric A square, right sides together. Note the orientation of the marked diagonal line. Sew on the marked line, then trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Repeat on the remaining corners of the 5" square.



Step 5: Referring to the fabric placement and pairings in the Quilt Assembly Diagram, repeat Step 4 to make a total of thirty units with print centers and twenty units with Fabric Q centers.

Assemble the Pieced Units

Step 6: Sew a 2" Fabric B square to opposite edges of a 2" Fabric Q square. Press away from Fabric Q.




Step 7: Referring to the fabric placement and pairings in the Quilt Assembly Diagram, repeat Step 6 to make a total of twenty-two units, each for the outside edge of the quilt.

Step 8: Referring to the fabric placement and pairings in the Quilt Assembly Diagram, repeat Step 6 to make a total of ninety-eight units, each for the inner portion of the quilt center. Note that some of these units will be made from the same fabrics on either side of the Q square, but that some units will be made with different fabrics on either side of the Q square. It is best to organize your finished pieces by row, in piles, for easier sewing later.

Step 9: Referring to the Quilt Assembly Diagram for fabric pairings and placement, gather two units from Step 8 and one 2" x 5" Fabric Q rectangle. Sew together as shown and press away from the Q rectangle.

Step 10: Referring to the fabric placement and pairings in the Quilt Assembly Diagram, repeat Step 9 to make a total of forty-nine units.



Assemble the Quilt



Step 11:

Arrange the HSTs, stitchand-flip, and pieced units into rows as shown. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 12: Sew the units together to form rows. Press the seams away from the stitch and flip units.

Step 13: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Step 14: Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 15: Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
