Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

twenty-four 4" x WOF strips. Subcut: two hundred forty 4" squares for the HSTs

From each of Fabrics B-U, cut:

two 4" x WOF strips. Subcut: twelve 4" squares for the HSTs

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 4" Fabric A square with a 4" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Repeat to make twenty-four A/B HSTs. Set aside one HST for a future project and keep the remaining twenty-three for the quilt.



Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make:



Assemble the Quilt



Step 3: Arrange the blocks into twenty-three rows of twenty blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 4: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 5: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
