

Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

one 13" x WOF strip. Subcut:

seventeen 2-1/2" x 13" sashing strips

four 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

forty-eight 3" squares

five 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end and set aside for the outer borders.

forty-eight Template 1 pieces

From each of Fabrics B-D, cut:

two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

sixteen 3-1/2" squares. With the stripes on the fabric going <u>up and down</u>, cut half of the squares in half along one diagonal, from upper left to lower right and cut half of the squares from upper right to lower left.

Trim the remainder of the strip to 3" wide to use in cutting the 3" squares listed below. one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:

sixteen 3" squares (will use some of the strip cut for the 3-1/2" squares)

From each of Fabrics E-G, cut:

two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

sixteen 3-1/2" squares squares with the stripes on the fabric going <u>left and right</u>, cut half of the squares in half along one diagonal, from upper left to lower right and cut half of the squares from upper right to lower left.

Trim the remainder of the strip to 3" wide to use in cutting the 3" squares listed below. one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:

sixteen 3" squares (will use some of the strip cut for the 3-1/2" squares)

From each of Fabrics H-J, cut:

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:

four 3" squares

sixteen Template 2 pieces (cut eight with the stripes going left-right and eight with the stripes going up-down)

sixteen Template 2-Reversed pieces (cut eight with the stripes going left-right and eight with the stripes going up-down)

From Fabric K, cut:

one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: six 2-1/2" cornerstone squares

From the binding, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Block Units





Step 1: Pair a 3-1/2" Fabric B triangle with a Fabric E triangle in the fabric direction shown here, RST and sew along the longest edge to form a half-square triangle (HST). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3" square. Repeat to make sixteen B/E HSTs of each style.

Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make sixteen each of two styles of C/F HSTs and sixteen each of two styles of D/G HSTs.









Step 3: Gather a Fabric H, Template 2 and a Fabric H, Template 2-Reversed and a Fabric A, Template 1 piece. Both Template 2 pieces should have stripes going up-down. Sew the Template 2 pieces to opposite sides of the Template 1 piece, as shown. Press toward the Template 2 pieces. Trim to 3" square, if needed. Repeat to make eight H/A units of this orientation and eight with the Template 2 pieces with stripes going left-right.





Step 4: Repeat Step 3 to make sixteen I/A Template 1/2 units and sixteen J/A Template 1/2 units, again with half of each type having stripes going up-down and half with stripes going left-right.










Assemble the A Blocks (Green)



Step 5: Gather:

four 3" Fabric A squares

four 3" Fabric B squares

four 3" Fabric E squares

one 3" Fabric H square

eight B/E HSTs

four H/A Template 1/2 units


Note the orientation of the print on the fabrics for each piece.

Step 6: Arrange the blocks into five rows of five blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 7: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 8: Sew the rows together to form the block. Press the row seams open. Repeat Steps 5-8 to make four A Blocks.

Assemble the B Blocks (Blue)



Step 9: Gather:

four 3" Fabric A squares

four 3" Fabric C squares

four 3" Fabric F squares

one 3" Fabric I square

eight C/F HSTs

four I/A Template 1/2 units


Note the orientation of the print on the fabrics for each piece.

Step 10: Arrange the blocks into five rows of five blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 11: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 12: Sew the rows together to form the block. Press the row seams open. Repeat Steps 9-12 to make four B Blocks.

Assemble the C Blocks (Red)



Step 13: Gather:

four 3" Fabric A squares

four 3" Fabric D squares

four 3" Fabric G squares

one 3" Fabric J square

eight D/G HSTs

four J/A Template 1/2 units


Note the orientation of the print on the fabrics for each piece.

Step 14: Arrange the blocks into five rows of five blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 15: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 16: Sew the rows together to form the block. Press the row seams open. Repeat Steps 13-16 to make four C Blocks.

Assemble the Quilt



Step 17: Arrange the A, B and C Blocks together as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew each row together, using sashing strips between each block. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make four block rows.

Step 18: Gather two cornerstone squares and three sashing strips. Sew each row together, using cornerstones between each sashing strip. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make three sashing rows.


Step 19: Sew the sashing and block rows together, pinning and nesting the seams. Press seams open or to the sashing.

Step 20: Measure the length of the quilt through the center. Cut two 2-1/2" wide side border strips to this length. Sew the borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the border. Measure the width of the quilt through the center. Cut two top/bottom border strips to this width. Sew the borders to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press toward the border.

Your quilt top is now complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
