## Fabric and Supplies Needed

*Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.*

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## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## Cutting Instructions

### **From Fabric A, cut:**

twelve 9-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:  
forty-eight 9-1/2" squares

### **From Fabric B, cut:**

seven 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim to yield:  
two 4-1/2" x 54-1/2" top/bottom inner borders  
two 4-1/2" x 80-1/2" side inner borders  
twenty-four of Template 1  
twenty-four of Template 2

### **From Fabric C, cut:**

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim to yield:  
two 2-1/2" x 62-1/2" top/bottom outer borders  
two 2-1/2" x 84-1/2" side outer borders  
sixteen of Template 1  
twenty of Template 2

### **From each of Fabrics D, E, H and M, cut:**

thirty-six of Template 3

### **From Fabric F, cut:**

twenty-four of Template 1  
twelve of Template 2

### **From Fabric G, cut:**

twenty-eight of Template 1  
twenty of Template 2

### **From Fabric I, cut:**

sixteen of Template 1  
twenty of Template 2

### **From Fabric J, cut:**

twenty-four of Template 1  
twenty-four of Template 2



**From Fabric K, cut:**  
four of Template 1  
eight of Template 2

**From Fabric L, cut:**  
eight of Template 1  
sixteen of Template 2

**From the Binding fabric, cut:**  
eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

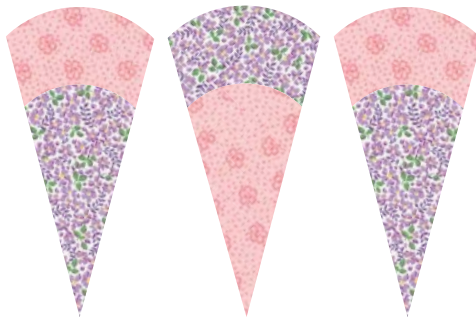
## Assemble the Block



### Step 1: Gather:

- one 9-1/2" Fabric A square
- two Fabric J/Template 1 pieces
- one Fabric C/Template 1 piece
- two Fabric C/Template 2 pieces
- one Fabric J/Template 2 piece
- three Fabric E/Template 3 pieces

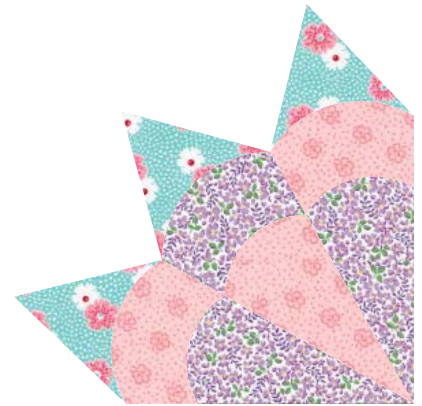
Sew the Template 2 pieces to the outer curves of each Template 1 piece, as shown, pairing the different fabrics together. Clip the seam allowance along the curve, taking care not to clip the stitches. Press to one side.



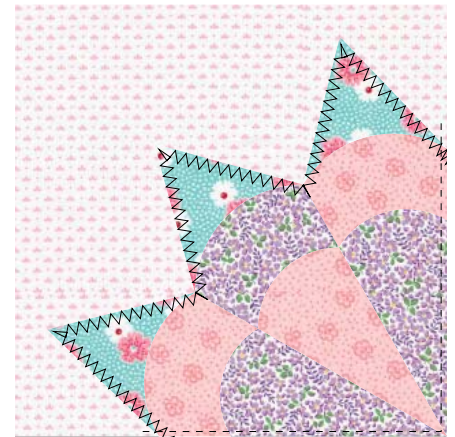
**Step 2:** Sew a Fabric Template 3 piece to the outer curve of each unit. Clip the seam allowance along the curve, taking care not to clip the stitches. Press to one side.



**Step 3:** Sew the three units together, as shown. Press the seam open.

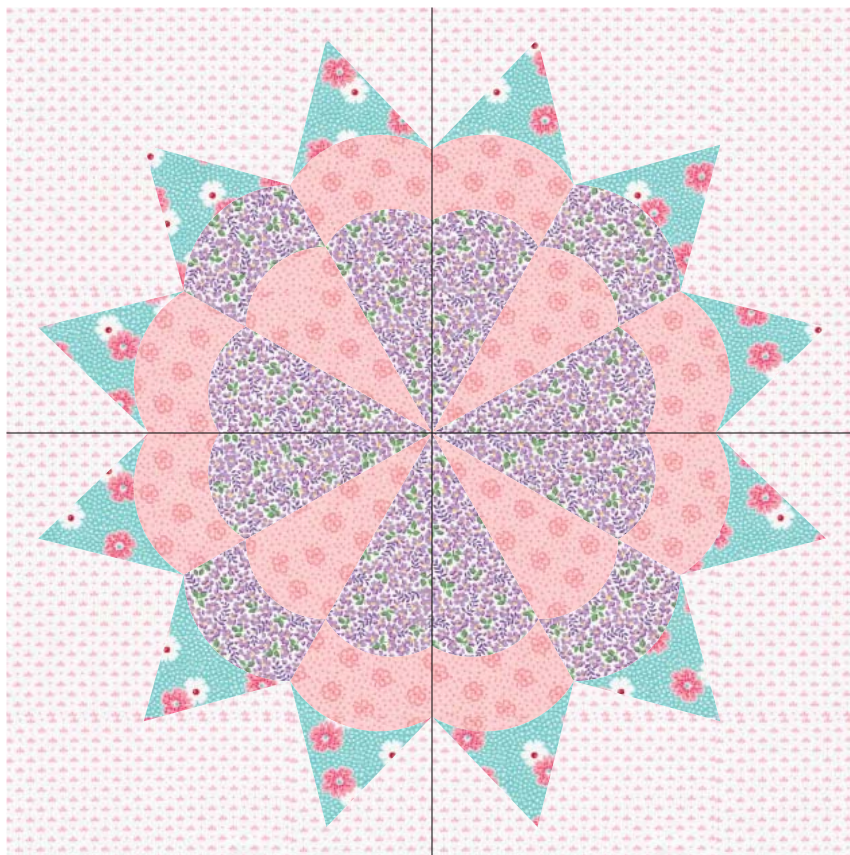


**Step 4:** Place the unit on one 9-1/2" Fabric A square, as shown. Align the two straight edges of the pieced unit to two adjacent edges of the square. Smooth the unit to ensure that it is flat, then pin in place. Baste along both straight edges, using a 1/8" seam allowance. Using a small zigzag stitch, appliqué the pointed Template 3 edges of the unit to the square.



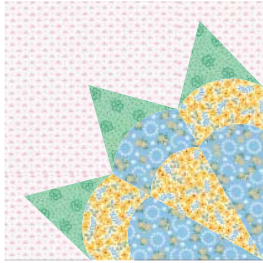
**Step 5:** Repeat Steps 1-4 to create a total of four 9-1/2" square units for Block 1.

*Note: If it is important to you that the small print in Fabric A is the same direction throughout the entire quilt, take care when arranging your four units for appliquéing.*



**Step 6:** Sew the four units together to form two rows of two. Press the seams in opposite directions. Sew the rows together, pressing the seam open. The completed block will measure 18-1/2" square.

**Step 7:** Repeat this process for each of the remaining blocks. Use this guide for fabric placement:

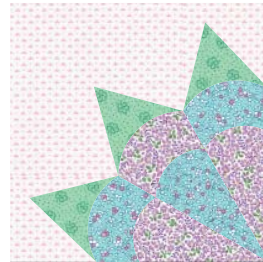

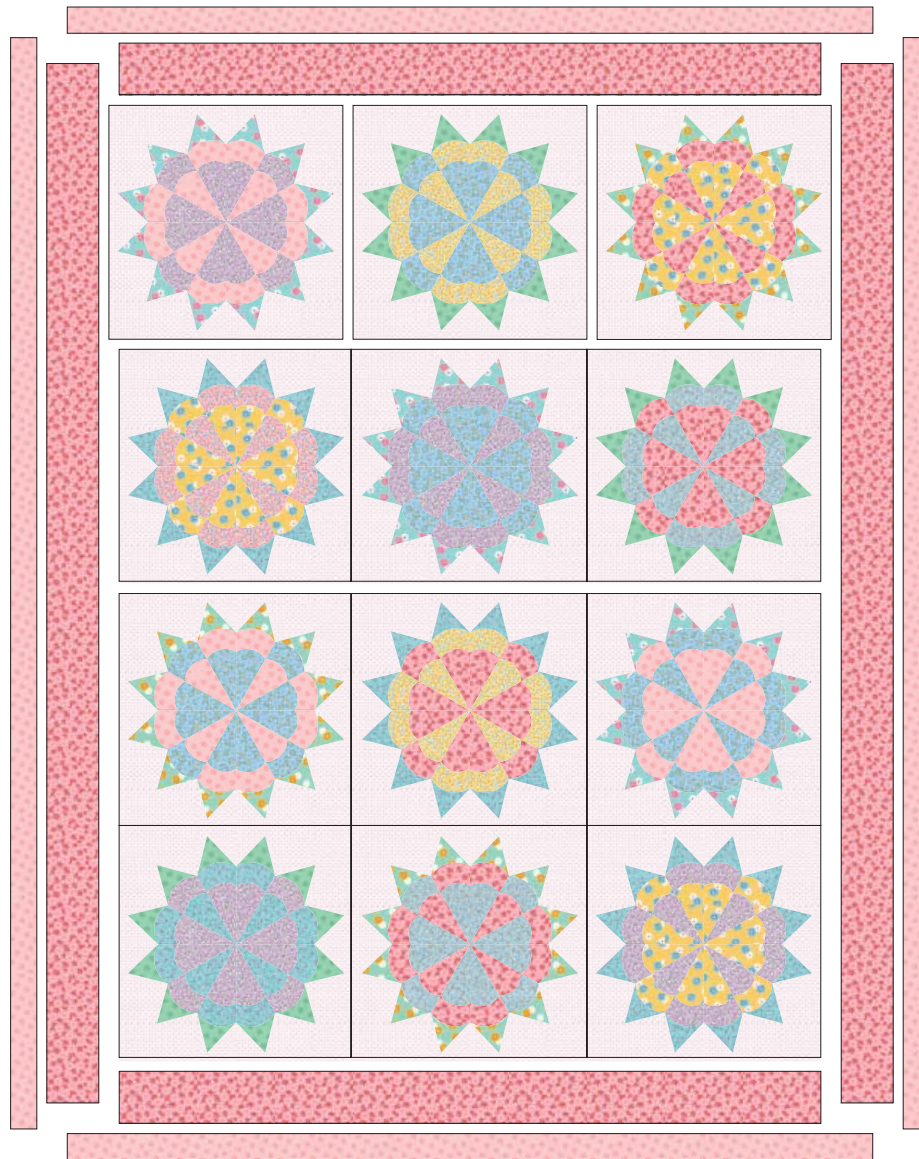

## Assemble the Quilt



**Step 8:** Arrange the blocks into four rows of three blocks. Note the block placement in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

**Step 9:** Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

**Step 10:** Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

**Step 11:** Sew the 4-1/2" x 54-1/2" Fabric B top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the 4-1/2" x 80-1/2" Fabric B side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

**Step 12:** Sew the 2-1/2" x 62-1/2" Fabric C side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the 2-1/2" x 84-1/2" Fabric C top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is now complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

Print at 100%.
