Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

six 4" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixty 4" squares for the HSTs seven 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred twenty of Template 1 eighteen 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-four 1-1/2" x 9-1/2" block sashing strips Sew the remaining twelve strips together, end-to-end, then trim: five 1-1/2" x 49-1/2" row sashing strips two 1-1/2" x 51-1/2" top/bottom inner borders two 1-1/2" x 59-1/2" side inner borders

From each of Fabrics B and D, cut:

one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: eight 3-1/2" squares for the Block Centers

From Fabric C, cut:

one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: seven 3-1/2" squares for the Block Centers

From Fabric E, cut:

one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: seven 3-1/2" squares for the Block Centers six 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim: two 3-1/2" x 57-1/2" top/bottom outer borders

two 3-1/2" x 61-1/2" side outer borders

From each of Fabrics F and H, cut:

two 4" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixteen 4" squares for the HSTs

From each of Fabrics G and I, cut:

two 4" x WOF strips. Subcut: fourteen 4" squares for the HSTs

From each of Fabrics J and L, cut:

three 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty-two of Template 2 thirty-two of Template 2-Reversed

**Tip: Leave the WOF strip folded in half and cut the templates from the folded unit, yielding the Template 2 piece with a Template 2-Reversed piece with each cut.

From each of Fabrics K and M, cut:

two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-eight of Template 2 twenty-eight of Template 2-Reversed

**Tip: Leave the WOF strip folded in half and cut the templates from the folded unit, yielding the Template 2 piece with a Template 2-Reversed piece with each cut.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 4" Fabric A square with a 4" Fabric F square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Repeat to make thirty-two A/F HSTs.

Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make:



twenty-eight A/G HSTs



thirty-two A/H HSTs



twenty-eight A/I HSTs

Assemble the Template Units

Step 3: Sew a Template 2/Fabric J triangle to one long edge of a Template 1/Fabric A triangle, as shown. Press. Sew a Template 2-Reversed/Fabric J triangle to the remaining long edge of the Template 1/Fabric A triangle, as shown. Press. Trim to 3-1/2" square, if needed. Repeat to make thirty-two A/J units like this.



Step 4: Repeat Step 3 to make:



twenty-eight A/K HSTs



thirty-two A/L HSTs





Step 5: Gather: four A/F HSTs four A/J units one Fabric B square


Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 6: Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams away from the A/J units.

Step 7: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

The resulting Block should measure 9-1/2" square. Repeat to make eight Blocks with Fabric B centers.

Step 8: Repeat Steps 5-7 to make:



seven Blocks with Fabric C centers



eight Blocks with Fabric D centers



seven Blocks with Fabric E centers

Assemble the Quilt



Step 9: Arrange the Blocks together as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew each row together, using sashing strips between each block. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make six block rows.

Step 10: Sew the sashing and block rows together. Press seams open or to the sashing.

Step 11: Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.


Step 12: Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is finished! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
