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## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4$ " unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

## From Fabric A, cut:

eight 5" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixty 5 " squares.
seventeen 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one-hundred and fifty 4-1/2" squares.
From each of Fabrics B, F, G, and K, cut:
one 5 " $\times$ WOF strip. Subcut:
six 5" squares.
two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twenty-four 2-1/2" squares
From each of Fabric C-E, cut:
one 5" x WOF strip. Subcut:
four 5" squares.
two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty-two 2-1/2" squares.
From each of Fabrics H-J, cut:
one 5 " x WOF strip. Subcut: eight 5 " squares.
one 2-1/2" strip. Subcut: sixteen 2-1/2" squares.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:
seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

## Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 5" Fabric A square with a 5" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew $1 / 4$ " away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 4-1/2" square. Repeat to make twelve A/B HSTs.

Step 2: Repeat Step 1 using a 5" A square paired with each 5" C-K square to make:

eight
A/C HSTs

sixteen
A/I HSTs

twelve A/K HSTs

Step 3: Place a $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B square on the bottom left corner of a 4-1/2" Fabric A square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of
 the smaller square. Sew on the marked line. Trim the excess fabric $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from the sewn seam. Press toward the corner. Repeat to replace the bottom right corner with a second 2-1/2" Fabric B square. Trim to 4-1/2" square. Repeat to make twelve A/B SNFs.

Step 4: Repeat Step 3 using a 4-1/2" A square paired with pairs of $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ C-K squares to make:


A/I SNFs

Assemble the Blocks
Note: Press all seams open.
Step 5: Gather one 4-1/2" Fabric A square, four A/B HSTs, and four A/G SNFs and arrange them in three rows of three as shown. Sew the units together to form rows and press. Sew the rows together, then press. Make three B/G Blocks.

## Assemble the Quilt



Step 6: Arrange the blocks into six rows of five blocks. Note the block placement in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 7: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the seams to the left in the odd-numbered rows and to the right in the even-numbered rows.

Step 8: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.
Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!

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
