Tool Requirements

Easy Angle (EZ Quilting #8823759)

Flip n' Set (EZ Quilting #8823755)

Easy Scallop (EZ Quilting #8823754)

(NOTE: If not using Flip n' Set, cut (4) 16" squares, then cut each square twice on the diagonal to yield 16 triangles.)

Assembling the Blocks (Make 20)


Step 1 - Sew all the light & dark triangles together. Press & trim dog-ears. At this point the squares should measure 2-1/2".

Step 2 - For each block, choose (8) matching triangle squares from Step 1, and from a background fabric, (4) 2-1/2" squares, and a 2-1/2" x 21" strip. From a coordinating medium fabric, choose (4) 2-1/2" squares and a 2-1/2" x 21" strip.

Step 3 - Using the units from Step 2 above, assemble (8) corner units as shown. Press.




Step 4 - Sew the 2-1/2" x 21" background & medium print strips together to make a strip set. Press toward the darker fabric. Cut into (8) 2-1/2" wide units.



^{*}Before cutting the triangles, pair up the dark prints with the two different background prints. Layer dark & background strips right sides together and cut with the Easy Angle. The triangles will be ready to chain-sew.

Assembling the Blocks (continued)

Step 5 - Sew the Step 3 units, the Step 4 strip set units, and a yellow 2-1/2" square together to make (2) identical blocks. Press as shown. At this point, the blocks should measure 10-1/2". Make (2) blocks (total 20) of each color combination, following Steps 1-5.



Assembling the Quilt

Step 1 - Cut the hankies apart, then trim each to 10-1/2" square (or the same size as your pieced blocks).

Step 2 - Arrange the blocks in diagonal rows, alternating the pieced blocks and the hanky blocks. Put the large setting triangles along the edge of the quilt top and the smaller triangles at the corners.

Step 3 - Sew the blocks together in diagonal rows, pressing toward the hanky blocks and the setting triangles. (Note the setting triangles are a bit larger than needed. Put the excess at the outer edges of the quilt top.)

Step 4 - Sew the rows together, pinning & matching the seam intersections. Press the row seams all one direction. Center and sew the corner triangles last.

Step 5 - Trim the edges of the quilt straight, being careful to leave a 1/4" seam allowance from the corners of the blocks.

Borders

Step 1 - Sew the yellow border strips together end to end. Press the seams open. Measure and trim two borders the width of the quilt. Sew to the top & bottom of the quilt and press toward the borders. Repeat for the side borders.

Step 2 - Repeat the process for the outer blue borders. Press toward the borders.


Finishing the Quilt

Step 1 - Cut the 5yds backing into two equal pieces. Trim off the selvage on one side of each piece. Sew those edges together with a 1/2" seam pressed open.

Step 2 - Layer the backing wrong side up, the batting, and the quilt top right side up. Baste, then quilt as desired.

Finishing the Quilt (continued)

Step 3 - Mark a wavy edge with the Easy Scallop tool set at 4". Starting at the upper left corner, mark a right side up scallop, then an upside down scallop, etc. Repeat from both corners to the center, adjusting the middle one or two scallops as needed. Repeat for the side borders using a 4" scallop. At the corners, the overlapping scallops will create a rounded corner automatically.



Step 4 - Baste on the marked line, but do NOT cut on that line.

Step 5 - Prepare the single bias binding by sewing the ends together and pressing the seams open. Sew to the quilt using the marked line for a placement guide. Sew a 1/4" seam below the marked line. Trim evenly to 1/4" seam allowance, then turn the binding to the back side, turn under the raw edge, and stitch down by hand with matching thread.
