Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

one 8-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 8-1/2" squares for the Block Centers

From each of Fabrics B, C, E, F cut:

one 8-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: three 8-1/2" squares for the Block Centers

From Fabric D, cut:

one 8-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

four 8-1/2" squares for the Block Centers

eight 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 4-1/2" x 78-1/2" side outer borders

two 4-1/2" x 71-1/2" top/bottom outer borders

From each of Fabrics G and J, cut:

four 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

eight 2" x 8-1/2" rectangles for the Block side inner borders eight 2" x 11-1/2" rectangles for the Block top/bottom inner borders *Tip: cut two of each length from each WOF strip to maximize yardage five 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

six 2-1/2" x 11-1/2" rectangles for the Block side outer borders

six 2-1/2" x 15-1/2" rectangles for the Block top/bottom outer borders

From each of Fabrics H, I, K and L, cut:

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

six 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles for the Block side inner borders

six 2-1/2" x 11-1/2" rectangles for the Block top/bottom inner borders

*Tip: cut two of each length from each WOF strip to maximize yardage

From each of Fabrics M and P, cut:

five 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

six 2-1/2" x 11-1/2" rectangles for the Block side outer borders

six 2-1/2" x 15-1/2" rectangles for the Block top/bottom outer borders

From each of Fabrics N and O, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

eight 2-1/2" x 11-1/2" rectangles for the Block side outer borders

eight 2-1/2" x 15-1/2" rectangles for the Block top/bottom outer borders

From Fabric Q, cut:

seven 2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 2" x 75-1/2" side inner borders

two 2" x 63-1/2" top/bottom inner borders

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Blocks



Step 1: Gather:

one 8-1/2" Fabric A square

two Fabric G side inner borders

two Fabric G top/bottom inner borders

two Fabric N side outer borders

two Fabric N top/bottom outer borders

Arrange the units as shown. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 2: Sew the side inner borders to the block center. Press toward the strips. Sew the top/bottom inner borders to the block center. Press toward the strips.

Step 3: Sew the side outer borders to the block center. Press toward the strips. Sew the top/bottom outer borders to the block center. Press toward the strips.

The resulting Blocks should measure 15-1/2" square.



Step 4: Repeat Steps 1-3 to make a total of twenty Blocks, referring to the Quilt Assembly Diagram for fabric pairings within each Block.

Assemble the Quilt

Step 5: Arrange the blocks into five rows of four blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 6: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 7: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Step 8: Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 9: Sew the side outer borders to the



sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
