



Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 40" wide.



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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 40" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Prepare the Pattern Piece

Place a plastic tube hanger on a piece of paper. Trace around the hanger. Add 1/4" seam allowance all around and 1" along the bottom edge.

Mark a line at the top of the pattern piece for the hanger to extend through the cover.

Cut out the pattern piece.



Cutting Instructions

Cut two from the main fabric, using the pattern piece.

Sewing Instructions

Hem the bottom edge of the hanger cover by folding and pressing 1/4" to the wrong side. Repeat and edge stitch along the bottom edge.

Fold the top opening 1/4" to the wrong side once. Press and top stitch the hem down.



Repeat both hem steps for the remaining piece of fabric.

Place fabrics right sides together and sew along both sides, leaving top opening and bottom edge open. Backstitch at beginning and end of seams.
