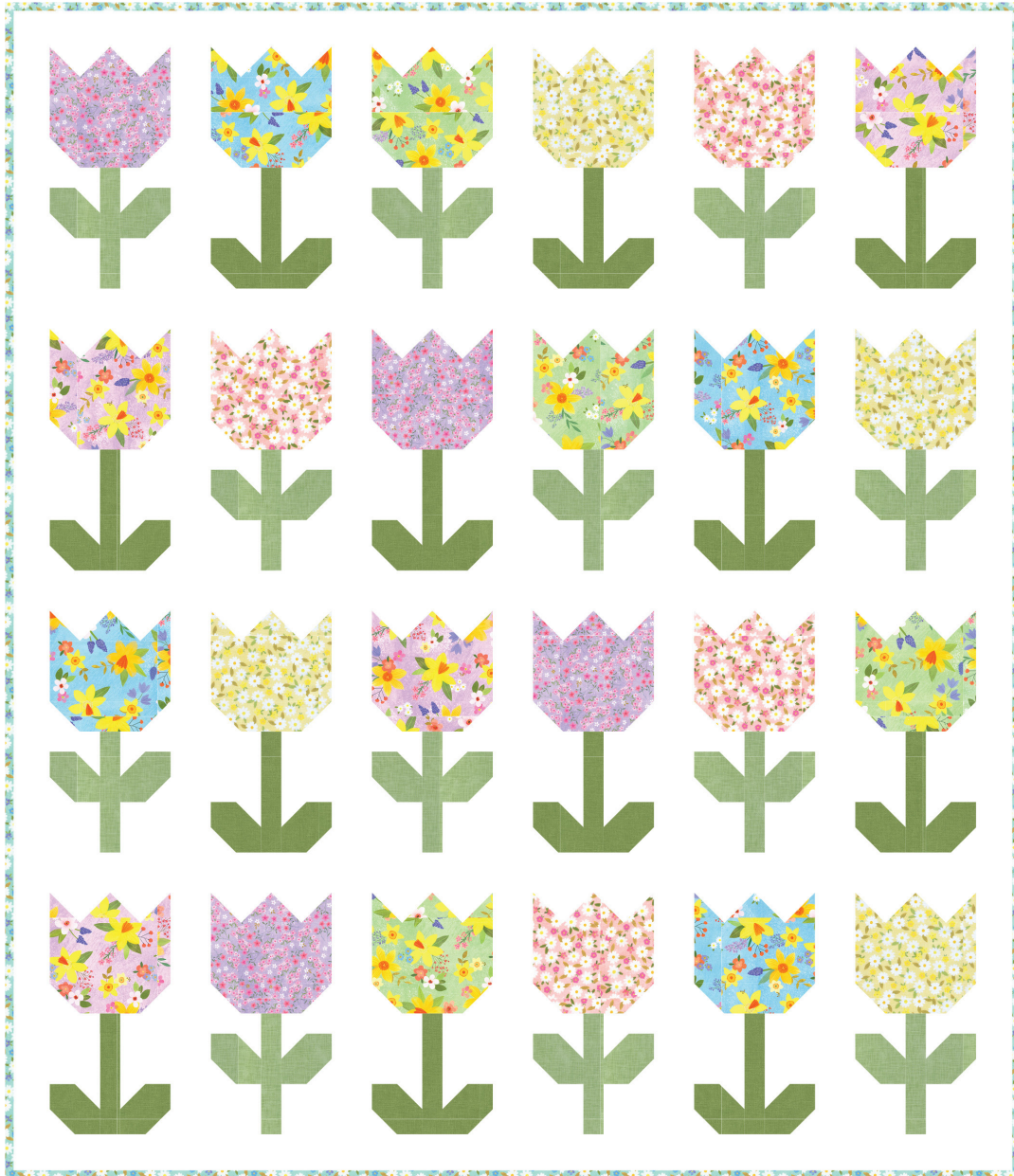



Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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You will also need:
3-1/4 yards for backing

Notes before your begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

- twenty 2-1/2" x WOF, sew four strips together then subcut:
 - three 2-1/2" x 46-1/2" strips for horizontal sashing, sew:
- six 2-1/2" x WOF strips together then subcut:
 - two 2-1/2" x 50-1/2" strips for top and bottom border
 - two 2-1/2" x 54-1/2" strips for side borders
- from remaining strips, subcut:
 - twenty 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" strips
 - forty-eight 2-1/2" x 2-1/2" squares
- one 4-1/4" x WOF, subcut:
 - six 4-1/4" x 4-1/4" squares
- four 3" x WOF, subcut:
 - forty-eight 3" x 3" squares
- seven 1-1/2" x WOF, subcut:
 - forty-eight 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangles
 - ninety-six 1-1/2" x 1-1/2" squares

From Fabrics B-G, cut:

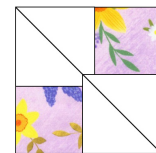
- one 3-1/2" x WOF, subcut:
 - four 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" square
 - four 3-1/2" x 2" rectangle
- one 2-1/2" x WOF, cut:
 - eight 2-1/2" x 2-1/2" squares-on the back of each square, mark a line along the diagonal.
 - four 2-3/8" x 2-3/8" squares-on the back of each square, mark a line along the diagonal.

From Fabrics H and I, cut:

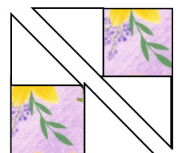
- two 3" x WOF, subcut:
 - twenty-four 3" x 3" squares
- two 1-1/2" x WOF, subcut:
 - twelve 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

Assemble the Flying Geese

Step 1: Pin two 2-3/8" s 2-3/8" Fabric A squares in opposite corners of a 4-1/4" Fabric B Square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the larger square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.



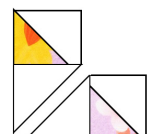
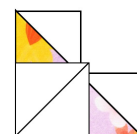
Step 2: Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.



Step 3: Press the fabric toward the smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.



Step 4: Place one 2-3/8" Fabric A square at the corner of sewn block. Unit. Draw diagonal line. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set seam by pressing. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.



Step 5: Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 2" x 3-1/2" if necessary.



Step 6: Repeat steps 1-5 with remaining 2-3/8" Fabric A squares and the 4-1/4" Fabric C, D, E, F, and G squares to make the following:



four A/C flying geese



four A/D flying geese



four A/E flying geese



four A/F flying geese



four A/F flying geese

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles

Step 7: Pair a 2-1/2" Fabric A square with a 2-1/2" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2" square. Repeat to make eight A/B HSTs.

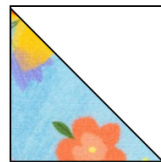


eight A/B HSTs

Step 8: Repeat Step 7 to make:

eight A/E HSTs



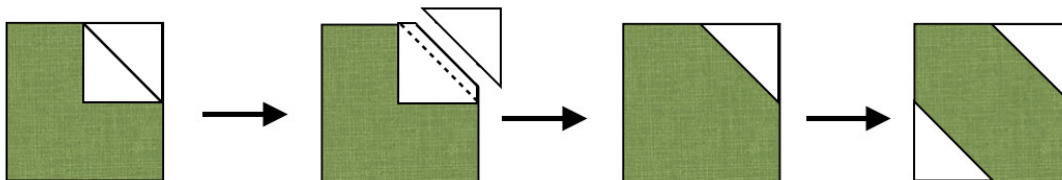
eight A/F HSTs



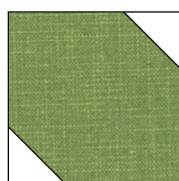

Assemble the leaf blocks

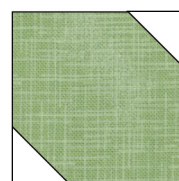
Step 9: Place a 1-1/2" Fabric A square in the upper right corner of a 3" x 3" Fabric H, square right sides together. Note the orientation of the marked diagonal line. Sew on the marked line, then trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Repeat on the lower left corner with another 1-1/2" Fabric A square.



Step 10: Repeat to make the following blocks:



twenty four Fabric H blocks



twenty four Fabric I blocks

Assemble the blocks

Step 11: Gather the following units:
one Fabric A/B flying geese Unit
four Fabric A/B HSTs
one 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" Fabric rectangle
one 3-1/2" x 2" Fabric B rectangle

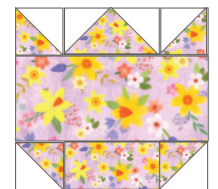
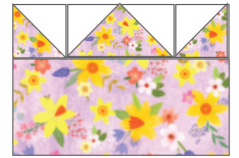
Step 12: Sew two HSTs units to the flying geese unit noting the orientation of the HST seam line.

Step 13: Sew to the top of the 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" Fabric B rectangle. Press towards the rectangle.

Step 14: Sew two HSTs units to the sides of the 3-1/2" x 2" Fabric B rectangle noting the orientation of the HSTs.

Step 15: Sew to the bottom of the 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" Fabric B rectangle. Press towards the rectangle.

Step 16: Repeat to make a total of twenty-four tulips. (four each of six fabrics)



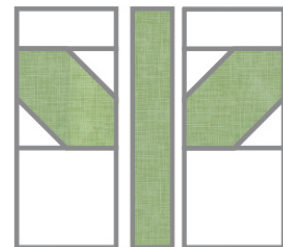
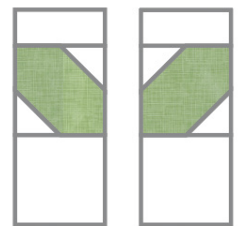
Step 17: Gather the following:
two 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" Fabric A rectangles
two 3" x 3" Fabric A squares
two Fabric I 3" x 3" leaf block
one Fabric I 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangle

Step 18: Sew a 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" Fabric A rectangle to the top of a 3" x 3" Fabric I leaf block. Notice the orientation of the leaf block. Sew a 3" x 3" Fabric A square to the bottom of the Fabric I leaf block.

Step 19: Repeat with another 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" Fabric A rectangle, 3" x 3" Fabric A square and 3" x 3" Fabric I leaf block. Rotate the leaf block as indicated in the diagram.

Step 20: Sew a 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" Fabric H rectangle between the two leaf blocks assembled in Step 18 and 19. Press towards the "stem."

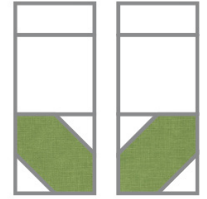
Step 21: Repeat Steps 18-20 to make a total of twelve Fabric H stem and leaves blocks.



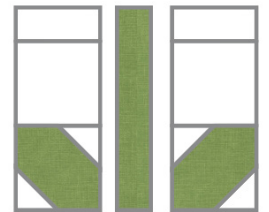
Step 22: Gather the following:

- two 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" Fabric A rectangles
- two 3" x 3" Fabric A squares
- two Fabric H 3" x 3" leaf blocks
- one Fabric H 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangle

Step 23: Sew a 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" Fabric A rectangle to the top of a 3" x 3" Fabric A square. Sew a 3" x 3" Fabric H leaf block to the bottom of the Fabric A square. Notice the orientation of the leaf block.



Step 24: Repeat with another 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" Fabric A rectangle, 3" x 3" Fabric A square and 3" x 3" Fabric H leaf block. Rotate the leaf block as indicated in the diagram.

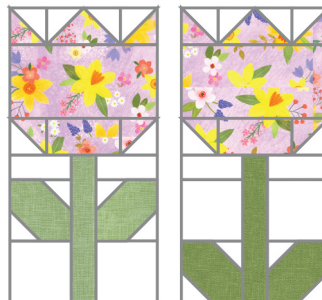


Step 25: Sew a 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" Fabric H rectangle between the two leaf blocks assembled in Step 18 and 19. Press towards the "stem."

Step 26: Repeat Steps 18-20 to make a total of twelve Fabric H stem and leaves blocks.

Step 27: Sew a Fabric flower top to the stem leaf block to complete the flower block. Make a total of twenty four blocks.

Tip: To ensure balance across your quilt, you will pair 2 flower tops (Fabrics B - G) with a Fabric H stem and 2 flower tops with a Fabric I stem. See the quilt layout diagram for additional assistance.



Assemble the quilt

Step 28: Arrange the blocks into four rows of six blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 29: Separate the blocks in each row with a 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" vertical sashing strip.

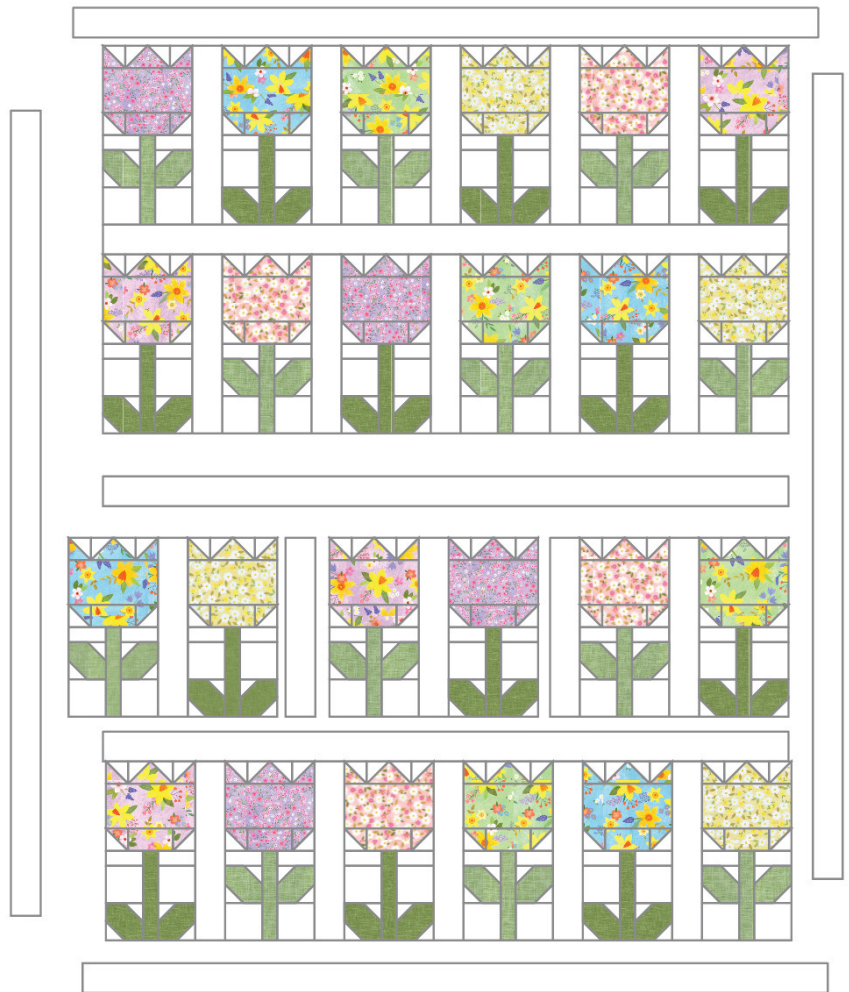
Step 30: Sew the blocks and vertical sashing strips together to form rows. Press the seams toward the sashing strips.

Step 31: Separate the rows with a 2-1/2" x 46-1/2" horizontal sashing strip. Press the seams toward the sashing strips.

Step 32: Sew the rows and horizontal sashing strips together to form the quilt center. Press the seams toward the sashing strips.

Step 33: Sew the side borders (2-1/2" x 54-1/2") to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 34: Sew the top and bottom borders (2-1/2" x 50-1/2") to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.



Your quilt is finished. Quilt, bind and enjoy!
