## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

#### From Fabric A, cut:

- seven 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: ninety-six 5-1/2" x 3" rectangles
- five 3-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut: forty-eight 3-7/8" squares for the Flying Geese four 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: forty-eight 3-1/2" squares for the HSTs

twelve 3" x WOF strips. Sew eight strips together, end-to-end, then subcut: two 3" x 68-1/2" top/bottom outer borders two 3" x 85" side outer borders From the four remaining strips, subcut: forty-eight 3" squares nine 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: seventeen 2" x 20-1/2" sashing strips

#### From each of Fabrics B-M, cut:

one 6-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut: one 6-1/4" square for the Flying Geese Trim the remainder of the strip to 5-1/2" wide, then subcut: one 5-1/2" square for the Block Center Trim the remainder of the strip to 3-1/2" wide, then subcut: eight 3-1/2" squares for the HSTs

#### From each of Fabrics N-Y, cut:

one 7" x WOF strip. Subcut: one 7" x 6-1/4" rectangle. From this, trim: one 6-1/4" square for the Flying Geese Trim the remainder of the strip to make two 3-1/2" wide strips. From one of the strips, subcut: four 3-1/2" squares for the HSTs Trim the remaining strip to 3" wide, then subcut: eight 3" squares one 3-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 3-7/8" squares for the Flying Geese

#### From Fabric Z, cut:

one 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: six 2" squares for the cornerstones

#### From the Binding Fabric, cut:

nine 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Prepare the Fabrics

**Step 1:** Arrange the cut pieces of Fabrics B-Y in the following pairings. This will make assembly easier in later steps. Labeling by Block Number can also be beneficial.



The instructions below are for assembling Block 1. Use the same process to assemble Blocks 2-12. It is recommended to make one Block at a time, rather than assembly line all HSTs and Flying Geese.

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

**Step 1:** Pair a 3-1/2" Fabric A square with a 3-1/2" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3" square. Repeat to make eight A/B HSTs.



Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make:



eight B/N HSTs

## Assemble the Flying Geese

Step 3: Pin two 3-7/8" Fabric A squares in opposing corners of a 6-1/4" Fabric N square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.

**Step 4:** Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.

**Step 5:** Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.

Step 6: Place one 3-7/8" Fabric A square at the corner of sewn block unit. Draw a diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along diagonal line, creating two identical units.

**Step 7:** Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 3" x 5-1/2" if necessary. Repeat to make four N/A flying aeese blocks.

Step 8: Repeat Steps 3-7 with 3-7/8" Fabric N squares and the 6-1/4" Fabric B square to make a total of four B/N flying geese blocks.

## Assemble the Blocks

Step 9: Sew one Fabric A rectangle, one B/N Flying Geese unit and one N/A Flying Geese unit together along one long edge, noting the placement and orientation shown here. Press. Repeat to make four units like this, with each measuring 5-1/2" x 8".

#### Step 10: Gather:

one Fabric A rectangle one 3" Fabric A square two 3" Fabric N squares two B/N HSTs two B/A HSTs

Arrange the units into three rows, as shown. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 11: Sew the units together to form the rows. Press the seams in opposite direction every other row.

Step 12: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block unit, which should measure 8" square. Repeat to make four units like this.















**Step 13:** Gather: one 5-1/2" Fabric B square four units from Step 9 four units from Step 12

Arrange the units into three rows of three, as shown. Note the unit placement and orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

**Step 14:** Sew the units together to form the rows. Press the seams in opposite direction every other row.

**Step 15:** Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block unit, which should measure 20-1/2" square.

This is Block 1. Repeat the process in Steps 1-15 to complete Blocks 2-12, referring to the fabric pairings above, or the Quilt Assembly Diagram, if needed.



## Assemble the Quilt

**Step 16:** Arrange the Blocks together as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew each row together, using sashing strips between each block. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make four block rows.

**Step 17:** Gather two cornerstone squares and three sashing strips. Sew each row together, using cornerstones between each sashing strip and at the beginning and end of each row. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make three sashing rows.

**Step 18:** Sew the sashing and block rows together, pinning and nesting the seams. Press seams open or to the sashing.

**Step 19:** Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the border. Sew the top/bottom outer borders to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press toward the border.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!



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
