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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

- □ two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 - four 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles for the Large Pumpkins
 - eight 2-1/2" squares for the Large Pumpkin stitch-and-flip corners. Mark a diagonal line on the back of each square.
 - two 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles
 - two 2-1/2" x 1-1/2" rectangles
 - one 2-1/2" square for the Medium Pumpkin HST
 - Trim the remainder of the second strip to 2" wide, then subcut:
 - ♦ Two 3-1/2" x 2" rectangles for the Medium Pumpkin
- □ one 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 - four 3-1/2" x 7-1/2" rectangles
 - two 3-1/2" x 5-1/2" rectangles
- □ one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
 - one 5-1/2" square
 - Trim the remainder of the strip to 3" wide, then subcut:
 - ♦ one 3" square for the Large Pumpkin HSTs
 - ♦ one 3" x 8" rectangle for the Medium Pumpkin block
- one 2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
 - thirteen 2" squares for the Leaf and Small Pumpkin HSTs
 - four 2" squares for the Medium Pumpkin stitch-and-flip corners. Mark a diagonal line on the back of each square.
- □ four 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:
 - two 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" side inner borders
 - two 1-1/2" x 51" top/bottom inner borders
 - ten 1-1/2" squares for the Leaf blocks and Small Pumpkin. Mark a diagonal line on the back of each square.
 - Trim the remainder to 1-1/8" wide, then trim:
 - twelve 1-1/8" squares for the Leaf stems. Mark a diagonal line on the back of each square.

From Fabric B, cut:

- \Box four 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:
 - two 3-1/2" x 12-1/2" side outer borders
 - one 3-1/2" x 13" top outer border piece
 - one 3-1/2" x 35-1/2" top outer border piece
 - one 3-1/2" x 5.5" top outer border piece
 - one 3-1/2" x 41-1/2" bottom outer border piece
 - one 3-1/2" x 15" bottom outer border piece

- □ one 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 - six 2" squares for the Leaf HSTs
 - Trim the remainder to 1-1/2" wide, then trim:
 - ♦ three 1-1/2" squares for the Leaf blocks
 - ♦ Trim the remainder to 1-1/8" wide, then trim:
 - six 1-1/8" squares for the Leaf block stems. Mark a diagonal line on the back of each square.

From each of Fabrics C and E, cut:

- □ one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
 - two 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles for the Large Pumpkins
 - trim the remainder of the strip to 2" wide, then subcut:
 - ♦ one 2" x 6-1/2" rectangle for the Medium Pumpkin
 - ♦ four 2" squares for the Leaf Block HSTs
- □ one 1-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
 - one 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle for the Small Pumpkin
 - eight 1-1/2" squares for the Leaf Blocks

From Fabric D, cut:

- one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
 - two 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles for the Large Pumpkins
 - trim the remainder of the strip to 1-1/2" wide, then subcut:
 - ♦ one 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle for the Small Pumpkin
 - ♦ twelve 1-1/2" squares for the Leaf Blocks
- □ one 2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
 - one 2" x 6-1/2" rectangle for the Medium Pumpkin
 - six 2" squares for the Leaf Block HSTs

From each of Fabrics F and G, cut:

- □ one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
 - two 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles for the Large Pumpkins
 - trim the remainder of the strip to 2" wide, then subcut:
 - ♦ one 2" x 6-1/2" rectangle for the Medium Pumpkin
 - ♦ trim the remainder of the strip to 1-1/2" wide, then subcut:
 - one 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle for the Small Pumpkin

From Fabric H, cut:

- □ one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:
 - one 3" square for the Large Pumpkin HSTs
 - trim the remainder of the strip to 2-1/2" wide, then subcut:
 - ♦ one 2-1/2" square for the Medium Pumpkin HST
 - ♦ trim the remainder of the strip to 2" wide, then subcut:
 - five 2" squares for the Leaf Block HSTs
 - trim the remainder of the strip to 1-1/2" wide, then subcut:
 - eight 1-1/2" squares for the Leaf Blocks

From the Binding, cut:

□ five 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 3" Fabric A square with a 3" Fabric H square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2-1/2" square. Repeat to make two 2-1/2" A/H HSTs.



Step 2: Repeat the process in Step 1 to make:



one 2" A/H HST (from 2-1/2" squares)



eight 1-1/2" A/C HST (from 2" squares)



one 1-1/2" A/H HST (from 2" squares)



four 1-1/2" A/D HST (from 2" squares)



eight 1-1/2" B/D HST (from 2" squares)



eight 1-1/2" A/E HST (from 2" squares)



four 1-1/2" B/H HST (from 2" squares)



four 1-1/2" A/H HST (from 2" squares)

Assemble the Large Pumpkin Blocks

Step 3: Gather a 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric C, D, E, F and G rectangle, in that order, and sew together along the longest edge. Press.



Step 4: Place a 2-1/2" Fabric A square in the upper right corner of the Step 3 unit, right sides together. Note the orientation of the marked diagonal line. Sew on the marked line, then trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Repeat on the remaining corners with additional Fabric A squares.



Step 5: Gather a 2-1/2" A/H HST and two 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" Fabric A rectangles. Sew the HST between the A rectangles, as shown. Press. Sew to the top of the Large Pumpkin unit. The Large Pumpkin Block should measure 10-1/2" square.



Step 6: Repeat Steps 3-5 to make the second Large Pumpkin, noting that the fabric order this time is F-C-G-D-E.



Assemble the Medium Pumpkin Block

Step 7: Gather a 2" x 6-1/2" Fabric E, F, G, D and C rectangle, in that order, and sew together along the longest edge. Press.



Step 8: Place a 2" Fabric A square in the upper right corner of the Step 7 unit, right sides together. Note the orientation of the marked diagonal line. Sew on the marked line, then trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Repeat on the remaining corners with additional Fabric A squares.



Step 9: Gather a 2" A/H HST and two 2" x 3-1/2" Fabric A rectangles. Sew the HST between the A rectangles, as shown. Press. Sew to the top of the Medium Pumpkin unit. Sew the 3" x 8" Fabric A rectangle to the top of the unit. The Medium Pumpkin Block should measure 8" x 10-1/2".



Assemble the Small Pumpkin Block

Step 10: Gather a 1-1/2" \times 4-1/2" Fabric E, C, F, D, and G rectangle, in that order, and sew together along the longest edge. Press.



Step 11: Place a 1-1/2" Fabric A square in the upper right corner of the Step 10 unit, right sides together. Note the orientation of the marked diagonal line. Sew on the marked line, then trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Repeat on the remaining corners with additional Fabric A squares.




Step 12: Gather a 1-1/2" A/H HST and two 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" Fabric A rectangles. Sew the HST between the A rectangles, as shown. Press. Sew to the top of the Small Pumpkin unit. Sew the 5-1/2" Fabric A square to the top of the unit. The Small Pumpkin Block should measure 5-1/2" x 10-1/2".




Assemble the Leaf Blocks

Step 13: Place a 1-1/2" Fabric A square in the upper right corner of a 1-1/2" Fabric E square, right sides together. Note the orientation of the marked diagonal line. Sew on the marked line, then trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Repeat on the lower left corner with another 1-1/2" Fabric E square. This is a Leaf Stem unit. Make a total of two E/A Stem Units like this.



Step 14: Repeat the process in Step 13 to make:





Step 13: Gather: three 1-1/2" Fabric E squares one 1-1/2" Fabric A square four E/A HSTs one E/A Leaf Stem

Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 14: Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams in opposite directions every other row.

Step 15: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the E/A Leaf Block. Make two E/A Leaf Blocks. The Block should measure 3-1/2" square.

Step 16: Repeat the process in Step 13-15 to make:



two C/A Leaf Blocks



one D/A Leaf Block



one H/A Leaf Block




one H/B Leaf Block



two D/B Leaf Blocks

Assemble the Table Runner



Step 17: Assemble the Center Panel of the table runner as shown, noting the sizes of the Fabric A rectangles and orientation of the block units. Press. The Center Panel should measure 51" x 10-1/2".

Step 18: Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 19: Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 20: Assemble the top and bottom outer borders of the table runner as shown, noting the sizes of the Fabric B rectangles and orientation of the block units. Press. Sew to the top and bottom edges of the table runner. Press.

Your table runner top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
