

# Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 40" wide.

# Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 40" wide.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

# **Cutting Instructions**

## Fabric A

Trim the panel to measure 22-1/2" x 41-1/2".

#### Fabric B

Cut two strips 10" x WOF. Piece together one long strip 10" x 50-1/2".

#### Fabric C

Cut two strips 7" x WOF. Sub cut fourteen pieces 2-1/2" x 7", four pieces 3-1/2" x 7", and two pieces 3" x 7".

#### Fabric D

Cut two strips 7" x WOF. Sub cut twelve pieces 3" x 7", six pieces 2-1/2" x 7", two pieces 3-1/2" x 7", and two pieces 4" x 7".

#### Fabric E

Cut twelve small template pieces (template can be found on page 9).

#### Fabric F

Cut twelve large template pieces (template can be found on page 9).

#### Fabric G

Cut one strip 3-1/2" x WOF. Sub cut six squares 3-1/2" x 3-1/2", cut each once on the diagonal. Sub cut six squares 2-5/8" x 2-5/8", cut each once on the diagonal.

Cut one strip 3" x WOF. Sub cut one piece 3" x 11", one piece 3" x 5-1/2", one piece 3" x 18-1/2", and one 2" x 5-1/2".

Cut one strip 10" x WOF. Sub cut one piece 10-1/2" x 10", one piece 8" x 10", one piece 7-1/2" x 10".

Cut one strip 4" x WOF. Sub-cut two 2-3/4" x 5", two pieces 4 x 14", one piece 2" x 11", one piece 2-1/2" x 11".

Cut two strips 2-1/2" x WOF. Sub cut one piece 2-1/2" x 15-1/2", one piece 2-1/2" x 5", one piece 1" x 15-1/2", one piece 1-1/2" x 5-1/2", two pieces 2-1/2" x 5", and one square 2-1/2".

Cut one strip 4-1/2" x WOF. Sub cut one piece 4-1/2" x 18-1/2" and one piece 4" x 15-1/2".

#### Fabric H

Cut two strips 1-1/2" x WOF. Sub cut one piece 1-1/2" x 2-1/2", one piece 1-1/2" x 18-1/2", one piece 1-1/2" x 11", one piece 1-1/2" x 15-1/2", and one piece 1" x 5".


Cut one strip 1" x WOF. Sub cut one piece 1" x 11", one piece 1" x 14", and one piece 1" x 15-1/2".


#### Fabric I

Cut seven binding strips 2-1/4" x WOF.

# Assemble the Flower Blocks

Place one Fabric F large template piece and one Fabric G 3-1/2" triangle, RST, using the placement shown in the *fig. 1*. Sew together and press seam to the triangle. Repeat to make twelve template units.





Sew two units together as shown *(fig. 2)* to create a half-flower. Press the seam away from the pieced section. Sew two half-flowers together to make a flower, nesting seams. Repeat to make three large flower blocks.

Repeat process above with Fabric E small template pieces and Fabric G 2-5/8" triangles to create three small flower blocks. (fig. 3)


# Assemble the Sections

This quilt is assembled in sections. Organize fabric by number for all sections before sewing. Sew in numerical order, left to right. Example, sew Pieces 1-4 in order left to right, with Piece 1 being at the far left.

# **Section A:**


Piece 1: Fabric G, 3" x 11"
Piece 2: Fabric H, 1-1/2" x 11"
Piece 3: Fabric G, 2" x 11"
Piece 4: Fabric H, 1" x 11"

Piece 5: Fabric G, 2-1/2" x 11"



# Section B:


Piece 1: Fabric G, 3" x 5-1/2" Piece 2: One small flower block.



### **Section C:**

Piece 1: Fabric G, 3" x 18-1/2" Piece 2: Fabric H, 1-1/2" x 18-1/2" Piece 3: Fabric G, 4-1/2" x 18-1/2"

Section C should measure 37-1/2" x 10"



# **Section D:**


Piece 1: Fabric G, 10-1/2" x 10"

Piece 2: Sew one Fabric G, 2-3/4" x 5" to each side of Fabric H, 1" x 5" to create a "stem." Sew one small flower block on top of the stem block.

Piece 3: Fabric G, 8" x 10"

Piece 4: Sew one Fabric G, 2-1/2" x 2-1/2" and one 5" x 2-1/2" to either side of Fabric H, 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" to create a "stem." Sew one large flower block on top of the stem block.


Piece 5: Fabric G, 7-1/2" x 10"



Section D should measure 37-1/2" x 10"


# **Section E**

Piece 1: Fabric G, 2" x 5-1/2" Piece 2: Small flower block Piece 3: Fabric G, 1-1/2" x 5-1/2"




# **Section F**

Piece 1: Fabric G, 4" x 14" Piece 2: Fabric H, 1" x 14" Piece 3: Fabric G, 4" x 14"




# **Section G**

Piece 1: Fabric G, 2-1/2" x 15-1/2" Piece 2: Fabric H, 1-1/2" x 15-1/2" Piece 3: Fabric G, 1" x 15-1/2" Piece 4: Fabric H, 1" x 15-1/2" Piece 5: Fabric G, 4" x 15-1/2"



Refer to Quilt Assembly Diagram for proper block placement when sewing sections together.



Sew Section A to the bottom of Section B. Then sew Section C to the top of Section B. Sew one large flower block to the top of Section C. Unit should measure 8" x 41-1/2". Sew panel to the right of this unit. Press seams toward the panel.

Sew Section E to the top of Section F. Then sew one large flower block to the bottom of Section F.

Sew Section G to the bottom of the large flower block. Unit should measure 8" x 41-1/2". Sew unit to the right side of the panel. Press seams toward the panel.

Sew Section D to the top of the assembled unit. Press seams toward the panel. Center should measure 37-1/2" x 51".

# Assemble the Borders

Sew two identical side borders. All fabric pieces are sewn together along 7" side. <<Tip: Lay out the borders first before sewing together, paying close attention to fabric dimensions.>> Sew each border together in this order, top to bottom:

Sew one border to each side of the center panel.

Sew Fabric B strip to the bottom of the quilt.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
