

Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, fussy cut:

eight 10 to 10-1/2" squares. You will embroider and trim to size later.

From Fabric B, cut:

four 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty-eight 3-1/2" Half-Square Triangles*

twenty 3-1/2" squares

*Cut the triangles from a folded strip of striped fabric to yield triangles that will have stripes running both vertically and horizontally.

From Fabric C, cut:

two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

sixteen 3-1/2" Half-Square Triangles

four 3-1/2" squares

From Fabric D, cut:

one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

twelve 3-1/2" Half-Square Triangles

three 3-1/2" squares

From Fabric E, cut:

seven 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

fifty-six 3-1/2" Half-Square Triangles

sixteen 3-1/2" x 9-1/2" rectangles

four 3-1/2" squares

From Fabric F, cut:

two 5-1/2" x WOF strips for the top and bottom borders

From the remainder of the fabric, cut:

two 5-1/2" x length of fabric strips for the side borders

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

250" of 2-1/4" wide bias cut binding

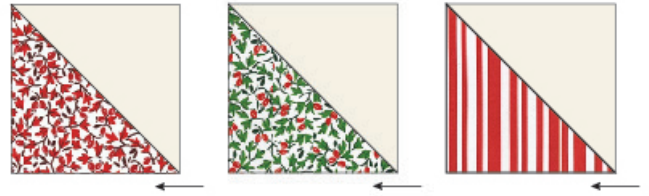
Embroider the Blocks

Step 1 Embroider each of the eight Fabric A blocks with either a single or double strand of Aurifil red floss (or the floss of your choice). Stitches include a running stitch, French knots and Lazy Daisy stitches.

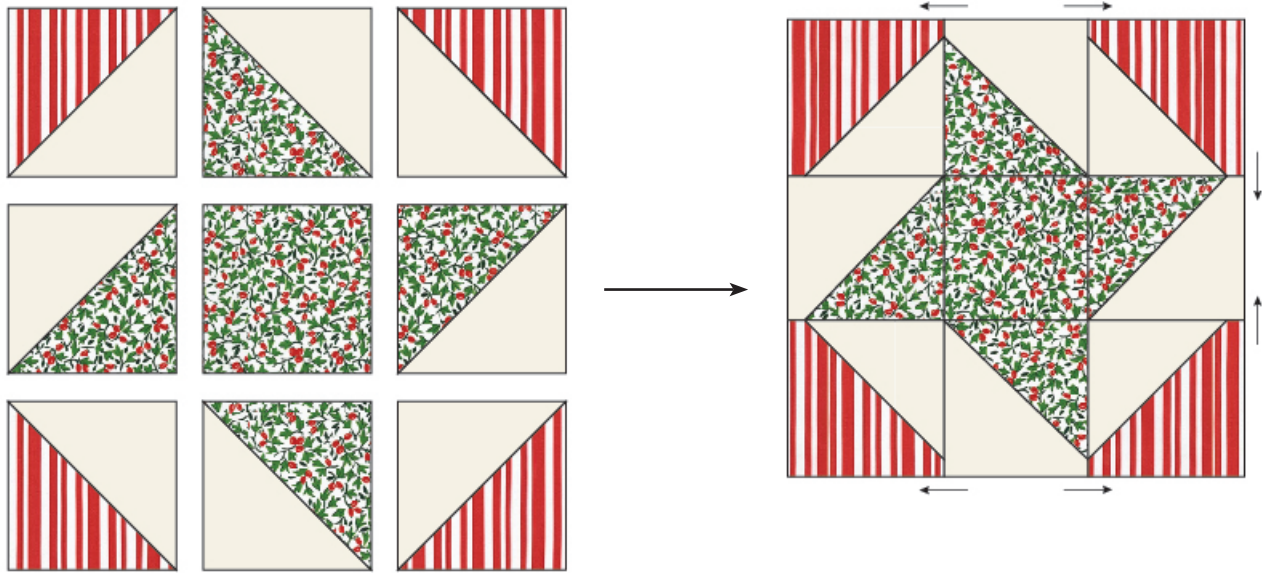
Step 2 Cut the blocks apart, press face down on a towel, then trim to exactly 9-1/2" square. Set aside.

Assemble the Star Blocks

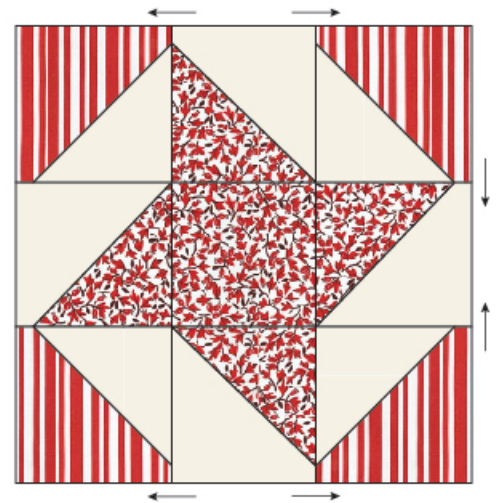
Step 1 Sew the Fabric B, C and D print triangles right sides together with the Fabric E triangles. Press toward the print. Make twenty eight of Fabric B, sixteen of Fabric C and twelve of Fabric D.



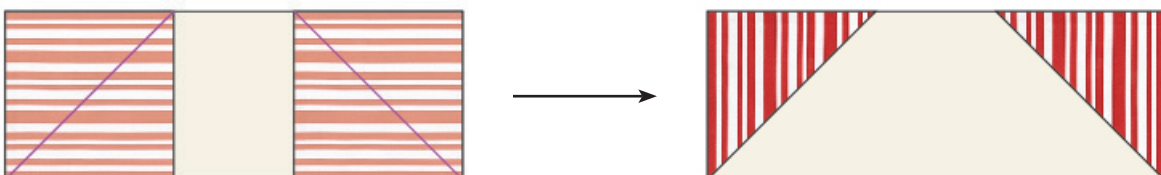
Step 2 Assemble a block using four B triangle squares, four C triangle squares, and one C square. Press as shown. Make four Fabric C stars. At this point the star blocks should measure 9-1/2" square.



Repeat to make three star blocks from Fabrics B and D, as shown.



Step 3 Using the Fabric B squares and the 3-1/2" x 9-1/2" Fabric E rectangles, sew sixteen star point units. Place the striped squares on the end of the white rectangles. Note the direction of the striped squares and the angle marked. Sew on the marked lines, trim away the seam allowance and press toward the triangles.



Assembling the Quilt



Step 1 Referring to the Quilt Assembly Diagram, assemble the quilt in rows, making sure the stripe and the embroidered blocks are aligned correctly. Sew the blocks and units together in rows, pressing toward the embroidered blocks and star point units.

Step 2 Sew the rows together, pressing the row seams all one direction.

Step 3 Measure and trim two vertically cut borders the length of the quilt. Sew the borders to the sides of the quilt. Press toward the borders.

Step 4 Trim two horizontal borders the width of the quilt top. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
