Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, fussy cut:

one 17-1/2" x 23-1/2" panel twenty five 4-1/2" squares for the pockets*

*if needed, you may cut these to a slightly smaller size, just as long as you allow 1/4" of seam allowance around each image. If you cut to a smaller size square, you will also need to adjust the 4-1/2" Fabric C squares to the same size.

From Fabric B, cut:

five 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 4-1/2" x 32-1/2" top/bottom Border 4 strips

two 4-1/2" x 53-1/2" side outer Border 4 strips

From Fabric C, cut:

one 24-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

one 24-1/2" square

From the remainder of the strip, cut:

one 1-1/2" x 24-1/2" top Border 3 strip

three 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty-five 4-1/2" squares for the pocket linings

two 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two 1-1/2" x 28-1/2" side Border 3 strips

From Fabric D, cut:

three 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two 1-1/2" x 23-1/2" side Border 1 strips

two 1-1/2" x 19-1/2" top/bottom Border 1 strips

From Fabric E, cut:

four 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two 2" x 25-1/2" side Border 2 strips


two 2" x 22-1/2" top/bottom Border 2 strips

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

five 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Make the Pockets

Step 1: Pair each Fabric A square with a Fabric C square, right sides together. Sew around all four sides, leaving a 2" opening along the center of the bottom edge.



Step 2: Turn the pocket right side out through the opening and press. Repeat for all twenty-five pockets.



Step 3: Topstitching along the top edge of each pocket, 1/8" away from the edge.



Assemble the Advent Calendar

Step 4: Sew the side Border 1 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 1 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 5: Sew the side Border 2 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 2 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 6: Sew the side Border 3 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top Border 3 piece to the quilt center. Press toward the border.

Step 7: Sew the 24-1/2" Fabric C square to the bottom edge of the unit. Press.

Step 8: Sew the side Border 4 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 4 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 9: Layer the advent calendar quilt top, batting and backing. Baste and quilt as desired. Trim the excess batting and backing.





Step 10: Arrange the twenty-five pockets on the quilted unit. Pin in place before sewing any pockets to the quilted unit, in order to ensure proper spacing and room between the pockets. You will have approximately 1" of Fabric C showing around the outer edges.

Step 11: Sew each pocket in place by stitching both sides and the bottom. Start at the top left edge of each pocket and end at the top right edge, backstitching at the start and stop.

Your advent calendar is complete! Bind and enjoy!

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
