Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, fussy cut:

one 23" x 43" center panel

From Fabric B, cut:

four 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two 2" x 43" top/bottom border 1 pieces

two 2" x 26" side border 1 pieces

From Fabric C, cut:

three 3-1/2" x length of fabric strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 3-1/2" x 46" top/bottom border 2 pieces

From the remaining WOF, cut:

three 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 3-1/2" x 32" side border 2 pieces

From Fabric D, cut:

two 4-3/4" x <u>length</u> of fabric strips. Subcut:

two 4-3/4" x 32" side border 3 pieces

three 2-1/2" x length of fabric strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 2-1/2" x 66" side border 4 pieces

From the remaining width of fabric (approximately 25"), cut:

ten 4" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

four 4" x 60-1/2" top/bottom border 3 and 4 pieces (two each)

two 4-1/4" x WOF strips. Set aside for strip piecing.

From Fabric E, cut:

three 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty 3" squares for the flying geese

ten 3" squares for the block centers

From Fabric F, cut:

five 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

seventy 3" squares

one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

ten 3" x 5-1/2" rectangles for the block centers

From Fabric G, cut:

one 3" x WOF strip. Set aside for strip piecing.

six 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

forty 3" squares

twenty 3" x 5-1/2" rectangles for the flying geese

two 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty 3" x 5-1/2" rectangles for the flying geese**

**Note, in order to retain the directionality shown in the sample, these rectangles will be used in Steps 4 and 5

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Blocks

Step 1: Place a 3" Fabric F square RST at one end of a Fabric G rectangle. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the square, as shown. Sew on the marked line and trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press toward the triangle.




Step 2: Repeat Step 1 at the remaining end of the rectangle, noting the orientation of the stripes when placed RST with the rectangle. The resulting flying geese block should measure $3" \times 5-1/2"$.




Step 3: Repeat with nine remaining Fabric G rectangles to make a total of ten flying geese like this.


Step 4: Repeat the process shown in Step 1, but place the Fabric F squares as shown. This will create a flying geese unit with stripes going a different direction (vertical) than the previous flying geese units. Repeat to make ten flying geese like this.



Step 5: Repeat the process shown in Step 1, but place a Fabric E square and Fabric F square as shown. This will create a flying geese unit with stars on the left and vertical stripes on the right. Repeat to make ten flying geese like this.




Step 6: Repeat the process shown in Step 1, but place a Fabric E square and Fabric F square as shown. This will create a flying geese unit with stars on the right and horizontal stripes on the left. Repeat to make ten flying geese like this.



Step 7: Gather:

one 3" Fabric E square one 3" Fabric F square one Fabric F rectangle four 3" Fabric G squares one of each type of flying geese unit

Step 8: Arrange as shown. Sew the Fabric F square to the right edge of the E square, keeping the stripes horizontal, and press. Sew the Fabric F rectangle to the bottom edge of the unit and press.



Step 9: Arrange in three rows of three, as shown. Sew together to form rows, pressing the seams away from the flying geese. Sew the rows together, nesting the seams. Press.

Repeat Steps 7-9 to make ten 10-1/2" square Blocks.

Assemble the Strip Set

Step 10: Sew a Fabric D strip to both long edges of the Fabric G strip. Press. Subcut into ten 3" x 10-1/2" pieces.



Assemble the Quilt



Step 11: Sew the top and bottom border 1 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the side border 1 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 12: Sew the top and bottom border 2 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the side border 2 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 13: Sew the side border 3 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom border 3 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. **Step 14:** Gather five star blocks and four strip set units. Arrange as shown and sew together to form a row. Repeat to make a second row. Sew a row to the top and bottom edges of the quilt. Press.

Step 15: Sew the top and bottom border 4 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the side border 4 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
