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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A and E, cut:


two 8" x WOF strips. Subcut:

five 10-1/2" x 8" rectangles

Trim the remainder of the second strip to form two 3" x remaining WOF strips, then subcut: ten 5-1/2" x 3" rectangles for the flying geese









From Fabric B and F, cut:

one 8" x WOF strip. Subcut:

three 10-1/2" x 8" rectangles

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:

six 5-1/2" x 3" rectangles for the flying geese



three 10-1/2" X 8" rectangles



six 5-1/2" X 3" rectangles



three 10-1/2" X 8" rectangles



From Fabric C and G, cut:

one 8" x WOF strip. Subcut:

two 10-1/2" x 8" rectangles

Trim the remainder of the second strip to form two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

four 5-1/2" x 3" rectangles for the flying geese


From each of Fabrics D and H, cut:

one 8" x WOF strip. Subcut:

one 10-1/2" x 8" rectangle

From the remainder of the strip, cut:

two 5-1/2" x 3" rectangles for the flying geese









From Fabric I cut:

two 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

eight 5-1/2" squares

Trim the remainder of the second strip to 3" x WOF then cut:

thirteen 3" squares for the flying geese

one 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

three 3" squares for the flying geese, for a total of sixteen

From each of Fabrics J and M cut:

one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

six 5-1/2" squares

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:

twelve 3" squares for the flying geese

From each of Fabrics K and N cut:

one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

four 5-1/2" squares

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:

eight 3" squares for the flying geese

From Fabric L cut:

two 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: ten 5-1/2" squares two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 3" squares for the flying geese

From Fabric O cut:

one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: two 5-1/2" squares From the remainder of the strip, cut four 3" squares for the flying geese

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

five 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Blocks

In order to best match the hearts with their background fabrics, it is advised to make each block one at a time, or to stack each of the cut pieces in twenty separate stacks by block before doing any assembly line sewing.

The block fabric pairs are as follows. Each block contains: one 10-1/2" x 8" rectangle and two 5-1/2" x 3" rectangles of the "heart" fabric two 5-1/2" squares and four 3" squares of the background fabric

Block 2: Fabrics B & J Block 3: Fabrics C & K Block 4: Fabrics D & L Block 5: Fabrics E & L Block 6: Fabrics A & I Block 7: Fabrics B & J Block 8: Fabrics C & K Block 9: Fabrics F & M Block 10: Fabrics E & L Block 11: Fabrics A & I Block 12: Fabrics B & J




Block 20: Fabrics E & L

The following steps are specific to Block 1, however the same process is also used for each of the remaining blocks.


Step 1: Place a 3" Fabric I square RST at one end of a 5-1/2" x 3" Fabric A rectangle. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the square, as shown. Sew on the marked line and trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press toward the triangle.



Step 2: Repeat Step 1 at the remaining end of the rectangle. The resulting flying geese block should measure 5-1/2" x 3". Repeat to make a second flying geese unit.



Step 5: Repeat Step 4 in the lower right corner of the Fabric A rectangle. The resulting block should measure 10-1/2" x 8".




Step 6: Sew the flying geese pair from Step 3 to the top of the block. Press. The block should measure 10-1/2" square.



Repeat Steps 1-6 for each of the remaining pairs of heart and background fabrics to make a total of twenty blocks.

Assemble the Quilt



Step 7: Arrange the blocks into five rows of four blocks. Note the fabric placement in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 8: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 9: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
