

Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

one 4-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

three 4-1/2" squares

three 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

thirty-six 3" squares for the HSTs

six 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 1-1/2" x 50-1/2" top/bottom inner borders

two 1-1/2" x 56-1/2" side inner borders

From Fabric B, cut:

one 4-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

three 4-1/2" squares

three 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

thirty-six 3" squares for the HSTs

six 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 3-1/2" x 56-1/2" top/bottom outer borders

two 3-1/2" x 58-1/2" side outer borders

From each of Fabrics C-N, cut:

one 4-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

three 4-1/2" squares

Trim the remainder of the strip to 3" wide, then subcut:

eight 3" squares for the HSTs

two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty-eight 3" squares for the HSTs, for a total of thirty-six

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 3" Fabric A square with a 3" Fabric C square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2-1/2" square. Repeat to make seventy-two A/C HSTs.



Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make:



seventy-two D/E HSTs



seventy-two F/G HSTs



seventy-two H/I HSTs



seventy-two J/K HSTs



seventy-two B/L HSTs



seventy-two M/N HSTs

Assemble the Blocks



Step 3: Gather:
one 4-1/2" Fabric A square
twelve A/C HSTs

Arrange the units as shown. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.



Step 4: Sew the HSTs to the left and right of the center square together to form pairs. Press.

Step 5: Sew the units together to form three rows. Press the seams in the middle row toward the center square and press the seams in the top and bottom row toward the outer edges.

Step 6: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

The resulting block should measure 8-1/2" square.

Step 7: Repeat Steps 3-6 to make three A/C Blocks with Fabric A centers.

Step 8: Repeat Steps 3-6 to make:



three A/C Blocks
with Fabric C centers



three D/E Blocks
with Fabric D centers



three D/E Blocks
with Fabric E centers




three F/G Blocks
with Fabric F centers


three H/I Blocks
with Fabric H centers




three H/I Blocks

Assemble the Quilt



Step 9: Arrange the blocks into seven rows of six blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 10: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 11: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Step 12: Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 13: Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
