## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 40" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## Cutting Instructions

### Fabric A

Cut one  $9\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$ , two -  $10\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$ , and two -  $10\frac{1}{2}" \times 16\frac{1}{2}"$ .

### Fabric B

Cut two -  $9\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$ , two -  $10\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$ , two -  $10\frac{1}{2}" \times 16\frac{1}{2}"$ .

### Fabric C

Cut three -  $9\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$ , two -  $10\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$ .

### Fabric D

Cut three -  $9\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$  and four -  $10\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$ .

### Fabric E

Cut two -  $9\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$ , two -  $10\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$ , and two -  $10\frac{1}{2}" \times 16\frac{1}{2}"$ .

### Fabric F

Cut two -  $9\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$ , and three -  $10\frac{1}{2}" \times 16\frac{1}{2}"$ .

### Fabric G

Cut three -  $9\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$ , two -  $10\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$ .

### Fabric H

Cut eight -  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$ .

### Fabric I

Cut nine -  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$ .


### Fabric J

Cut nine -  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$ .

### Binding Fabric

Cut eight  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times \text{WOF}$  strips.

## Assemble the Blocks



Refer to the illustration of the quilt and Block Assembly Diagram . It is divided into four large rows which consist of Block A units, Block B units, and Block C units.

### Row 1, Section 1 - 1st large rectangle (Block A)

Sew a  $9\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$  A rectangle to a  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$  H rectangle to a  $9\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$  B rectangle. (Figure 1) Press.



### Row 1, Section 2 - 2nd large rectangle (Block B)

Sew a  $10\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$  C square to a  $10\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$  D square. (Figure 2) Press and sew the A block to the B block.



### Row 1, Section 3 - 3rd large rectangle (Block C)

Sew a  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$  J rectangle to a  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$  I rectangle to a  $10\frac{1}{2}" \times 16\frac{1}{2}"$  B rectangle. (Figure 3)




Continue this step, sewing the pieces together to form each Block, then sewing the Blocks together to complete each section.

## Assemble the Quilt

When the sections of the first row are complete, sew them together into a row.  
Press. Continue, sewing the sections, then sewing them together to complete the rows.

Sew the rows together. Press.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

Quilting suggestion: quilt zig zags, diamonds, and other geometric designs in the blocks.
