

Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

fourteen 5" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred eight 5" squares for the HSTs six 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: fifty-four 4-1/2" squares

From each of Fabrics B-G, cut:

two 5" x WOF strips. Subcut: nine 5" squares for the HSTs one 4-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: nine 4-1/2" squares

From each of Fabrics H-M, cut:

two 5" x WOF strips. Subcut: nine 5" squares for the HSTs

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 5" Fabric A square with a 5" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 4-1/2" square. Repeat to make eighteen A/B HSTs.



Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make:

Assemble the A Blocks



Step 3: Gather: three Fabric B squares six A/B HSTs

Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.



Step 4: Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams toward the left in the top and bottom rows and toward the right in the middle row.

Step 5: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams down to form the block.

The finished A Block should measure 12-1/2" square. Repeat to make three blocks from each of Fabrics B-G in this style.





Step 6: Gather: three Fabric A squares six A/H HSTs


Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.



Step 7: Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams toward the right in the top and bottom rows and toward the left in the middle row.

Step 8: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams up to form the block.

The finished B Block should measure 12-1/2" square. Repeat to make three blocks from each of Fabrics H-M in this style.



Assemble the Quilt



Step 9: Arrange the A and B Blocks into six rows of six blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 10: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 11: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
