# Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

# **Cutting Instructions**

#### From Fabric A, cut:

two 12" x WOF strips. From each strip, subcut:

- two 12" squares for a total of four, then cut each square once diagonally to yield eight 12" setting triangles.
- From the remainder of each strip, subcut two 4-1/2" x WOF strips.

four 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew a shorter 4-1/2" strip cut in the step above to the end of each strip cut here, then subcut:

- two 4-1/2" x 55" Border 1 top/bottom strips.
- two 4-1/2" x 46-1/2" Border 1 side strips.

fourteen 4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end, then subcut:

• eight 4" x 70-1/2" Border 6 strips.

three 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

- thirty-two 3-1/2" squares—sixteen squares are for the half-square triangles (HSTs) in the center medallion and sixteen are for the Cornerstone Star blocks.
- two 3-1/2" x 3" rectangles, then trim each rectangle to 3" square for the Center Star.

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:

• fourteen 3" squares for the Center Star.

eight 2-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:

- one-hundred and eight 2-7/8" squares—fifty-two squares are for the Flying Geese.
- Subcut fifty-six squares once diagonally to yield one-hundred and twelve triangles for the Square-in-a-Square (SIAS) blocks.

twelve 2-1/2" strips x WOF strips.

- From six strips, subcut:
  - eighty 2-1/2" squares—sixty-eight squares for Border 5 and sixteen squares for the Cornerstone Stars in Border 6.
- Sew remaining partial and full strips together, then, subcut:
  - □ two 2-1/2" x 66-1/2" Border 4 top/bottom strips.
  - $\square$  two 2-1/2" x 62-1/2" Border 4 side strips.

six 2" x WOF strips.

- From each of two strips, subcut:
  - □ two 2" x 12-1/2" rectangles for a total of four rectangles for the Log Cabin blocks.
  - □ two 2" x 8" rectangles for a total of four rectangles for the Log Cabin blocks.
- From each of two strips, subcut:
  - $\Box$  two 2" x 11" rectangles for the Log Cabin blocks.
  - $\Box$  two 2" x 5" rectangles for the Log Cabin blocks.
  - □ two 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles for the Log Cabin blocks.
- From one strip, subcut:
  - $\Box$  four 2" x 9-1/2" rectangles for the Log Cabin blocks.
- From one strip, subcut:
  - $\Box$  four 2" x 6-1/2" rectangles for the Log Cabin blocks.
  - □ four 2" squares—four squares are for the Log Cabin blocks.

#### From Fabric B, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end rotating every other strip to maintain the gradient effect, then subcut:

• four 2-1/2" x 70-1/2" Border 6 strips.

eleven 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end rotating every other strip to maintain the gradient effect, then subcut:

- two 1-1/2" x 62-1/2" Border 3 top/bottom strips.
- two 1-1/2" x 60-1/2" Border 3 side strips.
- two 1-1/2" x 32-1/2" Fabric B border strips.
- two 1-1/2" x 30-1/2" Fabric B border strips.
- two 1-1/2" x 22-1/2" Fabric B border strips.
- two 1-1/2" x 20-1/2" Fabric B border strips.

#### From each of Fabrics C, G, H, L, O, P, Q, and R, cut:

one 5-1/4" x WOF strip of each fabric. Subcut:

- one 5-1/4" square of each fabric for the Flying Geese.
- four 5-1/4" x 3-3/8" rectangles of each fabric, then trim them to 3-3/8" square for the SIAS blocks.
- two 5-1/4" x 2-1/2" rectangles of each fabric, then subcut each rectangle into two 2-1/2" squares for Border 5.

#### From each of Fabrics D and S, cut:

one 5-1/4" x WOF strip of each fabric. Subcut:

- one 5-1/4" square of each fabric for the Flying Geese.
- four 5-1/4" x 3-3/8" rectangles of each fabric, then trim them to 3-3/8" square for the SIAS blocks.
- six 5-1/4" x 2-1/2" rectangles of each fabric, then subcut each rectangle into two 2-1/2" squares—four squares are for Border 5 and eight are for the Cornerstone Star blocks.

one 2" x WOF strip of each fabric. Subcut:

• eight 2" squares of each fabric for the Cornerstone Star blocks.

#### From Fabric E, cut:

one 3-3/8" x WOF strip of each fabric. Subcut:

- four 3-3/8" squares of each fabric for the SIAS blocks.
- four 3-3/8" x 2-1/2" rectangles of each fabric, then trim them to 2-1/2" squares for Border 5.

#### From Fabric F, cut:

one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

• four 2-1/2" squares for Border 5.

#### From Fabric I, cut:

one 3-3/8" x WOF strip. Subcut:

- four 3-3/8" squares for the SIAS blocks.
- four 3-3/8" x 2-1/2" rectangles, then trim them to 2-1/2" square for Border 5.
- four 3-3/8" x 2" rectangles, then trim them to 2" square for the Log Cabin blocks.

one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

• twelve 3-1/2" squares for the half-square triangles (HSTs) in the Center Medallion.

#### From Fabric J, cut:

one 5-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

- one 5-1/4" square for the Flying Geese.
- four 5-1/4" x 3-1/2" rectangles, then trim them to 3-1/2" square for the half-square triangles (HSTs) in the Center Medallion.
- four 5-1/4" x 2-1/2" rectangles, then trim them to 2-1/2" square for Border 5.
- four 5-1/4" x 2" rectangles, then trim them to 5" x 2" rectangles for the Log Cabin blocks.

one 2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

• four 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles for the Log Cabin blocks.

#### From Fabric K, cut:

one 5-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

- one 5-1/4" square for the Flying Geese.
- four 5-1/4" x 3-3/8" rectangles, then trim them to 3-3/8" square for the SIAS blocks.
- two 5-1/4" x 8" rectangles, then trim subcut each rectangle into two 2" x 8" rectangles for the Log Cabin blocks.

one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

• twelve 3-1/2" squares for the Center Star.

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

- From one strip, subcut
  - □ sixteen 2-1/2" squares—twelve squares are for the HSTs in the Center Medallion and four are for Border 5.
- From one strip, subcut:
  - □ eight 2-1/2" squares for the Cornerstone Star blocks.
- From one strip, subcut:
  - □ four 2" x 6-1/2" rectangles for the Log Cabin blocks.
  - Trim the remainder of the strip to 2", then subcut eight 2" squares for the Cornerstone Star blocks.

#### From Fabric M, cut:

one 5-1/4" x WOF strip of each fabric. Subcut:

- one 5-1/4" square of each fabric for the Flying Geese.
- four 5-1/4" x 3-3/8" rectangles of each fabric, then trim them to 3-3/8" square for the SIAS blocks.
- six 5-1/4" x 2-1/2" rectangles of each fabric, then subcut each rectangle into two 2-1/2" squares —four squares are for Border 5 and eight are for the Cornerstone Star blocks.

one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

- four 3-1/2" squares for the half-square triangles (HSTs) in the center medallion.
- one 3-1/2" x 11" rectangle, then trim it to 2" x 11" for the Log Cabin blocks.

three 2" x WOF strips.

- From one strip, subcut:
  - $\hfill\square$  three 2" x 11" rectangles for the Log Cabin blocks.
- From one strip, subcut:
  - $\Box$  four 2" x 9-1/2" rectangles for the Log Cabin blocks.
- From one strip, subcut:
  - □ eight 2" squares for the Cornerstone Star blocks.

#### From Fabric N, cut:

one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

• four 2-1/2" squares for Border 5.

three 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

- four 2" x 14" rectangles for the Log Cabin blocks.
- four 2" x 12-1/2" rectangles for the Log Cabin blocks.

#### From the Binding Fabric, cut:

ten 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

# Assemble the Center Star

# Make the HSTs

Step 1: Gather six 3-1/2" Fabric A squares and six 3-1/2" Fabric I squares.

**Step 2:** Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each lighter colored square. Place the marked square on top of a darker square, RST. Sew on both sides of the marked line with a 1/4" seam allowance, then cut on the marked line. Open, press, and trim each unit to 3". Make twelve A/I HSTs.



**Step 3:** Gather two 3-1/2" Fabric A squares and two 3-1/2" Fabric J squares. Repeat the process in Step 2 to create four A/J HSTs.

**Step 4:** Gather six 3-1/2" Fabric A squares and six 3-1/2" Fabric K squares. Repeat the process in Step 2 to create twelve A/K HSTs.

**Step 5:** Gather two 3-1/2" Fabric A squares and two 3-1/2" Fabric M squares. Repeat the process in Step 2 to create four A/M HSTs.

**Step 6:** Gather six 3-1/2" Fabric I squares and six 3-1/2" Fabric K squares. Repeat the process in Step 2 to create twelve I/K HSTs.

**Step 7:** Gather two 3-1/2" Fabric J squares and two 3-1/2" Fabric M squares. Repeat the process in Step 2 to create four J/M HSTs.









# Make the Quadrants

**Step 8:** Gather four 3" Fabric A squares, three A/I HSTs, one A/J HST, three A/K HSTs, one A/M HST, three I/K HSTs, and one J/M HST.

**Step 9:** Arrange the units in four rows of four as shown.

**Step 10:** Sew the units together to form rows, then press the seams in opposite directions.

**Step 11:** Nest the seams and sew the rows together. Press. Make four quadrants.







# Make the Center Star

**Step 12:** Gather the four quadrants and arrange them in two rows of two as shown. Sew the rows together and press the seams in opposite directions. Nest the seams and sew the rows together. Press. The Center Star should measure 20-1/2" x 20-1/2".

# Make the Flying Geese

Step 13: Gather the 2-7/8" Fabric A squares and the 5-1/4" squares in Fabrics C, D, G, H, J, K, L, M, O, P, Q, R, and S.

Step 14: Pin two 2-7/8" Fabric A squares in opposing corners of a 5-1/4" Fabric C square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.

**Step 15:** Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 16: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.

Step 17: Place one 2-7/8" Fabric A square at the corner of sewn block unit. Draw diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 18: Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" if necessary.

Step 19: Repeat with the remaining squares you gathered to create sets of four flying geese in each of the fabrics.

## Make the Flying Geese Borders

Step 20: Gather the Flying Geese units made from Fabrics P and Q. Sew them together in pairs as shown. You will have four units.

**Step 21:** Gather one Flying Geese unit in each remaining fabric. Sew them together in a row as shown. Press. Make four Flying Geese Borders.

Step 22: Sew two Step 20 units to each end of a Step 21 unit as shown. Make two long borders.



















# Assemble the Center Medallion

**Step 23:** Gather the Center Star, two 1-1/2" x 20-1/2" Fabric B border strips, two 1-1/2" x 32-1/2" Fabric B border strips, two 1-1/2" x 30-1/2" Fabric B border strips, two 1-1/2" x 22-1/2" Fabric B border strips, and the four Flying Geese Borders.

**Step 24:** Sew the 1-1/2" x 20-1/2" Fabric B border strips to the sides of the Center Star, then press. Sew the 1-1/2" x 22-1/2" Fabric B border strips to the top and bottom of the unit, then press.

**Step 25:** Pay attention to the orientation of the two short Flying Geese Borders, then sew them to the sides of the unit. Press. Pay attention to the orientation of the two longer Flying Geese Borders, then sew them to the top and bottom of the unit. Press.

**Step 26:** Sew the 1-1/2" x 30-1/2" Fabric B border strips to the sides of the unit, then press. Sew the 1-1/2" x 32-1/2" Fabric B border strips to the top and bottom of the unit, then press. The center medallion should measure approximately 32-1/2" x 32-1/2".

# Assemble the Log Cabin Blocks

**Step 27:** Gather one 2" Fabric I square, one 2" x 3-1/2" Fabric J rectangle, one 2" x 5" Fabric J rectangle, one 2" x 6-1/2" Fabric K rectangle, one 2" x 8" Fabric K rectangle, one 2" x 9-1/2" Fabric M rectangle, one 2" x 11" Fabric M rectangle, one 2" x 12-1/2" Fabric N rectangle, one 2" x 14" Fabric N rectangle. Gather Fabric A squares and rectangles in the following sizes: 2" x 2", 2" x 3-1/2", 2" x 5", 2" x 6-1/2", 2" x 8", 2" x 9-1/2", 2" x 11", and 2" x 12-1/2" as well.

**Step 28:** Sew the 2" Fabric A square to the right side of the 2" Fabric I square, then press. Sew the 2" x 3-1/2" Fabric A rectangle to the bottom of the rectangle, then press. Sew the 2" x 3-1/2" Fabric J rectangle to the left side of the unit, then press. Sew the 2" x 5" Fabric J rectangle to the top of the unit, then press.

**Step 29:** Sew the 2" x 5" Fabric A rectangle to the right side of the unit, then press. Sew the 2" x 6-1/2" Fabric A rectangle to the bottom of the unit, then press. Sew the 2" x 6-1/2" Fabric K rectangle to the left side of the unit, then press. Sew the 2" x 8" Fabric K rectangle to the top of the unit, then press.





**Step 30:** Sew the 2" x 8" Fabric A rectangle to the right side of the unit, then press. Sew the 2" x 9-1/2" Fabric A rectangle to the bottom of the unit, then press. Sew the 2" x 9-1/2" Fabric M rectangle to the left side of the unit, then press. Sew the 2" x 11" Fabric M rectangle to the top of the unit, then press.





**Step 31:** Sew the 2" x 11" Fabric A rectangle to the right side of the unit, then press. Sew the 2" x 12-1/2" Fabric A rectangle to the bottom of the unit, then press. Sew the 2" x 12-1/2" Fabric N rectangle to the left side of the unit, then press. Sew the 2" x 14" Fabric N rectangle to the top of the unit, then press.

Step 32: Repeat Steps 27-31 to make four Log Cabin blocks.

# Add the Log Cabin Blocks to the Center Medallion

**Step 33:** Gather one Log Cabin block and two 12" setting triangles. Sew the two triangles to either side of the log cabin block as shown. Press. Make four Log Cabin Corners.

**Step 34:** Measure the size of your Center Medallion and trim the Log Cabin Corners to match. Use a long ruler to find the right place along the bottom edge of the unit. Place one edge of the ruler at the edge of the fabric and make sure your ruler is parallel to the bottom edge. Slide the ruler until the right measurement on your ruler is at the opposite edge of the unit.





**Step 35:** Sew a Log Cabin Corner to each corner of the Center Medallion. Press. The quilt center should measure approximately 45-3/4" x 45-3/4".

#### Attach the Border 1 Strips



**Step 36:** Gather the Border 1 strips. Note: These strips were cut longer to allow for any variances in quilt size. You will also trim the entire quilt center to match the borders you make in the next section.

**Step 37:** Measure the height of the quilt center in three places, then trim the 4-1/2" x 46-1/2" Border 1 side strips to match. Sew them to the sides of the quilt center, then press.

**Step 38:** Measure the width of the quilt center in three places, then trim the 4-1/2" x 55" Border 1 top/ bottom strips to match. Sew them to the top and bottom of the quilt center.

# Make the Square-in-a-Square Blocks

Step 39: Gather the one-hundred and twelve 2-7/8" Fabric A triangles and the 3-3/8" squares of Fabrics C, D, E, G, H, I, K, L, M, O, P, Q, R, and S.

Step 40: Sew two Fabric A triangles to two opposite sides of a Fabric C square, then press.

**Step 41:** Sew two Fabric A triangles to the two remaining sides of the unit, then press. Repeat to make a total of fifty-six Square-in-a-Square blocks using the remaining gather pieces.

# Make the Borders

**Step 42:** Gather one Square-in-a-Square block in each of the fabrics except Fabric C. Sew the Square-in-a-Square blocks together in a row as shown. Press. Make four Square-in-a-Square borders.

# Attach the Borders

Step 44: Measure the length of vour shorter Sauare-in-a-Sauare borders. Square the Quilt Center to this size—approximately 52-1/2".

Step 45: Sew the two shorter Square-in-a-Square borders to the sides of the guilt center, then press. Sew the two longer Squarein-a-Square borders to the top and bottom, then press.









# Attach Border 3



**Step 46:** Gather the two 1-1/2" x 60-1/2" side Border 3 strips and the two 1-1/2" x 62-1/2" top/bottom Border 3 strips. Sew the two side Border 3 strips to the sides of the quilt top, then press. Sew the two top/bottom Border 3 strips to the top and bottom edges of the quilt top, then press.

Attach Border 4



**Step 47:** Gather the two 2-1/2" x 66-1/2" Border 4 top/bottom strips and the two 2-1/2" x 62-1/2" Border 4 side strips. Sew the two side Border 4 strips to the sides of the quilt top, then press. Sew the two top/bottom Border 4 strips to the top and bottom edges of the quilt top, then press.

## Assemble and Attach Border 5

#### Make the Borders

**Step 48:** Gather the 2-1/2" squares in the following fabrics: A, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, K, L, M, N, O, P, Q, R, and S.

**Step 49:** Select seventeen Fabric A squares. Select one square of each of Fabrics C-S <u>except</u> Fabric I.



**Step 50:** Sew the squares together in a row as shown. Press. Make four Pieced Square Borders.



Step 51: Sew a Fabric I square to each end of a Pieced Square Border. Make two.

#### Attach the Borders

**Step 52:** Measure the length of your shorter Pieced Square Borders. If necessary, square the Quilt Center to this size approximately 66-1/2". Alternatively, you could adjust the seam allowance to match the quilt size.

**Step 53:** Sew the two shorter Pieced Square Borders to the sides of the quilt center, then press. Sew the two longer Pieced Square Borders to the top and bottom, then press.



## Assemble the Cornerstone Star Blocks

Step 54: Gather sixteen 3-1/2" Fabric A squares, twelve 2-1/2" Fabric A squares, eight 2-1/2" Fabric D squares, eight 2-1/2" Fabric K squares, eight 2-1/2" Fabric M squares, eight 2-1/2" Fabric S squares, eight 2" Fabric D squares, eight 2" Fabric K squares, eight 2" Fabric M squares, and eight 2" Fabric S squares.

## Make the Half-Square Triangles

Step 55: Pair a 2-1/2" Fabric A square with a 2-1/2" Fabric D square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2" square. Repeat to make eight A/D HSTs.

Step 56: Repeat Step 56 using four 2-1/2" Fabric A squares and four 2-1/2" Fabric K squares to make eight A/K HSTs.

Step 57: Repeat Step 56 using four 2-1/2" Fabric A squares and four 2-1/2" Fabric M squares to make eight A/M HSTs.

Step 58: Repeat Step 56 using four 2-1/2" Fabric A squares and four 2-1/2" Fabric S squares to make eight A/S HSTs.

Step 59: Repeat Step 56 using four 2-1/2" Fabric D squares and four 2-1/2" Fabric S sauares to make eight D/S HSTs.

Step 60: Repeat Step 56 using four 2-1/2" Fabric K squares and four 2-1/2" Fabric M squares to make eight K/M HSTs.

# Make the Quadrants

Step 61: Arrange one 3-1/2" Fabric A square, one 2" Fabric D square, one 2" Fabric S square, one A/D HST, one A/S HST, and one D/S HST as shown.

Step 62: Sew the A/S HST to the top of the S square, then press. Sew the 3-1/2" Fabric A square to the left side of this unit and press to complete the top row.

**Step 63:** Sew the three remaining units together and press to form the bottom row.

**Step 64:** Sew the top row to the bottom row, then press to complete the guadrant. Make eight quadrants.

Step 65: Arrange four guadrants in two rows of two as shown. Sew the quadrants together in pairs and press the seams in opposite directions. Nest the seams and sew the rows together to complete the block. Make two A/D/S Cornerstone Star blocks.

Step 66: Repeat Steps 61-65 using Fabric A, K, and M pieces. Make two A/K/M Cornerstone Star blocks.















# Assemble and Attach Border 6



## Make the Borders

**Step 67:** Gather the eight 4" x 70-1/2" Fabric A Border 6 strips, the four 2-1/2" x 70-1/2" Fabric B Border 6 strips, and the four Cornerstone Star blocks.

**Step 68:** Select two Fabric A strips and one Fabric B strip. Sew the B strip in between the A strips, lengthwise, then press. Make four borders.

**Step 69:** Sew an A/D/S Cornerstone Star block to one end of a border and an A/K/M Cornerstone Star block to the other end. Press. Make two borders.

## Attach the Borders

**Step 70:** Sew the shorter borders to the left and right sides of the quilt top, then press. Sew the longer borders to the top and bottom of the quilt top and press.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!

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
