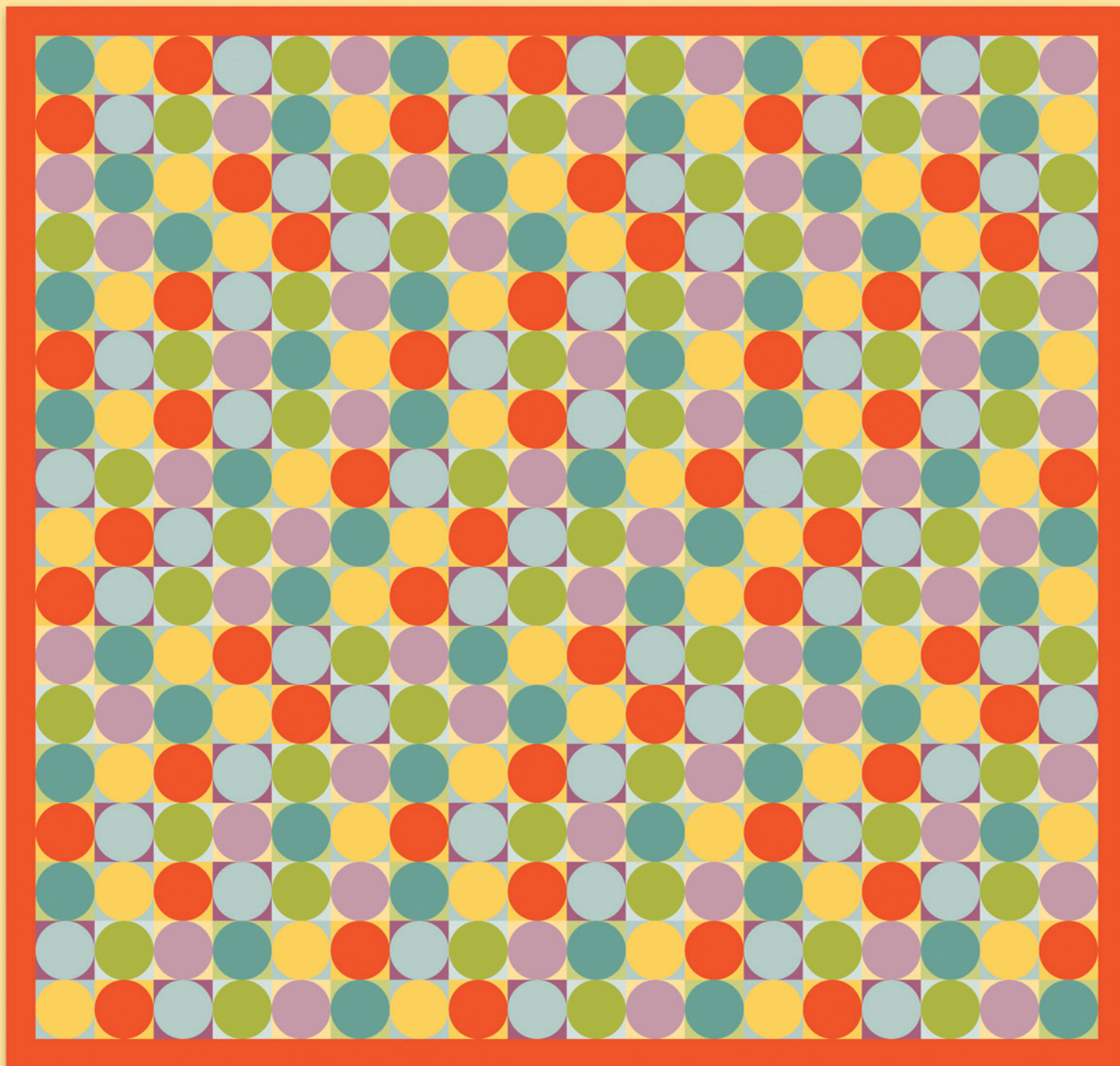

All border strip length measurements are approximate. Please measure your quilt top before cutting the length of each border.

Square Quilt approximate size 76" square

Rectangle Quilt approximate size 52" x 64"

Square Quilt Fabric Requirements and Cutting Instructions

Fabric A- 7/8 yard of Sage

Fabric B- 1-7/8 yards of Cactus

Fabric C- 1-7/8 yards of Daffodil

Fabric D- 1-7/8 yards of Aqua

Fabric E- 2 yards of Tomato

Fabric F- 1 yard of Berry

Fabric G- 1 yard of Ice Frappe

Fabric H- 7/8 yard of Petunia

Fabric I- 1 yard of Banana

Backing- 5 yards of Your Choice

Fusible Web- 9 yards of 18" wide fusible

- Cut eight 2-1/2" x width of fabric (WOF) strips. Piece the strips together to make two 2-1/2" x 76-1/2" strips and two 2-1/2" x 72-1/2" strips for the outer border.
- Cut fifty-four 4-1/2" squares.
 - Cut fifty-four 4-1/2" squares.
- See instructions to cut fifty-four circles.
- Cut fifty-four 4-1/2" squares.
 - Cut two 82" x WOF strips. Piece the strips together to make one 82" square.

Square Quilt Assembly Instructions:

- 1) Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace (324) circles onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each shape outside the drawn lines. Press the circle templates to the back side of the listed fabrics and cut out each shape on the drawn lines.
- 2) Press one circle to the center of one 4-1/2" background square as listed here. You will make fifty-four of each fabric pair.

Circle-A/ Background-B	Circle-C/ Background-D	Circle-E/ Background-C
Circle-D/ Background-F	Circle-B/ Background-H	Circle-I/ Background-J
- 3) Finish the raw edges of each circle with a decorative stitch such as buttonhole or satin stitch matching the thread to the circle fabrics.
- 4) Refer to the quilt photo and lay out the blocks on a design wall, eighteen blocks by eighteen blocks. Once you have the blocks laid out, sew the blocks into rows. Sew the rows together to make the quilt top.
- 6) Sew one 2-1/2" x 72-1/2" Fabric E strip to each side of the quilt. Sew one 2-1/2" x 76-1/2" Fabric E strip to the top and bottom.
- 7) Layer, quilt and bind as desired.

Rectangle Quilt Fabric Requirements and Cutting Instructions

Fabric A- 1/2 yard of Sage

Fabric B- 1-1/4 yards of Cactus

Fabric C- 1-1/4 yards of Daffodil

Fabric D- 1-1/4 yards of Aqua

Fabric E- 1-1/2 yards of Tomato

Fabric F- 2/3 yard of Berry

Fabric G- 2/3 yard of Ice Frappe

Fabric H- 1/2 yard of Petunia

Fabric I- 2/3 yard of Banana

Backing- 3-1/2 yards of Your Choice

Fusible Web- 5 yards of 18" wide fusible

- Cut seven 2-1/2" x width of fabric (WOF) strips. Piece the strips together to make two 2-1/2" x 60-1/2" strips and two 2-1/2" x 52-1/2" strips for the outer border.
- Cut thirty 4-1/2" squares.
 - Cut thirty 4-1/2" squares.
- See instructions to cut thirty circles.
- Cut thirty 4-1/2" squares.
 - Cut two 60" x WOF strips. Piece the strips together to make one 60" x 72" piece

Rectangle Quilt Assembly Instructions:

- 1) Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace (180) circles onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each shape outside the drawn lines. Press the circle templates to the back side of the listed fabrics and cut out each shape on the drawn lines.
- 2) Press one circle to the center of one 4-1/2" background square as listed here. You will make thirty of each fabric pair.

Circle-A/ Background-B	Circle-C/ Background-D	Circle-E/ Background-C
Circle-D/ Background-F	Circle-B/ Background-H	Circle-I/ Background-J
- 3) Finish the raw edges of each circle with a decorative stitch such as buttonhole or satin stitch matching the thread to the circle fabrics.
- 4) Refer to the quilt photo and lay out the blocks on a design wall, twelve blocks by fifteen blocks. Once you have the blocks laid out, sew the blocks into rows. Sew the rows together to make the quilt top.
- 6) Sew one 2-1/2" x 60-1/2" Fabric E strip to each side of the quilt. Sew one 2-1/2" x 52-1/2" Fabric E strip to the top and bottom.
- 7) Layer, quilt and bind as desired.
