## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4$ " unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

## From Fabric A, cut:

four 13" x WOF strips. Subcut: ten 13 " squares, then subcut:
each square diagonally to yield large setting triangles.
two $13^{\prime \prime} \times 9-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles, then trim each rectangle to 9-1/2" square. Subcut: each square diagonally to yield small setting triangles.
four 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty-six 4-1/2" squares for the Quarter-Square Triangles (QSTs).
two 4-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
eighteen 4-1/4" squares for the Flying Geese units.
four 4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty-six 4" squares for the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs).
seven 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one-hundred and forty-four 3-1/2" $\times 2$ " rectangles for the Stitch-and-Flip units.
four 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: seventy-two 2" squares for the Center Star units.

From each of Fabrics B and G, cut:
two 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
ten 4-1/2" squares of each fabric for the QSTs.
two 2 " x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty 2 " squares of each fabric for the Stitch-and-Flip units.
From each of Fabrics $C$ and $F$, cut:
one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
four 3-1/2" squares of each fabric for the Center Star units.
one 2-3/8" x WOF strip. Subcut:
sixteen 2-3/8" squares of each fabric for the Flying Geese units.

## From each of Fabrics $D$ and $E$, cut:

one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
five $3-1 / 2$ " squares of each fabric for the Center Star units.
Trim the remainder of the strip to $2-3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$, then add it to the strip below.
one $2-3 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip. Subcut:
twenty $2-3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares of each fabric for the Flying Geese units.

## From each of Fabrics H and I , cut:

one 4-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight 4-1/2" squares of each fabric for the QSTs.
two 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty-two 2" squares of each fabric for the Stitch-and-Flip units.
From each of Fabrics J and K , cut:
one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut: ten 4" squares of each fabric for the HSTs.

From each of Fabrics $L$ and $M$, cut:
one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight 4" squares of each fabric for the HSTs.
From the Binding Fabric, cut
eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

## Assemble the Flying Geese Units

Step 1: Pin two 2-3/8" Fabric C squares in opposing corners of a 4-1/4" Fabric A square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.

Step 2: Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 3: Press the fabric towards smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.

Step 4: Place one 2-3/8" Fabric C square at the corner of a sewn block unit. Draw a diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant $1 / 4$ " seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 5: Press the seam towards the smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 2 " $\times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ if necessary. Repeat to make sixteen A/C flying geese units.
Step 6: Repeat with all remaining 4-1/4" Fabric A squares and 2-3/8" Fabric D-F squares to make a total of:

twenty $A / D$ flying geese units twenty $A / E$ flying geese units sixteen $A / F$ flying geese units

## Assemble the Center Star Units

Step 7: Gather four A/C flying geese units, four 2" Fabric A squares, and one 3-1/2" Fabric C square. Arrange the pieces in three rows of three as shown. Sew the pieces together to form rows, then press the seams away from the flying geese. Nest the seams and sew the rows together. Press. Repeat to
 make a total of four Fabric C Center Star Units.

Step 8: Repeat with the remaining 2" Fabric A squares, 3-1/2" Fabric D-F squares, and remaining flying geese to make:

a total of five
Fabric D Center Star Units

a total of five
Fabric E Center Star Units

a total of four Fabric F Center Star Units

## Assemble the Quarter-Square Triangles (QSTs)

Step 9: Pair a 4-1/2" Fabric A square with a 4-1/2" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew $1 / 4$ " away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press towards the darker fabric. Trim to 4" square. Repeat to make twenty A/B HSTs.


Step 10: Pair two A/B HSTs, RST with the seams nested. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one unit, perpendicular to the seam. Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line creating two quarter-square triangles (QSTs). Press the seam open or towards one side. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Repeat to make twenty A/B QSTs.


Step 11: Repeat with the remaining 4-1/2" Fabric A squares paired with the 4-1/2" Fabric G-I squares to make:

a total of twenty A/G QSTs

a total of sixteen A/H QSTs

a total of sixteen $A / I$ QSTs

Step 12: Gather one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangle and 2 " Fabric B square. Place the square on one end of the rectangle, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the square. Sew on the marked line, then trim the excess fabric 1/4" away from the sewn seam. Press towards the darker fabric. Repeat to make twenty A/B stitch-and-flip units.


Step 13: Repeat with half of the remaining $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2$ " Fabric A rectangles and the 2 " Fabric G-I squares to make:

a total of twenty $A / G$ stitch-and-flip units

a total of sixteen $A / H$
stitch-and-flip units

a total of sixteen $\mathrm{A} / \mathrm{I}$ stitch-and-flip units

Step 14: Repeat Steps 12-13 using the remaining 3-1/2" $\times 2$ " Fabric A rectangles and the 2" Fabric G-I squares to make:


## Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 15: Pair a 4" Fabric A square with a 4" Fabric J square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew $1 / 4$ " away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Repeat to make twenty A/J HSTs.


Step 16: Repeat Step 15 using the remaining 4" Fabric A squares paired with the 4" Fabric K-M squares to make:

a total of twenty A/K HSTs

a total of sixteen A/L HSTs

a total of sixteen A/M HSTs


Step 17: Gather one Fabric D Center Star Unit, four A/B QSTs, four A/B stitch-and-flip units, four mirrored A/B stitch-and-flip units, and four A/J HSTs.

Step 18: Sew a stitch-and-flip unit and a mirrored stitch-and-flip unit to the sides of a QST as shown, then press. Make four side center units.


Step 19: Arrange the pieces in three rows of three as shown. Sew the pieces together to form rows, then press the seams of each row in opposite directions. Nest the seams and sew the rows together, then press. Repeat to make a total of five $D / B / J$ Blocks.


Step 20: Gather one Fabric E Center Star Unit, four A/G QSTs, four A/G stitch-and-flip units, four mirrored A/G stitch-and-flip units, and four A/K HSTs.

Step 21: Sew a stitch-and-flip unit and a mirrored stitch-and-flip unit to the sides of a QST as shown, then press. Make four side center units.

Step 22: Arrange the pieces in three rows of three as shown. Sew the pieces together to form rows, then press the seams of each row in opposite directions. Nest the seams and sew the rows together, then press. Repeat to make a total of five E/G/K Blocks.


Step 23: Gather one Fabric C Center Star Unit, four A/H QSTs, four A/H stitch-and-flip units, four mirrored A/H stitch-and-flip units, and four A/L HSTs.

Step 24: Sew a stitch-and-flip unit and a mirrored stitch-and-flip unit to the sides of a QST as shown, then press. Make four side center units.

Step 25: Arrange the pieces in three rows of three as shown. Sew the pieces together to form rows, then press the seams of each row in opposite directions. Nest the seams and sew the rows together, then press. Repeat to make a total of four C/H/L Blocks.



Step 27: Sew a stitch-and-flip unit and a mirrored stitch-and-flip unit to the sides of a QST as shown, then press. Make four side center units.

Step 28: Arrange the pieces in three rows of three as shown. Sew the pieces together to form rows, then press the seams of each row in opposite directions. Nest the seams and sew the rows together, then press. Repeat to make a total of four F/I/MBlocks.


Assemble the Quilt
Step 29: Arrange the blocks into diagonal rows. Place the setting triangles at the ends of each row and on each corner of the quilt center. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 30: Sew the blocks together to form diagonal rows. Press the seams to the left in the oddnumbered rows and to the right in the even-numbered rows.

Step 31: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.



Step 32: Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 33: Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!

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
