Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

3-1/3 yards for backing


Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From 40 squares in the Ten Square Pack, cut as shown:

cut along both diagonals, creating four triangles per square, for a total of one hundred sixty squares



From Fabric A, cut:

twenty 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
eighty 1-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles for the sashing strips

From Fabric B, cut:


two 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
fifty 1-1/2" squares for the corner stones

From the Binding Fabric, cut:


six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Blocks


Step 1: Arrange two print triangles together as shown. Sew together and press to the left. Repeat to make eighty pairs like this.




Step 2: Sew two pairs of triangles together along the longest edge, nesting the seams and pressing the seam open or to one side. Trim to 8-1/2" square, centering the seams through the middle of the block. Repeat to make thirty one Blocks like this. The remaining eighteen triangle pairs will be used in the quilt assembly.



Assemble the Quilt



Step 3: Arrange the Blocks and triangle pairs together in diagonal rows as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew each row together, using sashing strips between each block or triangle pair. Note: align the 90-degree corner of the triangle pairs with the corner of any adjacent Blocks. The excess from the triangle pairs will be trimmed in the final step. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make nine rows.



Step 4: Gather cornerstone squares and remaining sashing strips. Sew each sashing row together, using cornerstones between each sashing strip and at the beginning and end of each row. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make eight sashing rows.

Step 5: Sew the sashing and block rows together, pinning and nesting the seams. Press seams open or to the sashing. Sew the two remaining cornerstones to the two corners of the quilt, as shown. Press.

Step 6: Trim to approximately 51" x 64", as shown.

Your quilt top is finished! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
