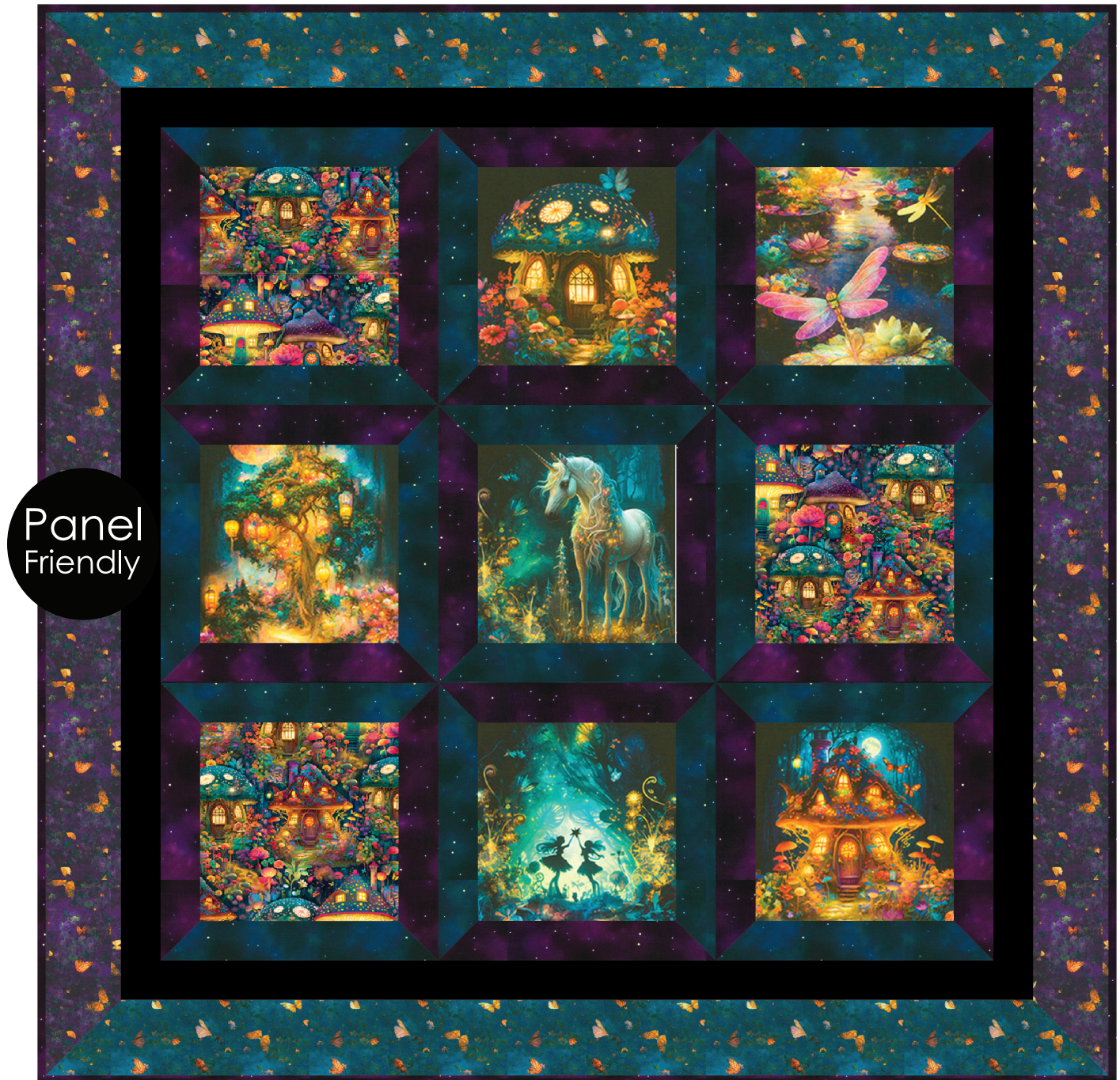

Finished quilt measures: 54" x 54"









## Fabric and Supplies Needed

*Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.*

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## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## Cutting Instructions

### **From Fabric A, cut:**

one 10-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:  
three 10-1/2" squares

### **From Fabric B, fussy cut:**

six 10-1/2" squares centered on the motifs

### **From each of Fabrics C and D, cut:**

two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:  
eighteen 3" squares of each fabric  
two 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" rectangles of each fabric  
four 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:  
sixteen 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" rectangles of each fabric

### **From Fabric E, cut:**

*\*Note: Depending upon the width of your fabric, you may be able to cut the side inner borders without sewing strips together.*

five 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end, then subcut:  
two 2-1/2" x 46-1/2" top/bottom inner borders  
two 2-1/2" x 42-1/2" side inner borders\*

### **From Fabric F, cut:**

one 5" x WOF strip. Subcut:  
two 5" squares  
Trim the remainder of the strip to 4-1/2" wide. Add this strip to those cut below.  
two 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end, then subcut:  
two 4-1/2" x 46-1/2" side outer borders

### **From Fabric G, cut:**

one 5" x WOF strip. Subcut:  
two 5" squares  
Trim the remainder of the strip to 4-1/2" wide. Add this strip to those cut below.  
two 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end, then subcut:  
two 4-1/2" x 46-1/2" top/bottom outer borders

### **From the Binding Fabric, cut:**

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

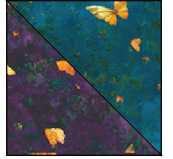


## Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

**Step 1:** Pair a 3" Fabric C square with a 3" Fabric D square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat to make thirty-six C/D HSTs.

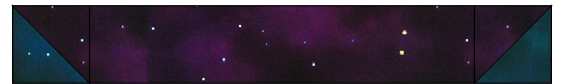


**Step 2:** Pair a 5" Fabric F square with a 5" Fabric G square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat to make four F/G HSTs.

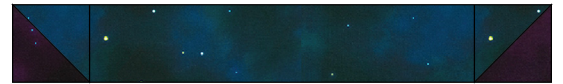


## Assemble the Blocks

**Step 3:** Sew two C/D HSTs to the ends of one  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C rectangle as shown. Press the seams toward the rectangle. Make eight units.



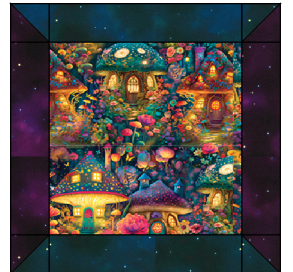
**Step 4:** Sew two C/D HSTs to the ends of one  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D rectangle as shown. Press the seams toward the rectangle. Make ten units.



**Step 5:** Sew one  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A or Fabric B square between two  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C rectangles. Press the seams toward the rectangles.



**Step 6:** Sew the Step 5 unit between two Step 4 units as shown. Press the seams toward the center of the block.

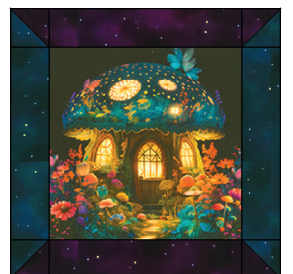


**Step 7:** Repeat Steps 5-6 to make five blocks.

**Step 8:** Sew one  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A or Fabric B square between two  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D rectangles. Press the seams toward the rectangles.



**Step 9:** Sew the Step 8 unit between two Step 3 units as shown. Press the seams toward the center of the block.



**Step 10:** Repeat Steps 8-9 to make four blocks.

## Assemble the Quilt

**Step 11:** Arrange the blocks into three rows of three blocks. Note the fabric and block placement in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

**Step 12:** Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the seams to the left in the odd-numbered rows and to the right in the even-numbered rows.

**Step 13:** Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

**Step 14:** Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

**Step 15:** Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!
