## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least $44^{\prime \prime}$ wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

Tip: Due to the large number of fabrics and pieces cut for this quilt, it is recommended that you cut each fabric and place the pieces in stacks by Border number. Label these stacks and the cutting sizes of each for quick piecing later during construction!

## From Fabric A, cut:

one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight 3 " x $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for Border 7 Flying Geese
Trim remainder of strip down to $2-5 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF. Subcut:
three $2-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares for Border 3 Square in a Squares
one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut two 4" squares for the Center Medallion
two 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight 3-1/2" squares for the Center Medallion
four 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles for the Center Medallion
one 2-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight 2-7/8" squares for Border 5 Flying Geese and four 2-7/8" squares for Border 5 Square in a Squares. Cut each in half once on the diagonal
eight $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sew together end to end, then trim to:
two 1-1/2" $\times 65-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for the top/bottom of Border 8 two $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 67-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for the sides of Border 8

## From Fabrics B and D, cut:

one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for Border 7 Flying Geese
Trim remainder of strip down to $2-5 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF. Subcut:
three 2-5/8" squares for Border 3 Square in a Squares
one 2-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight 2-7/8" squares for Border 5 Flying Geese and four 2-7/8" squares for Border 5 Square in a Squares. Cut each in half once on the diagonal

## From Fabric C, cut:

one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for Border 7 Flying Geese Trim remainder of strip down to $2-5 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF. Subcut:
three 2-5/8" squares for Border 3 Square in a Squares
one 4 " x WOF strip. Subcut:
four 4" squares for the Center Medallion
one 2-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight 2-7/8" squares for Border 5 Flying Geese and four 2-7/8" squares for Border 5 Square in a Squares. Cut each in half once on the diagonal

## From Fabric E, cut:

one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight 3 " $\times 5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for Border 7 Flying Geese
Trim remainder of strip down to 2-5/8" x WOF. Subcut:
three 2-5/8" squares for Border 3 Square in a Squares
one 4 " x WOF strip. Subcut:
two 4" squares for the Center Medallion
Trim the remainder of the strip to 3-7/8", then subcut: two 3-7/8" squares for the Center Medallion. Cut each in half once on the diagonal seven $4 " \times$ WOF strips. Sew together end-to-end, then trim to:
two 4" x 67-1/2" strips for the top/bottom of Border 9
two $4 " \times 74-1 / 2 "$ strips for the sides of Border 9
one $2-7 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip. Subcut:
eight 2-7/8" squares for Border 5 Flying Geese and four 2-7/8" squares for Border 5 Square in a Squares. Cut each in half once on the diagonal

## From Fabric F, cut:

one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for Border 7 Flying Geese
Trim remainder of strip down to 2-5/8" x WOF. Subcut:
three 2-5/8" squares for Border 3 Square in a Squares
one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut
eight 3-1/2" squares for Center Medallion Flying Geese one 2-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight 2-7/8" squares for Border 5 Flying Geese and four 2-7/8" squares for Border 5
Square in a Squares. Cut each in half once on the diagonal

## From Fabrics G, I, and J, cut:

one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for Border 7 Flying Geese
Trim remainder of strip down to $2-5 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF. Subcut:
three $2-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares for Border 3 Square in a Squares

## From Fabric H , cut:

one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for Border 7 Flying Geese
Trim remainder of strip down to 2-5/8" x WOF. Subcut:
three 2-5/8" squares for Border 3 Square in a Squares
one $2-7 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip. Subcut:
eight $2-7 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares for Border 5 Flying Geese and four 2-7/8" squares for Border 5 Square in a Squares. Cut each in half once on the diagonal
six $2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sew together end-to-end, then trim to:
two 2 " $\times 52-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for the top/bottom of Border 6
two 2 " $\times 55-1 / 2$ " strips for the sides of Border 6

## From Fabric K cut:

one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for Border 7 Flying Geese
Trim remainder of strip down to 2-5/8" x WOF. Subcut:
three 2-5/8" squares for Border 3 Square in a Squares
two 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
two $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 18-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for the sides of Border 1
two 1-1/2" $\times 20-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for the top/bottom of Border 1

## From Fabric L cut:

one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight 3 " $\times 5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for Border 7 Flying Geese
Trim remainder of strip down to 2-5/8" x WOF. Subcut:
three 2-5/8" squares for Border 3 Square in a Squares
one $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip. Subcut:
eight $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for Border 7 Flying Geese
Trim remainder of strip down to $2-5 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF. Subcut:
three 2-5/8" squares for Border 3 Square in a Squares
four 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Then trim to:
two 1-1/2" $\times 30-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for the top/bottom of Border 4
two $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 32-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for the sides of Border 4

## From Fabric M cut:

two 5-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen 5-1/4" squares for Border 5 Flying Geese
one 4-3/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:
one 4-3/4" square for the Center Medallion
Trim the remainder of the strip to 4 " wide, then subcut
four 4" squares for the Center Medallion
one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
four 3-1/2" squares for the Center Medallion
four 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles for the Center Medallion Flying Geese fourteen $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Subcut:
one hundred ninety-two 3" squares for Border 7 flying geese
seventeen 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
two 2-1/2" $\times 20-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for Border 2
two 2-1/2" x 24-1/2" strips for Border 2
twenty $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ retangles for Border 5
sixteen 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles for Border 5
sixty-four 2-1/2" squares for Border 5
five 2-3/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:
seventy-two $2-3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares for Border 3. Cut each in half once on the diagonal two 3-3/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen 3-3/8" squares for Border 5
From Binding cut:
eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Step 1: Sew a 3-7/8" Fabric E triangle to opposite side of a 4-3/4" Fabric M square. Press seam allowances toward the triangles. Repeat on remaining sides of Fabric M square. Trim SIAS block to 6-1/2" square.


Step 2: Place a 3-1/2" Fabric F square RST at one end of a $3-1 / 2 " \times 6-1 / 2$ " Fabric A rectangle. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the square.


Sew on the marked line and trim away the excess fabric leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. Press toward triangle. Repeat on remaining side of rectangle to make a flying geese unit. The resulting block should measure 3-1/2" $\times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Repeat to make four like this.

Step 3: Repeat Step 2 with eight 3-1/2" Fabric A squares and four 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" Fabric M rectangles to make four flying geese units.


Step 4: Using the 4" Fabric $M$ and Fabric $C$ squares make a total of eight M/C HST - trim to 3-1/2" square. Repeat with Fabrics E and A 4 " squares to make a total of four E/A HST.

Step 5: Gather
one SIAS unit from Step 1
four F/A flying geese
four $A / M$ flying geese
eight M/C HSTs
four E/A HSTs
four 3-1/2" Fabric M squares
Arrange as shown, noting the orientation of the flying geese and HSTs.


Sew the units together to form the center medallion. The resulting center medallion should measure 18-1/2" square.


## Border 1

Step 6: Sew the Fabric K 1-1/2" Border 1 strips to the quilt center. Press towards borders.

## Border 2

Step 7: Sew the Fabric M 2-1/2" Border 2 strips to the quilt center. Press towards borders.


## Assemble Border 3



Step 8: Using the same method as Step 1, sew Fabric M 2-3/8" triangles to all four sides of the Fabric A-L 2-5/8" squares. Repeat to make a total of 36 SIAS blocks - 3 of each from Fabrics A-L. Arrange them following the diagram to the right and sew them to the quilt top.

## Assemble Border 4

Step 9: Sew the Fabric L 1-1/2" Border 4 strips to the quilt. Press towards borders.


## Assemble Border 5

Step 10: Using the same method as Step 1, sew Fabrics A-F, H, and L 2-7/8" triangles to all four sides of the Fabric M 3-3/8" squares. Repeat to make a total of 16 SIAS blocks -2 of each Fabric A-F, H, and L with Fabric $M$ triangles. Trim blocks to 4-1/2" square.


Step 11: Pin two 2-7/8" Fabric A squares in opposing corners of a $5-1 / 4$ " Fabric $M$ square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.

Step 12: Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.


Step 13: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.


Step 14: Place one 2-7/8" Fabric A square at the corner of sewn block unit. Draw diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 15: Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" if necessary. Repeat to make eight flying geese blocks in Fabrics A/M.


Step 16: Repeat Steps 11-15 with all remaining 5-1/4" Fabric M squares and 2-7/8" squares (Fabrics B-F, H and L) to make a total of sixty-four flying geese blocks- eight in each fabric.


Step 17: Gather:
one SIAS unit from Step 10
four matching flying geese blocks from Step 16
four 2-1/2" Fabric $M$ squares
Arrange as shown and create 2 blocks from each fabric. Finished block should measure 8-1/2" square.

Step 18: Sew a $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $M$ rectangle to the top and a
 $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle to the side of the star unit from step 17 . The block should measure 10-1/2" square. Repeat to make sixteen blocks.

Step 19: Sew blocks and remaining Fabric M 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" sashing strips together to make Border 5. Follow the diagram below for color placement.


Assemble Borders 6 \& 7

## Border 6

Step 20: Sew the 2" Fabric H Border 6 strips to the quilt. Press towards borders.

## Border 7

Step 21: Make eight flying geese, pairing $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 3$ " rectangles of each of Fabrics A-L with 3" Fabric M squares.

Sew flying geese units together into two side borders following the color layout below.


Sew flying geese units together into the top and bottom borders following the color layout below.

## Border 8

Step 22: Sew the 1-1/2" Fabric A Border 8 strips to the quilt. Press towards borders.

## Border 9

Step 23: Sew the 4" Fabric E Border 9 strips to the quilt. Press towards borders.


Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
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
