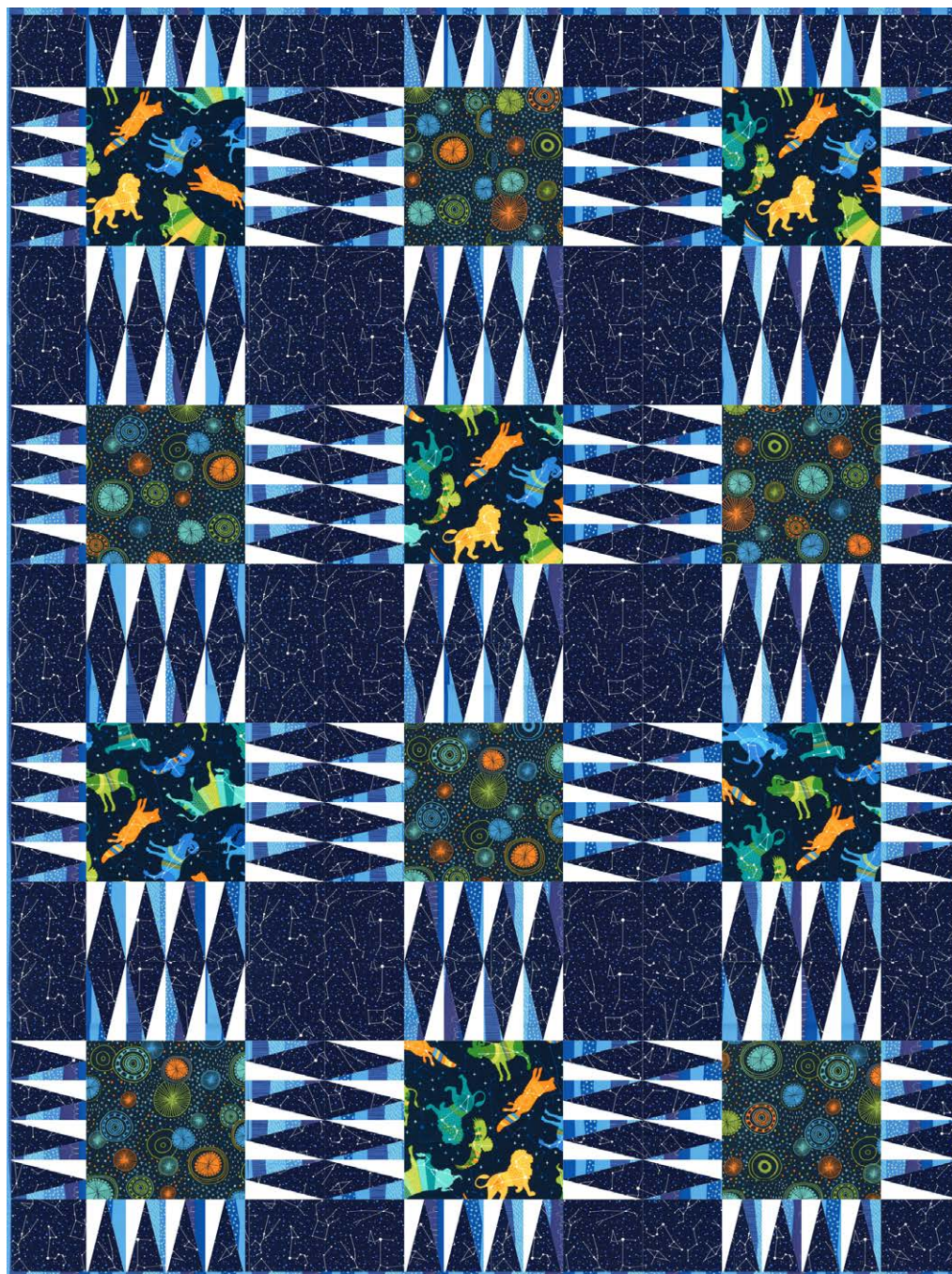

## Notes Before You Begin

- Please read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Press all seam allowances open after each seam is sewn, unless otherwise noted.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

### Printing the Templates

- Print page 7 at 100% and cut the templates out along the seam allowance line.  
You will need 16 templates per block (make 32 copies of page 7 for the entire quilt).

### Tips for accurate paper-piecing

- Place your fabric on the unprinted side of the template and sew on the printed side.
- You can transfer lines to the opposite side of the paper with a tracing wheel, or by folding and creasing your paper.
- Use a short stitch length (about a 1.5).
- Backstitch in the seam allowance at the beginning and end of each seam.
- Trim seam allowance to 1/4" after each seam and press flat with a dry iron.  
This will keep your seams crisp and your paper templates flat.

## Cutting Instructions

### Fabrics A & C

- Cut six squares 8-1/2" x 8-1/2" from each fabric.

### Fabric B

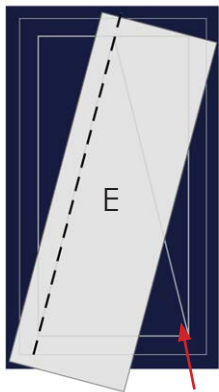
- Cut fourteen strips 5" x WOF.
  - Subcut into one hundred ninety-two rectangles 3" x 5".
- Cut six strips 4-1/2" x WOF.
  - Subcut into forty-eight squares 4-1/2" x 4-1/2".

### Fabrics D & E

- Cut ten strips 5" x WOF from each fabric.
  - Subcut into one hundred ninety-two rectangles 2" x 5".

## Assembly Instructions

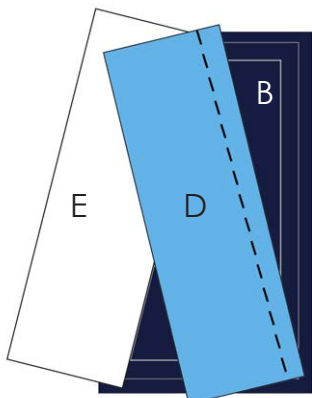
### Step 1: Paper-Piece the Templates



Fabric B with template underneath.

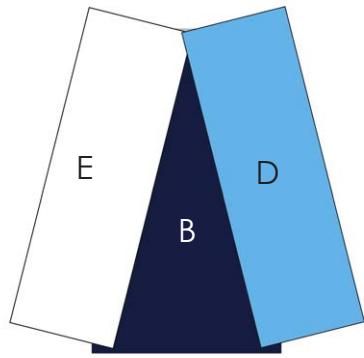
- Place a 3" x 5" Fabric B rectangle centered over the unprinted side of a template.
- Place a 2" x 5" Fabric E rectangle so that the edge is 1/4" (or slightly more) over the line between space 1 and space 2. Pin.
- Flip template over and sew along the line between space 1 and 2.
- Trim seam allowance to 1/4" and press fabric flat.

*Tip: before you sew your fabric, pin and flip it over to make sure it will completely cover the space and extend past the seam allowances.*



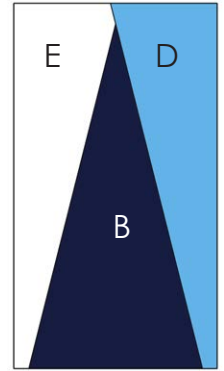
- Place a 2" x 5" Fabric D square so that the edge is 1/4" (or slightly more) over the line between space 1 and space 3. Pin.
- Flip template over and sew along the line between space 1 and 3.
- Trim seam allowance to 1/4" and press fabric flat.





- Your template should now look like the image on the left.

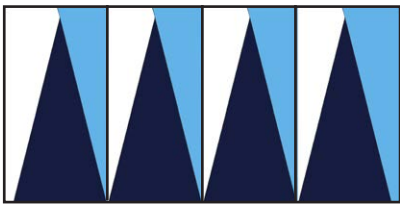
- Flip so that the paper side is up and using a ruler and rotary cutter trim fabric along the seam allowance line.



make 192

- Repeat to make sixteen triangle units for each block (one hundred ninety-two triangle units total).

## Step 2: Make Blocks



make 48

- Sew four triangle units long sides together to make a triangle strip.

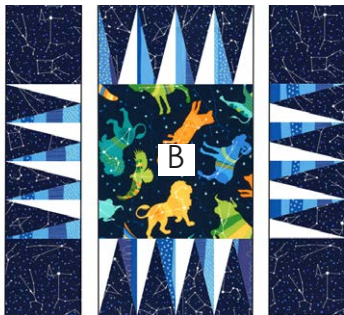
- Repeat to make forty-eight triangle strips.



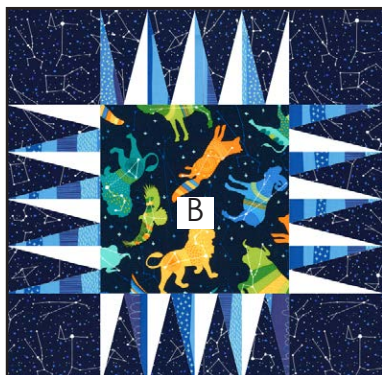
make 24

- Sew a Fabric B square to each short side of a triangle strip.

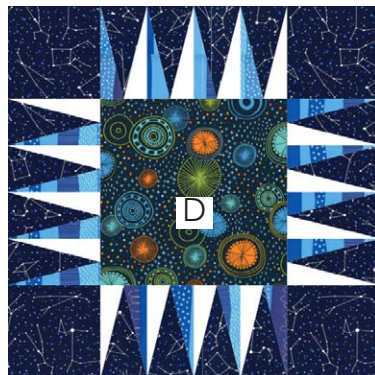
- Repeat to make twenty-four long triangle strips.



- Sew triangle strips to the top and bottom of a Fabric A square and then sew the longer triangle strips to the left and right sides of the Fabric A square.  
Finished block measures 16-1/2" x 16-1/2".

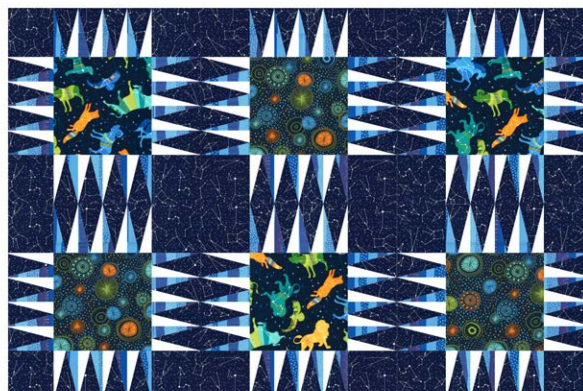
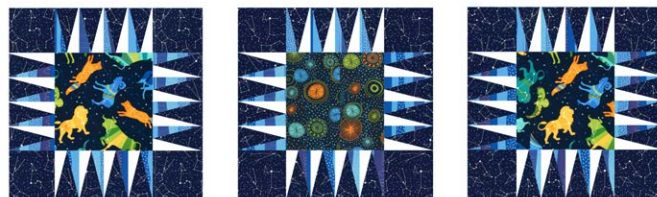


make 6

- Repeat to make a total of six Fabric A blocks.

- Make six more blocks with a Fabric C square in the middle.

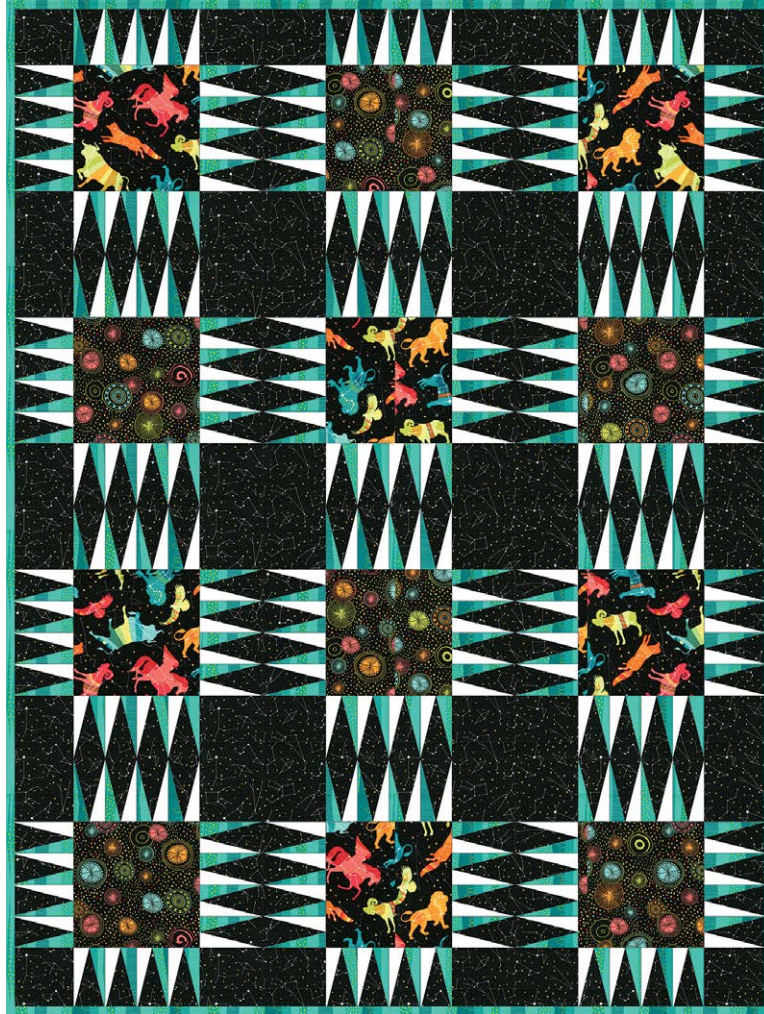
- Sew blocks together into four rows of three blocks each, alternating the A and the C blocks.
- Sew the rows together to complete quilt top.








Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, enjoy.

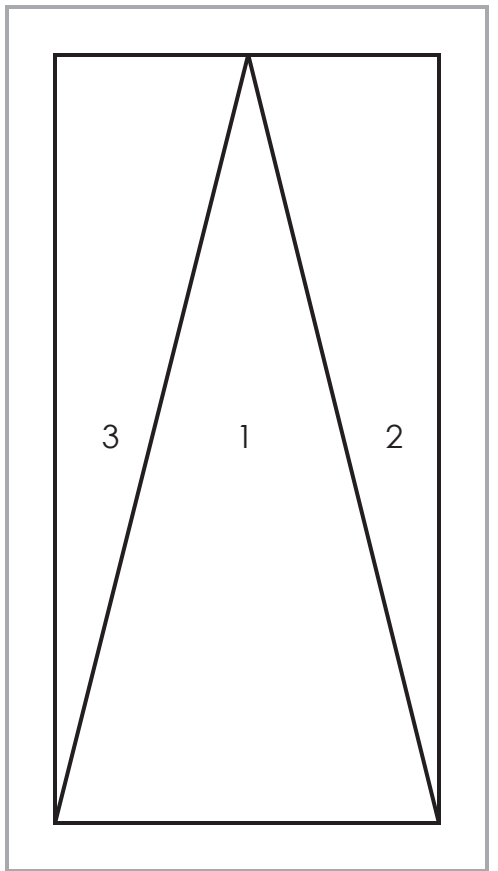
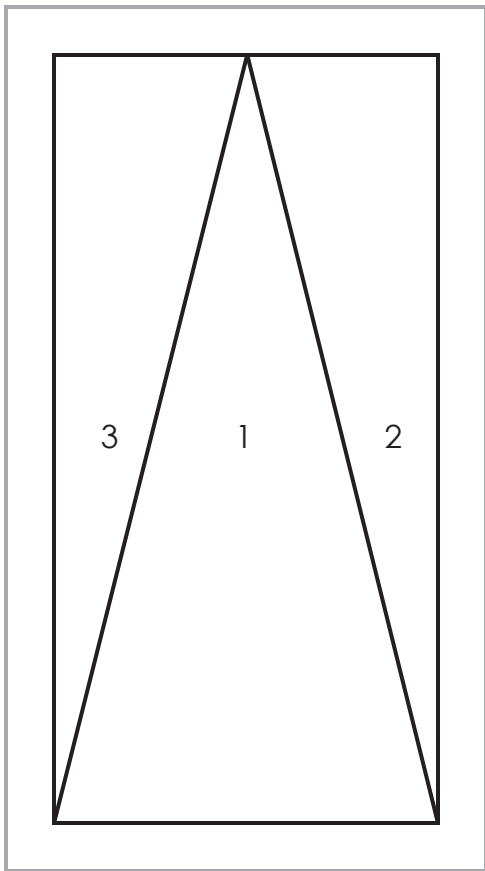
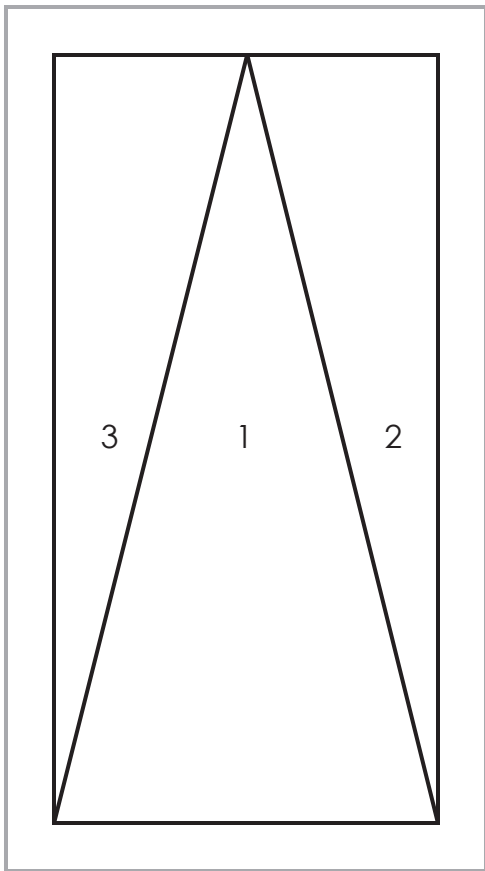
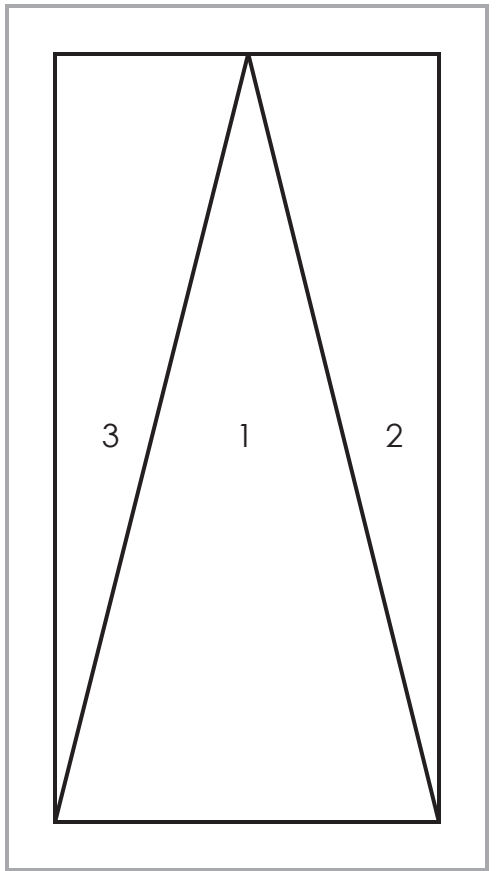
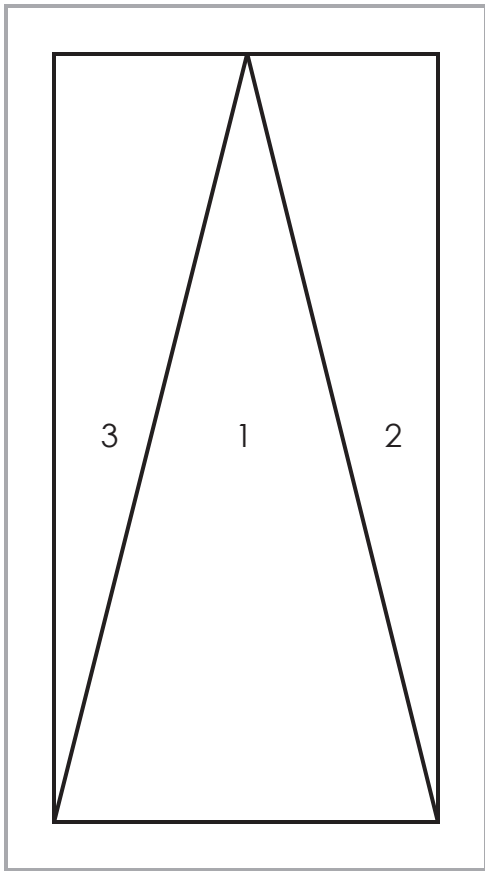
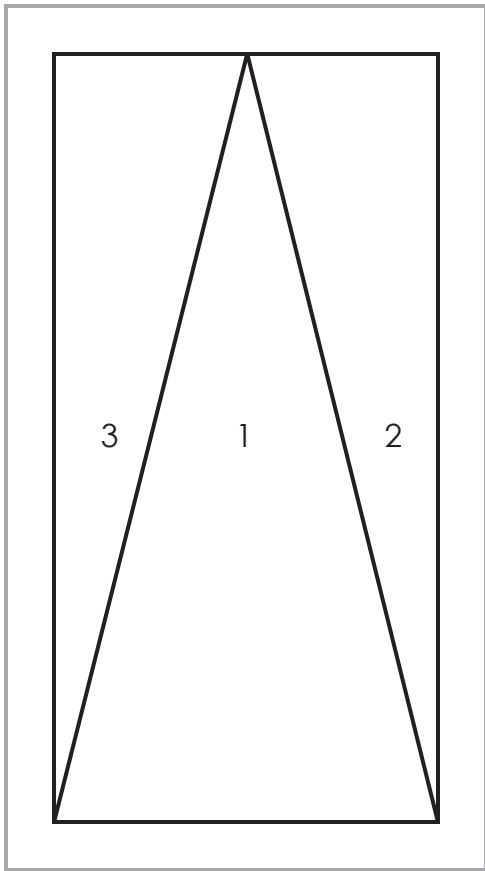
