## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4$ " unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

## From Fabric A, cut:

- three 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
- twenty 4-1/2" squares for the quilt center
- one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
- four 3-1/2" $\times 7-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangles
- four 3-1/2" $\times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangles
- two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:
- eighteen 3 " squares for the Large HSTs
- twelve 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
- one hundred four 2-1/2" squares for the Medium HSTs
- sixty-four 2-1/2" squares for the Flying Geese
- four 2-1/2" squares for the Center Unit
- twelve 2-1/2" squares for the Block 2 units

Tip: separate these cuts into stacks, labeled by their use, for easy assembly later.

- ten 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
- one hundred ninety-two 2" squares for the Small HSTs
- two 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
- two 1-1/2" $\times 14-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for the Center Unit
- two 1-1/2" $\times 16-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for the Center Unit
- four 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:
- two 1-1/2" $\times 44-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ side Border 1 strips
- two 1-1/2" $\times 38-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ top and bottom Border 1 strips
- one 1-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
- sixteen 1-1/2" squares for the Block 3 units


## From Fabric B, cut:

- one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:
- six $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares for the Large HSTs
- seven 2 " x WOF strips. Subcut:
- one hundred thirty-two 2 " squares for the Small HSTs
- Trim the remainder of the last strip to $1-1 / 2$ " wide, then subcut:
- four 1-1/2" squares for the Center Unit


## From Fabric C, cut:

- one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:
$\square$ fourteen 3 " squares for the Large HSTs
- one $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip. Subcut:
- sixteen 2-1/2" squares for the Medium HSTs
- three 2 " x WOF strips. Subcut:
- forty-four 2" squares for the Small HSTs
- five 2 " $\times$ WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:
- two 2" $\times 46-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ side Border 2 strips
- two 2 " $\times 41-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ top and bottom Border 2 strips
- five 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
- twenty-four 1-1/2" $\times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the Block 2 units
- twenty-four 1-1/2" $\times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the Block 2 units


## From Fabric D, cut:

- one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:
- six $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares for the Large HSTs
- two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
- twenty-four 2-1/2" squares for the Medium HSTs
- eight 2-1/2" squares for the Center Unit
- six 2 " $\times$ WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:
- two 2" $\times 55-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ side Border 4 strips
- two 2 " $\times 50-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ top and bottom Border 4 strips


## From Fabric E, cut:

- two 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
- four 1-1/2" $\times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for the Center Unit

From Fabric F , cut:

- six 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:
- two 4-1/2" $\times 58-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ side Border 5 strips
- two 4-1/2" $\times 58-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ top and bottom Border 5 strips
- one 3 " x WOF strip. Subcut:
- eight $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares for the Large HSTs
- one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
- sixteen 2-1/2" squares for the Medium HSTs
- two 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
- twenty-four 2" squares for the Small HSTs


## From Fabric G, cut:

- one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:
- four 3" squares for the Large HSTs


## From Fabric H , cut:

- one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:
- four 3" squares for the Large HSTs
- one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
- sixteen 2-1/2" squares for the Medium HSTs


## From Fabric I, cut:

- one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
- eight $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the Flying Geese
- Trim the remainder of the strip to 2 " wide, then subcut:
- eight 2" squares for the Small HSTs


## From Fabric J, cut:

- one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
- eight $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the Flying Geese

From Fabric K, cut:

- one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
- eight $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the Flying Geese


## From Fabric L, cut:

- one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
- eight $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the Flying Geese


## From Fabric $M$, cut:

- one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
- sixteen 2-1/2" squares for the Medium HSTs


## From Fabric N , cut:

- one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
- sixteen 2-1/2" squares for the Medium HSTs

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

- seven 2-1/2" $\times$ WOF strips


## Large HSTs

Step 1: Pair a 3" Fabric A square with a 3" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2-1/2" square. Repeat to make four A/B Large HSTs.


Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make:

## Medium HSTs

Step 3: Pair a $2-1 / 2$ " Fabric A square with a $2-1 / 2$ " Fabric $C$ square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew $1 / 4$ " away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2" square. Repeat to make thirty-two A/C Medium HSTs.


Step 4: Repeat Step 3 to make:



thirty-two A/H Medium HSTs

thirty-two A/M Medium HSTs

thirty-two A/N Medium HST

## Small HSTs

Step 5: Pair a 2" Fabric A square with a 2" Fabric C square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker
 fabric. Trim to 1-1/2" square. Repeat to make eighty-eight A/C Small HSTs.

Step 6: Repeat Step 3 to make:

two hundred sixty-four $A / B$ Small HSTs

thirty-two A/F Small HSTs

## Assemble the Flying Geese

Step 7: Place a $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A square RST at one end of a $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric L rectangle. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the square, as shown. Sew on the marked line and trim away the excess fabric, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. Press toward the triangle.


Step 8: Repeat Step 7 at the remaining end of the rectangle. The resulting flying geese block should measure $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.


Step 9: Repeat Steps 7 and 8 to make:

eight Fabric L Flying Geese

eight Fabric J Flying Geese

eight Fabric K
Flying Geese

eight Fabric I
Flying Geese

Assemble the Center Unit


Step 10: Gather:
eight Fabric D squares
four D/F HSTs
eight C/D HSTs
four C/F HSTs
eight B/C HSTs
four A/B HSTs
Arrange the units into six rows of six. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 11: Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams in opposite directions every other row.

Step 12: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the Center block.

Step 13: Sew the $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric E strips to the left and right edges of the Center Unit. Press toward the strips. Sew the 1-1/2" Fabric B squares to each end of the two remaining Fabric E strips. Press toward the strip. Sew to the top and bottom edges of the Center Unit. Press.


Step 14: Sew the $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 14-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A strips to the left and right edges of the Center Unit. Press toward the strips. Sew the $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 16-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A strips to the top and bottom edges of the Center Unit. Press toward the strips.

Step 15: Sew the large HST units together, in order, noting the orientation of the HSTs: A/F HST + A/C HST + A/G HST + A/H HST + A/H HST + A/G HST + A/C HST + A/F HST


Press. Repeat to make a total of four strips like this.

Step 16: Sew a Step 15 pieced strip to the left and right edges of the Center Unit. Press toward the center. Sew a 2-1/2" Fabric A square to each end of the two remaining Step 15 strips. Sew to the top and bottom edges of the Center Unit. Press.

The Center Unit should now measure 20-1/2" square.


## Assemble the Block 1 Units



Step 17: Gather:
four A/C Small HSTs
twelve A/B Small HSTs

Arrange the units into four rows of four. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 18: Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams in opposite directions every other row.

Step 19: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the Block 1 Unit.

The Block 1 Unit will measure 4-1/2" square. Repeat to make a total of twentytwo Block 1 Units.



Step 20: Gather:
one 2-1/2" Fabric A square
two 1-1/2" $\times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C rectangles
two $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C rectangles
Arrange the units as shown.
Step 21: Sew the $2-1 / 2$ " rectangles to the top and bottom of the Fabric A square. Press. Sew the $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles to the left and right of the Fabric $A$ square. Press.

The Block 2 Unit will measure 4-1/2" square. Repeat to make a total of twelve
 Block 2 Units.

## Assemble the Block 3 Units



Step 22: Gather:
four 1-1/2" Fabric A squares
eight A/F Small HSTs
four F/I Small HSTs
Arrange the units into four rows of four. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 23: Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams in opposite directions every other row.

Step 24: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the Block 3 Unit.

The Block 3 Unit will measure 4-1/2" square. Repeat to make a total of four Block 3 Units.


## Assemble the Block 4 Units



## Step 25: Gather:

four A/M Medium HSTs
Arrange the units into two rows of two. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 26: Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams in opposite directions.
Step 27: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

The Block 4 Unit will measure $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Repeat to make a total of:


eight Block 3 Units from Fabric $F$

eight Block 3 Units from Fabric H

eight Block 3 Units from Fabric C

twelve Block 3 Units from Fabric D

## Assemble the Flying Geese Pairs

Step 28: Sew a Fabric J and Fabric I Flying Geese unit together, along one side, as shown. Press. Repeat to make eight units like this.

Step 29: Sew a Fabric K and Fabric L Flying Geese unit together, along one side, as shown. Press. Repeat to make eight units like this.


## Assemble the Pieced Border 3 Unit

Step 30: Gather:
two Fabric M Block 4 units
two Fabric F Block 4 units
two Fabric C Block 4 units
two Fabric $N$ Block 4 units
two Fabric H Block 4 units
four Fabric D Block 4 units
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 7-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangle
Arrange the units as shown, noting the fabric placement and block orientation in the Assembly Diagram.


Step 31: Sew the units together to form a row. Press the seams to one side. Repeat to make a second unit like this. These are the side Pieced Border 3 units.

Step 32: Gather:
two Fabric M Block 4 units two Fabric F Block 4 units two Fabric C Block 4 units two Fabric N Block 4 units two Fabric H Block 4 units two Fabric D Block 4 units one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 7-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangle two $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangles

Arrange the units as shown, noting the fabric placement and block orientation in the Assembly Diagram.


Step 33: Sew the units together to form a row. Press the seams to one side. Repeat to make a second unit like this. These are the top/bottom Pieced Border 3 units.

## Assemble the Quilt



Step 34: On a floor or design wall, arrange the Center Unit, Flying Geese Blocks, Fabric A squares, Block 1, Block 2 and Block 3 units to form the Quilt Center. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 35: Sew the blocks together to form four sections: a two block by five block left and right section on either side of the Center Unit, and a 9 block by 3 block upper and lower section. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows, before nesting the seams and pressing the row seams to one side.

Step 36: Sew the side Border


Step 38: Sew the side Pieced Border 3 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Pieced Border 3 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 39: Sew the side Border 4 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 4 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 40: Sew the side Border 5 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 5 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
