Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 40" wide.

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 40" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

From Fabric A, cut:

Three 9-1/2" x WOF strips Sub cut twelve 9-1/2" square blocks

From Fabric B , cut:

Two 3-1/2" x WOF strips Sub cut twenty-six 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles Five 2" x WOF strips Sub cut twenty-six 2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric C, cut:

Fussy cut thirteen 3-1/2" girl pictures

From Fabric D, cut:

Three 2" x WOF strips, Sub cut six—2" x 21" for strip sets Five 1-1/2" x WOF strips for the inner border

From Fabric E, cut:

Six 2-1/2" x WOF strips for the outer border Six 2-1/2" x WOF strips for the binding

From each of Fabrics F-I, cut:


Three—2" x WOF strips Sub cut six 2" x 21" for strip sets

Assembling the Blocks


1. Sew the Fabric B 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles to the sides of the 3-1/2" girl pictures, keeping the words and pictures the same direction. Press toward the rectangles. Make thirteen.




2. Sew the Fabric B 2" x 6-1/2" rectangles to the top and bottom of the Step 1 units. Press toward the rectangles. Make thirteen. The blocks should measure 6-1/2" square.



 Sew six strip sets of Fabrics D, F, G and H, sewing fabrics RST along the longest side. Press the seams all one direction. At this point the strip sets should measure 6-1/2" x 21". Using three strip sets, cut into a total of twenty-six 2"x 6-1/2" units.



4. Sew 2" Fabric I strips to the top and bottom of the remaining three strip sets. Press Fabric I seams to the center of the strip set. At this point the strip sets should measure 9-1/2" x 21". Cut into twenty-six 2" x 9-1/2" units.



5. Sew the Step 3 units to the sides of the blocks. Press toward the center.



6. Sew the Step 4 units to the top and bottom of the blocks. Press toward the strip set. The block should measure 9-1/2" square.



1. Sew three pieced blocks, alternated with two girl panel blocks to make a row. Repeat to make 3 rows. Press toward the panel blocks.



2. Sew two pieced blocks, alternated with three girl panel blocks to make a row. Repeat to make a second row. Press toward the panel blocks.



- 3. Sew the Step 1 and Step 2 rows together to make the quilt top. Press the seams all one direction.
- 4. Piece the orange inner borders as needed. Measure and trim two borders the width of the quilt. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward the borders.
- 5. In the same manner, piece and sew the outer green borders to the quilt. Press toward the green borders. Your quilt top is now complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
