## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

#### From Fabric A, fussy cut:

twelve 6-1/2" x 9-1/2" blocks

#### From Fabric B, cut:

two 5" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-four **pairs** of Recs triangles two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-four **pairs** of Recs triangles three 2-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut: forty-eight 2" x 2-3/4" rectangles six 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 2" x 12-1/2" sashing strips nine 2" x 11" sashing strips

#### From each of Fabrics C-H, cut:

one 5" x WOF strip. Subcut: 4 **pairs** of Recs triangles. Trim remainder of strip down to 3-1/2" and cut 4 pairs of Rec Triangles. one 2" x WOF strip.

From Fabric I, cut: five 5" x WOF strips for the outer border

#### From the Binding Fabric, cut:

250" of 1-1/4" wide single fold bias binding

## Assembling the Blocks

**Step 1** Match an 5" light triangle with a 5" dark triangle as shown. Place right sides together, using the "magic angle" to align the top and bottom corners of the triangles. Sew. Repeat to make two pairs of units.





**Step 2** Press two of each color unit from Step 1 as shown.

**Step 3** Repeat Steps 2 and 3 for the 3-1/2" triangles.



**Step 5** Sew the larger units from Step 4 to both sides of the girl blocks from Fabric A. Press toward the girls. Repeat for all 12 blocks.



**Step 4** Join the triangles into pairs as shown. Press the seam open.





**Step 6** Sew 2" x 2-3/4" rectangles to both ends of the remaining units. Press toward the rectangles.

**Step 7** With matching 2" squares, sew on the diagonal of each corner of the light rectangles as shown. Trim away excess fabric and press toward the triangle.





**Step 8** Sew matching units from Step 7 onto each of the girl blocks. Press toward the girl blocks. At this point the blocks should measure 11" x 12-1/2".

## Assembling the Quilt



**Step 1** Arrange the blocks in four rows of three blocks. Sew the 2" x 12-1/2" light sashing strips between the blocks in each row. Press toward the sashing strips.

**Step 2** Make three horizontal sashing rows with the 2" print squares as cornerstones. Press toward the sashing.

**Step 3** Sew the block rows and the sashing rows together. Press toward the sashing.

**Step 4** Measure the quilt width, then trim two yellow borders to this length. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward the borders.

**Step 5** Measure the quilt length, including borders. Piece, then trim two borders to this length. Sew to the sides of the quilt. Press toward the borders.

### Finishing the Quilt

**Step 1** Mark the scalloped edge.

**Step 2** Create a backing at least 4" larger than the quilt top. Layer the backing, batting and quilt top. Baste, then quilt as desired.

**Step 3** After quilting, hand or machine baste on the marked scallop line to hold the layers together.

**Step 4** Join the 1-1/4" wide bias binding strips with diagonal seams pressed open. Sew the binding to the quilt, matching the edge of the binding to the marked line on the quilt edge. Pivot at the "V" with the needle down and presser foot up.

**Step 5** Trim the excess batting and backing, then turn the binding to the back side, turn under 1/4" and stitch down by hand with matching thread. In the "V", fold a pleat in.

Your quilt is complete. Sign, date and enjoy!
