

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

eight 2-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred twenty 2-3/4" squares fifteen 3-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred eighty 3-1/4" squares. Mark one diagonal line on the back of each square.

From Fabric B, cut:

eighteen 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: From six strips, cut a total of: twenty-four 2" x 9-1/2" block sashing strips Sew the remaining strips together, end-to-end, and trim to yield: seven 2" x 51-1/2" horizontal sashing strips two 2" x 65" side sashing strips

From each of Fabrics C-Y, cut:


one 3-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut: six 3-1/4" squares Select scraps from seven assorted fabrics (from C-Y) and from each of the seven cut: six 3-1/4" squares You will have a total of thirty sets of six squares.

From the binding fabric, cut:


seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Blocks


Step 1: Pair a 3-1/4" Fabric A square with a 3-1/4" Fabric C square. Sew along both sides of the marked line, 1/4" away. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press away from Fabric A. Trim to 2-3/4" if necessary. Repeat with all remaining Fabric A squares and C-Y squares. Stack matching sets of HSTs in sets of twelve.




Sew 1/4" away from marked line on both sides.



Cut along marked line. Press away from Fabric A.




Step 2: Gather one set of twelve matching HSTs and four 2-3/4" Fabric A squares. Arrange following the Block Assembly Diagram into four rows of four squares each, taking care to rotate the HSTs correctly. Sew the squares together to form rows. Press the seams to the left in odd numbered rows and to the right in even numbered rows. Press the rows together to form the block and press the row seams open to complete one 9-1/2" square block.



Step 3: Repeat Step 2 with all remaining sets of HSTs to make a total of thirty blocks.


Assemble the Quilt



Step 4: Arrange the blocks in a layout of six rows of five blocks each, rearranging until you have a pleasing balance of color in the prints.

Step 5: Gather a row of five blocks and four 2" x 9-1/2" block sashing strips. Alternateing blocks and sashing strips, sew together. Start and end each row with a block and press all seams toward the sashing. Repeat to create six rows.

Step 6: Sew a 51-1/2" horizontal sashing strip to the top of each row, pressing the seam toward the sashing. Sew the rows together to form the quilt top. Sew the remaining horizontal sashing strip to the bottom of the quilt and press toward the sashing.



Step 7: Sew a 65" side sashing strip to each side of the quilt, pressing the seam toward the sashing.

Your quilt top is now complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
