




Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, fussy cut:

four 15-1/2" x 19-1/2" rectangles with the motifs centered in the middle of each rectangle

From each of Fabrics B and C, cut:

four 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

four 2" x 19-1/2" rectangles of each fabric

four 2" x 18-1/2" rectangles of each fabric

From Fabric D, cut:

one 4-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

six 4-1/2" squares

From each of Fabrics E-H, cut:

one 6-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

one 6-1/2" x 7-1/2" rectangle of each fabric

one 5-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangle of each fabric

From Fabric I, cut:

one 1-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

eight 1-1/2" x 1-1/2" squares

six 1" x 1-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric J, cut:

three 6-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end, then subcut:

two 6-1/2" x 46-1/2" side border strips

Trim the remainder of the strip to 4", then subcut:

six 4" x 4-1/2" rectangles

four 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

one 2-1/2" x 38-1/2" sashing strip

two 2-1/2" x 22-1/2" sashing strips

eight 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles

two 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

thirty-two 2" squares

ten 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twelve 1-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles

eight 1-1/2" x 4" rectangles

eight 1-1/2" x 3" rectangles

twenty-four 1-1/2" squares

Sew the five remaining strips together end-to-end, then subcut:

four 1-1/2" x 50-1/2" border strips

one 1" x WOF strip. Subcut:

twelve 1" x 2" rectangles

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Center Blocks

Step 1: Sew two 2" x 19-1/2" Fabric B rectangles to the sides of one Fabric A rectangle. Press. Sew two 2" x 18-1/2" Fabric B rectangles to the top and bottom edges of the unit. Press.

Repeat to make a second block.



Step 2: Sew two 2" x 19-1/2" Fabric C rectangles to the sides of one Fabric A rectangle. Press. Sew two 2" x 18-1/2" Fabric C rectangles to the top and bottom edges of the unit. Press.

Repeat to make a second block.



Assemble the Pumpkin Blocks

Step 3: Place a 1-1/2" Fabric J square on each corner of a Fabric D square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each square as shown. Sew on the marked lines, then cut 1/4" away from the sewn seam. Press to create the pumpkin unit.



Sew a 1" x 1-1/2" Fabric I rectangle between two 1" x 2" Fabric J rectangles, then press to create a stem unit.



Sew a 4" x 4-1/2" Fabric J rectangle, the stem unit, and the pumpkin unit together as shown. Press to complete a Small Pumpkin Block.



Repeat to make six Small Pumpkin Blocks.

Step 4: Place a 2" Fabric J square on each corner of the 6-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric E rectangle, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each square as shown. Sew on the marked lines, then cut 1/4" away from the sewn seam. Press to create the pumpkin unit.



Sew a 1-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric I square between two 1-1/2" x 4" Fabric J rectangles, then press to create a stem unit.



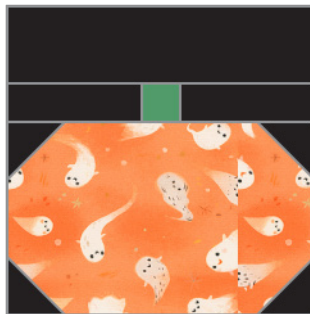
Sew a 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric J rectangle, the stem unit, and the pumpkin unit together as shown. Press to complete the Fabric E Medium Pumpkin Block.



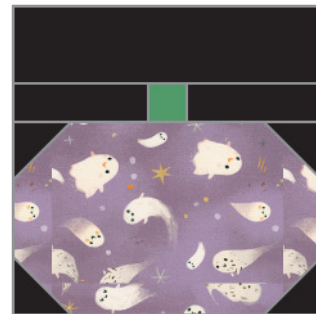
Repeat to make three additional Medium Pumpkin Blocks in the fabrics shown.

Step 5: Place a 2" Fabric J square on each corner of the 6-1/2" x 7-1/2" Fabric F rectangle, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each square as shown. Sew on the marked lines, then cut 1/4" away from the sewn seam. Press to create the pumpkin unit.



Sew a 1-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric I square between two 1-1/2" x 4" Fabric J rectangles, then press to create a stem unit.



Sew a 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric J rectangle, the stem unit, and the pumpkin unit together as shown. Press to complete the Fabric F Large Pumpkin Block.



Repeat to make three additional Large Pumpkin Blocks in the fabrics shown.

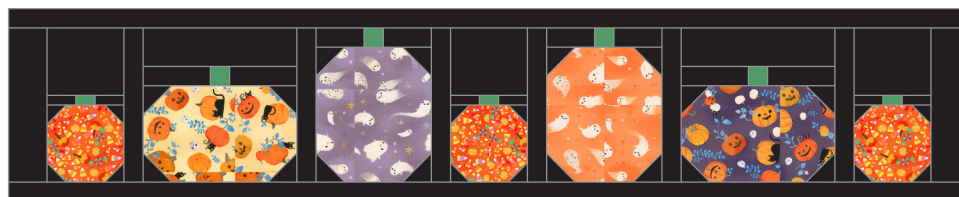
Assemble the Borders

Step 6: Arrange the seven Pumpkin Blocks in a row as shown. Place a 1-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric J rectangle between each of the blocks. Place a 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric J rectangle on each end of the row.

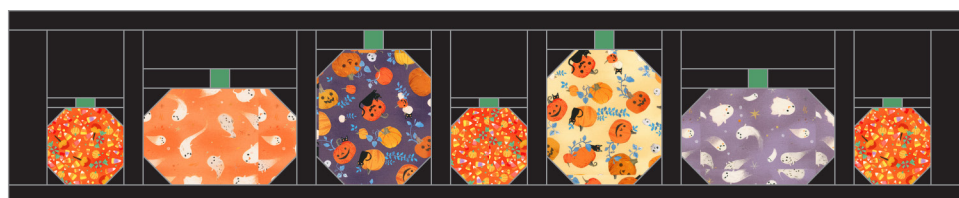
Sew the row together, then press.

Sew a 1-1/2" x 50-1/2" Fabric J border strip to the top and bottom of the border. Press to complete the top border.

Repeat to make the bottom border.



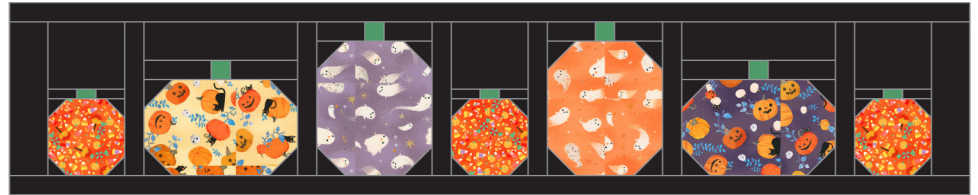
Top Border



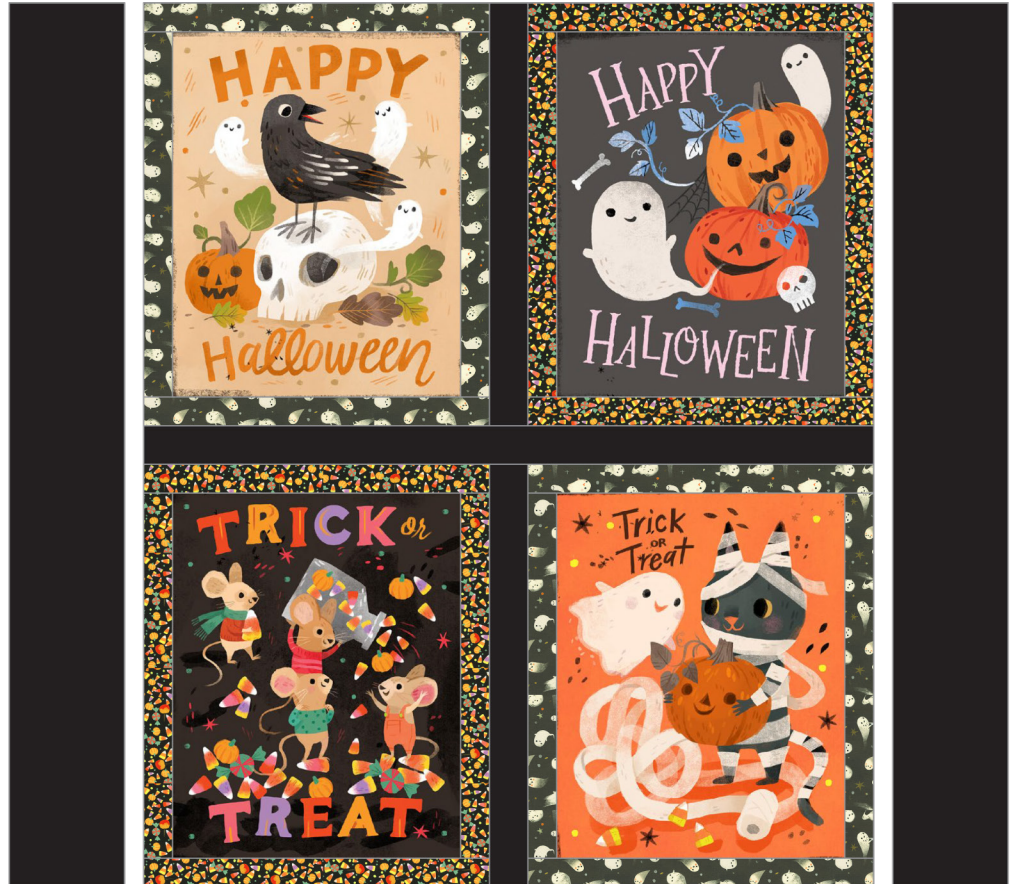
Bottom Border

Assemble the Quilt

Step 7: Arrange the blocks into two rows of two Center Blocks. Place a 2-1/2" x 22-1/2" sashing rectangle in between the two blocks in a row. Sew the blocks and sashing rectangles together to form a row. Press.



Step 8: Place the 2-1/2" x 38-1/2" sashing strip in between the two rows. Sew the rows and sashing strip together to form the quilt center. Press.



Step 9: Sew the side borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!
