

## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 40" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

# **Cutting Instructions**

#### From **Fabric A**, cut:

- thirty-two triangles from Template E
- one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut four 5-1/2" squares. Cut each in half along the diagonal,

creating eight triangles.

- four of Template A and four of Template B
- eight of Template F

Stack all Fabric A pieces in the "Warm Blocks" stack.

#### From **Fabric B**, cut:

- sixteen triangles from Template E
- one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut four 5-1/2" squares. Cut each in half along the diagonal, creating eight triangles.

Stack all Fabric B pieces in the "Black Blocks" stack.

#### From **Fabric C**, cut:

- thirty-two triangles from Template E
- one 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut four 5-1/2" squares. Cut each in half along the diagonal, creating eight triangles.
- four of Template A and four of Template B
- eight of Template F

Stack all Fabric C pieces in the "Cool Blocks" stack.

#### From **Fabric D**, cut:

- sixteen triangles from Template E
- four of Template A and four of Template B
- eight of Template F

Stack all Fabric D pieces in the "Black Blocks" stack.

#### From each of Fabrics E-G, cut:

eight 3" squares, four of Template A and four of Template B.

#### From each of **Fabrics H-M**, cut:

eight 3" x 5-1/2" rectangles, four of Template A and four of Template B.

#### From each of Fabrics N-S, cut:

eight 3" x 8" rectangles

#### From each of **Fabrics T-Y**, cut:

eight 3" x 5-1/2" rectangles

#### From each of **Fabrics Z-BB**, cut:


eight 3" x 5-1/2" rectangles, four of Template C and four of Template D.

#### From Fabric CC, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

#### Construct the Block


Separate cut fabrics in piles for Warm, Cool and Black. Refer to the Quilt Assembly Diagram, if needed.



Gather pieces to make one Warm Block. It is recommended that you make one complete block to become familiar with the construction, before moving on to assembly line sew the remaining blocks for that color grouping.

Referring to the block diagram, piece the block in sections, beginning with Section 1. Sew 1A to 1B, then 1AB to 1C and so on. Complete each numbered section, then sew Section 1 to Section 2, Section 3 to Section 4, then sew Section 1/2 to Section 3/4. Sew Section 5 on to the block. Finally, sew the Template E triangles to the four corners. Press all seams to one side as you sew.

Make eight Warm Blocks (four will be a mirror image).




Repeat this process to make eight Cool Blocks.

For the Black Blocks, note that Fabrics B and D are both used in the block for the grays- one

along the top of the block, the other along the bottom.

Carefully lay out these blocks before sewing any pieces together to confirm that you have the fabrics in the correct position.



### Assemble the Quilt



Quilt Assembly Diagram

Create two rows of four blocks each for each color grouping. Refer to the Quilt Assembly Diagram for correct orientation of the blocks.

Sew blocks together, pressing seams to the left in odd numbered rows and to the right in even numbered rows.

Sew the rows together, pressing seams open.

Your quilt is now complete. Baste, bind, quilt and enjoy!
