
# **RIPPLES**

# Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

# Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

# **Cutting Instructions**

#### From each of Fabrics A and B, fussy cut:

one 39" square. Cut the square in half, then cut this piece in half again for two 19-1/2" squares

From the remaining half of the square, cut:

three 10" squares

#### From Fabric C, cut:

thirteen 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: two 1-1/2" x 41-1/2" strips three 1-1/2" x 39-1/2" strips two 1-1/2" x 19-1/2" strips twelve 1-1/2" x 10" strips twelve 1-1/2" x 12" strips

#### From Fabric D, cut:

one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut: five 4" squares for the HSTs four 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: four 3-1/2" x 30" strips four 3-1/2" x 2-1/4" rectangles

#### From Fabric E, cut:

one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut: five 4" squares for the HSTs one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: eight 3-1/2" squares

#### From Fabric F, cut:

four 6-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: four 6-1/2" x 30" strips two 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles four 4-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut: four 4-3/4" x 30" strips one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

four 4" squares for the HSTs

Trim the remainder of the strip to 3-1/2" wide, then subcut:

six 3-1/2" squares

seven 3" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 3" x 68" top/bottom outer borders

two 3" x 73" side outer borders

three 2-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two 2-1/4" x 18" strips two 2-1/4" x 12" strips

six 2-1/4" x 4-3/4" rectangles

two 1-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two 1-3/4" x 12-1/2" strips

two 1-3/4" x 13-3/4" strips

#### From the Binding Fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

# Assemble the Half-Square Triangles

**Step 1:** Pair a 4" Fabric D square with a 4" Fabric F square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Repeat to make four D/F HSTs.



**Step 2:** Repeat Step 1 to make:







six D/E HSTs

# Assemble the Corner Blocks

Step 3: Gather:
three Fabric F squares
four Fabric E squares
three D/E HSTs
two D/F HSTs
two E/F HSTs
one 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" Fabric F rectangle





Arrange in five columns, as shown, noting the orientation of the HSTs. Sew the units together to form columns, pressing the seams in opposite directions every other column. Sew the columns together, pressing the seams to one side. Sew a 1-3/4" x 12-1/2" Fabric F strip to the top and a 1-3/4" x 13-3/4" Fabric F strip to the left edge. The resulting block should measure 13-3/4" square. Repeat to make a second corner block.

#### Assemble the Basic Blocks

Step 4: Gather:

one 10" Fabric A square two 1-1/2" x 10" Fabric C strips two 1-1/2" x 12" Fabric C strips

Sew the 10" strips to the left and right edges of the square. Press toward the strips. Sew the 12" strips to the top and bottom edges of the square. Press toward the strips. The resulting block should measure 12" square.

Repeat Step 4 with all 10" Fabric A and B square to create six Basic Blocks.






# Assemble the Quilt Center

**Step 5:** Sew a 1-1/2" x 19-1/2" Fabric C strip between 19-1/2" Fabric A and Fabric B squares. Press. Repeat to make a second unit like this.

**Step 6:** Sew a 1-1/2" x 39-1/2" Fabric C strip between the two units from Step 5. Press. Sew a 1-1/2" x 39-1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press. Sew a 1-1/2" x 41-1/2" Fabric C strip to the sides of the quilt center. Press.



# Assemble the Quilt

**Step 7:** Gather:

one 2-1/4" x 12" Fabric F rectangle

one Fabric B Basic Block


one 4-3/4" x 30" Fabric F strip

one 3-1/2" x 30" Fabric D strip

one 6-1/2" x 30" Fabric F strip

Arrange as shown on the following page and sew to form the right side pieced border. Press. Sew to the right edge of the quilt center. Press.

**Step 8:** Repeat Step 7, using a Fabric A Basic Block this time, to create the left pieced border. Sew to the left edge of the quilt center. Press.



### Step 9: Gather:

three 2-1/4" x 4-3/4" Fabric F rectangles

two 2-1/4" x 3-1/2" Fabric D rectangles

one 2-1/4" x 18" Fabric F strip

one Fabric B Basic Block

one Fabric A Basic Block

one 4-3/4" x 30" Fabric F strip one 3-1/2" x 30" Fabric D strip

one 6-1/2" x 30" Fabric F strip

one Corner Block

Arrange as shown and sew together in sections to form the top pieced border. Press. Sew to the top edge of the quilt center. Press.

**Step 10:** Repeat Step 9 to create the bottom pieced border. Sew to the bottom edge of the quilt center. Press.

**Step 11:** Sew the top and bottom outer border pieces to the quilt. Press toward the borders. Sew the side outer border pieces to the sides of the quilt. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
