## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4$ " unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## From Fabric A, cut:

nine 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one hundred twenty 3 " squares for the HSTs
fourteen $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Subcut:
ninety-six 2-1/2" $\times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
forty-eight 2-1/2" squares
From Fabric B, cut:
two 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twelve 4-1/2" squares for the block centers
From Fabric C, cut:
four 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty-eight 3 " squares for the HSTs
From Fabric D , cut:
three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty-eight 2-1/2" squares
six 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end to end, then trim:
two 1-1/2" x 54-1/2" top/bottom Border 2 pieces
two $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 68-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ side Border 2 pieces

## From Fabric E, cut:

seven 4 " $\times$ WOF strips. Sew together, end to end, then trim:
two 4 " $\times 61-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ top/bottom Border 3 pieces
two 4" x 70-1/2" side Border 3 pieces
three 3 " x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty-six $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares for the HSTs
two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twelve 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles

## From Fabric F, cut:

three 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty-six $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares for the HSTs
two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twelve 2-1/2" $\times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
From Fabric G, cut:
one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:
twelve 3 " squares for the HSTs
From Fabric H , cut:
three 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty-six $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares for the HSTs
two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twelve 2-1/2" $\times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles

## From Fabric I, cut:

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:
twelve 3" squares for the HSTs

## From Fabric J, cut:

three 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty-six $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares for the HSTs
two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twelve 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles
From Fabric $K$, cut:
six 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end to end, then trim:
two 2-1/2" x 52-1/2" top/bottom Border 1 pieces
two 2-1/2" x 64-1/2" side Border 1 pieces
From the Binding Fabric, cut:
eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 3" Fabric A square with a 3" Fabric C square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew $1 / 4 "$ away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2-1/2" square. Repeat to make forty-eight A/C HSTs.

Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make:

forty-eight
A/E HSTs
twenty-four C/E HSTs

forty-eight
A/F HSTs

twenty-four C/F HSTs

forty-eight A/H HSTs

twenty-four G/H HSTs

forty-eight

twenty-four
I/J HSTs


Step 3: Gather:
eight $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangles four $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric E rectangles
four 2-1/2" Fabric A squares
one Fabric B square
four Fabric D squares
four A/C HSTs
eight C/E HSTs
sixteen A/E HSTs
Arrange the units into rows, as shown. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 4: Sew the indicated HSTs together in pairs, as shown. Press. This will aid in piecing the rows in Step 5.

Step 5: Sew the units together to form the rows. Press the seams in opposite directions every other row.

Step 6: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

The resulting block should measure 16-1/2" square. Repeat to make three blocks like this.
Repeat to make three of each block style, using the fabric placements shown here:


Step 7: Arrange the blocks into four rows of three blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 8: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 9: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Step 10: Sew the side Border 1 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 1 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.


Step 11: Sew the side Border 2 pieces to the sides of the quilt center.
Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 2 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 12: Sew the side Border 3 pieces to the sides of the quilt center.
Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 3 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
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
