


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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

From Fabric A, cut:

two 5" x WOF strips. Subcut: twelve 5" squares.

From Fabric B, cut:

seven 1-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-four 1-1/4" x 6-1/2" rectangles. twenty-four 1-1/4" x 5" rectangles.

From Fabric C, cut:

eight 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, then subcut: two 3-1/2" x 84-1/2" side inner borders. two 3-1/2" x 72-1/2" top/bottom inner borders.

ten 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-four 1-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles. twenty-four 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles.

From Fabric D, cut:

eight 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: fourteen 3-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles. eighteen 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles. four 3-1/2" squares.

fourteen 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-four 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles. twenty-four 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles.

From Fabric E, cut:

four 6-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 6-1/2" squares.

From Fabric F, cut:

fourteen 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: one-hundred and sixty 3-1/2" squares.

From Fabric G, cut:

six 12-1/2" x <u>LOF</u> strips. Subcut: thirty-one 12-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles.

From Fabric H, cut:

nine 8-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, then subcut: two 8-1/2" x 90-1/2" side outer borders. two 8-1/2" x 88-1/2" top/bottom borders.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

eleven 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

Assemble the Courthouse Step Blocks

Step 1: Sew a 5" Fabric A square between two 1-1/4" x 5" Fabric B rectangles as shown. Press towards the outer edges.

Step 2: Sew a 1-1/4" x 6-1/2" Fabric B rectangle to the top and bottom edges of the unit. Press towards the outer edges.

Step 3: Sew the unit between two 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" Fabric C rectangles as shown. Press towards the outer edges.

Step 4: Sew a 1-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric C rectangle to the top and bottom edges of the unit. Press towards the outer edges.

Step 5: Sew the unit between two 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric D rectangles as shown. Press towards the outer edges.

Step 6: Sew a 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" Fabric D rectangle to the top and bottom edges of the unit. Press towards the outer edges.

Step 7: Repeat Steps 1-6 to make twelve Courthouse Step Blocks.

Assemble the Sashing Blocks

Step 8: Place a 3-1/2" Fabric F square on two opposite corners of a 12-1/2" x 6-1/2" Fabric G rectangle, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each square, then sew on the marked lines. Trim the excess fabric 1/4" away from the sewn seams. Press towards the corners.

Step 9: Repeat Step 8 using two additional 3-1/2" Fabric F squares on the remaining corners of the unit.

Step 10: Repeat Steps 8-9 to make thirty-one Sashing Blocks.


















Assemble the Pieced Borders

Step 11: Place a 3-1/2" Fabric F square on one corner of a 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" Fabric D rectangle, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the square, then sew on the marked line. Trim the excess fabric 1/4" away from the sewn seam. Press towards the corner.

Step 12: Repeat Step 11 using an additional 3-1/2" Fabric F squares on an adjacent corner of the unit.

Step 13: Repeat Steps 11-12 to make eighteen Pieced Border Blocks.

Step 14: Arrange two 3-1/2" Fabric D squares, four Pieced Border Blocks, and three 3-1/2" x 12-1/2" Fabric D rectangles in a row as shown. Sew the row together, then press away from the blocks. Repeat to make a second top/bottom pieced border.



Step 15: Arrange five Pieced Border Blocks and four 3-1/2" x 12-1/2" Fabric D rectangles in a rows as shown. Sew the row together, then press away from the blocks. Repeat to make a second side pieced border.



Assemble the Quilt Center

Step 16: Arrange the Courthouse Step Blocks, Sashing Blocks, and 6-1/2" Fabric E squares in nine rows of seven as shown.

Step #: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the seams to the left in the odd-numbered rows and to the right in the even-numbered rows.


Step 17: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.











Finish the Quilt Top



Step 18: Sew the side pieced borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom pieced borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 19: Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 20: Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!

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
