

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Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From each of Fabrics A-D, cut:

two 9-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut: five 9-1/4" squares for the large flying geese Trim the remainder of the second strip to 5-1/4" wide, then cut: five 5-1/4" squares for the small flying geese
three 4-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 4-7/8" squares for the small flying geese
three 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-five 4-1/2" squares
two 2-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 2-7/8" squares for the small flying geese
two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 2-7/8" squares for the small flying geese

From Fabric E, cut:

fifteen 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew seven strips together, end-to-end, then trim: four 1-1/2" x 67-1/2" row sashing strips From the remaining eight strips, cut: fifteen 1-1/2" x 16-1/2" block sashing strips

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Small Flying Geese

Step 1: Pin two 2-7/8" Fabric A squares in opposing corners of a 5-1/4" Fabric B square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.





Step 2: Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 3: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.





Step 4: Place one 2-7/8" Fabric A square at the corner of sewn block unit. Draw diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 5: Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" if necessary. Repeat to make four flying geese blocks.



Step 6: Repeat with all remaining 2-7/8" Fabric A-D squares and 5-1/4" Fabric A-D squares to make a total of:



twenty A/B small flying geese



twenty C/D small flying geese



twenty D/A small flying geese




twenty B/C small flying geese

Assemble the Large Flying Geese

Step 7: Pin two 4-7/8" Fabric A squares in opposing corners of a 9-1/4" Fabric B square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.





Step 8: Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 9: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.





Step 10: Place one 4-7/8" Fabric A square at the corner of sewn block unit. Draw diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 11: Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" if necessary. Repeat to make four flying geese blocks.



Step 12: Repeat with all remaining 4-7/8" Fabric A-D squares and 9-1/4" Fabric A-D squares to make a total of:



twenty A/B large flying geese



twenty C/D large flying geese



twenty D/A large flying geese



twenty B/C large flying geese

Assemble the A Blocks

Step 13: Gather: one 4-1/2" Fabric A square four A/B small flying geese four 2-1/2" Fabric B squares

Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 14: Sew the units together to form the rows. Press the seams away from the flying geese units.

Step 15: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block center.





Step 16: Gather: the complete block center from Step 15 four 4-1/2" Fabric C squares four B/C large flying geese

Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 17: Sew the units together to form the rows. Press the seams away from the flying geese units.

Step 18: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block center.

The resulting block will measure 16-1/2" square. Repeat Steps 13-18 to make four A Blocks.

Assemble the B Blocks

Step 19: Repeat the process in Steps 13-18 to make four B Blocks, referring to the Block Assembly Diagram for fabric placement.



Assemble the C Blocks

Step 20: Repeat the process in Steps 13-18 to make four C Blocks, referring to the Block Assembly Diagram for fabric placement.



Assemble the D Blocks

Step 21: Repeat the process in Steps 13-18 to make four D Blocks, referring to the Block Assembly Diagram for fabric placement.



Assemble the Quilt



Step 22: Arrange the A-D Blocks together as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew each row together, using sashing strips between each block. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make five block rows.

Step 23: Sew the sashing and block rows together, pinning and nesting the seams. Press seams open or to the sashing.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
