Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4 unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 40" wide.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!
- Half-square triangle has been abbreviated to HST.

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Cutting Instructions

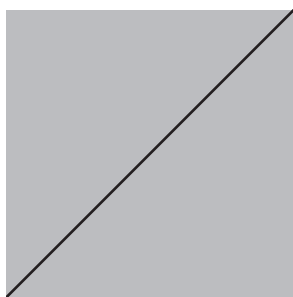
Fabric A

Cut two strips 10" x WOF, sub cut eight squares on point at 7" x 7", the stripes should run diagonally from corner to corner.

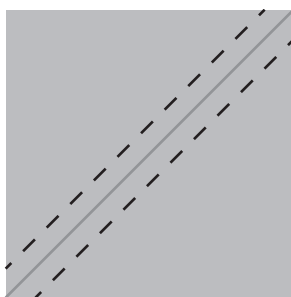
Fabric B

Cut two strips 7" x WOF, sub cut eight squares 7" x 7".
Cut three strips 2-1/4" x WOF for binding.

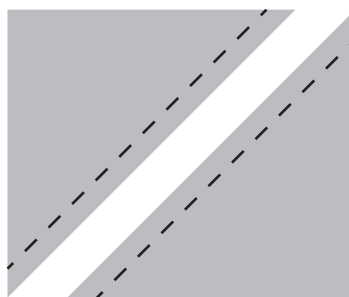
Assembly



Mark diagonally on
wrong side



Stitch 1/4" from
marked line



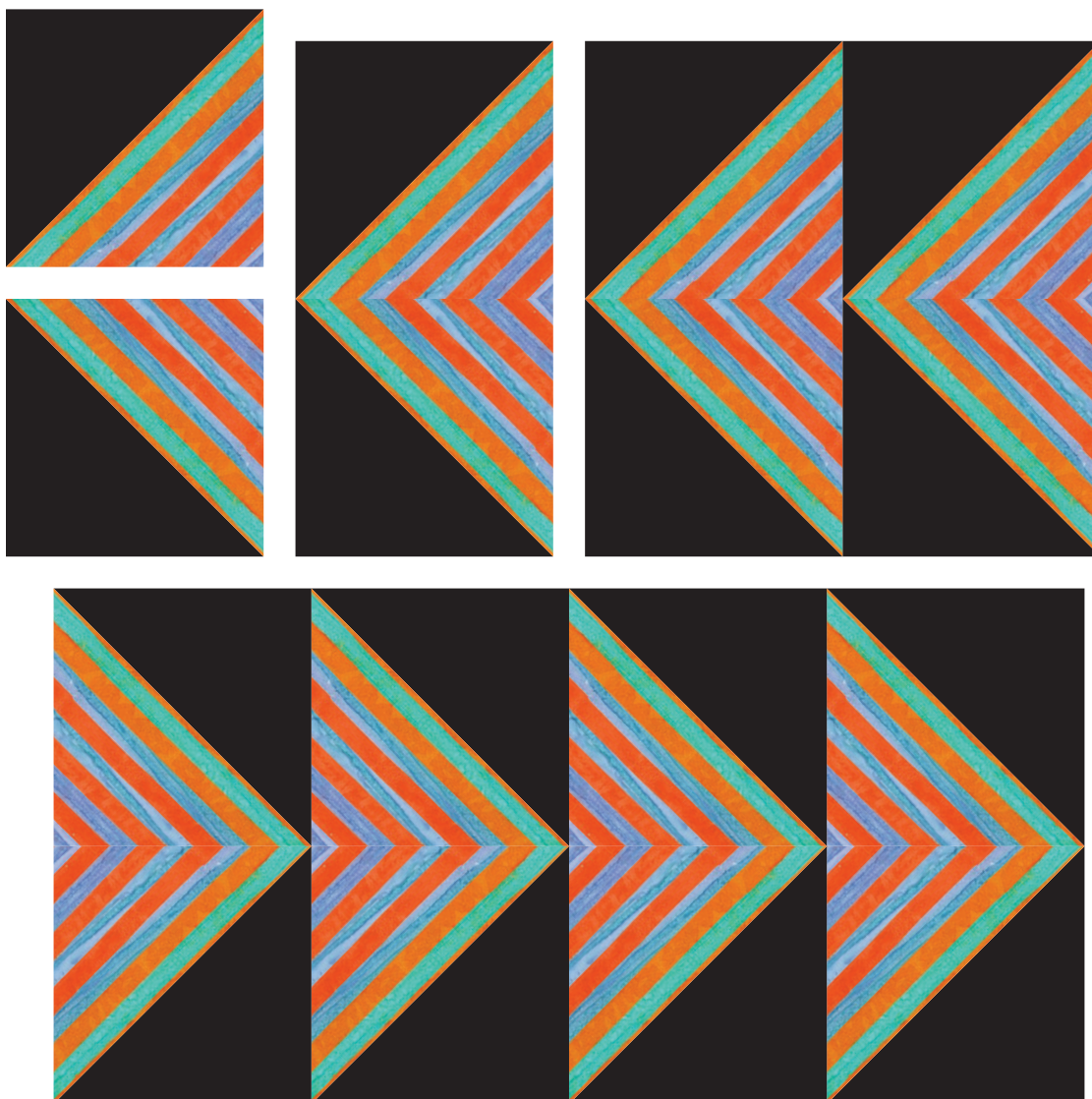
Cut apart on marked line



Open for two HSTs

Place a Fabric A square right sides together with a Fabric B square. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner. Sew 1/4" from each side of the marked line, then cut along the marked line, making two HST blocks at once.

Repeat with all eight pairs to make sixteen HSTs. Trim each HST to 6-1/2" square. Sew them together, following the layout in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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Cutting Instructions

Fabric A

Cut six strips 2-5/8" x WOF.

- Sub cut eight A pieces 2-5/8" x 5-3/4".
- Sub cut twenty-eight B pieces 2-5/8" x 8-1/8".

Fabric B

Cut six strips 2-5/8" x WOF.

- Sub cut eight C pieces 2-5/8" x 5-3/4".
- Sub cut twenty-eight D pieces 2-5/8" x 8-1/8".

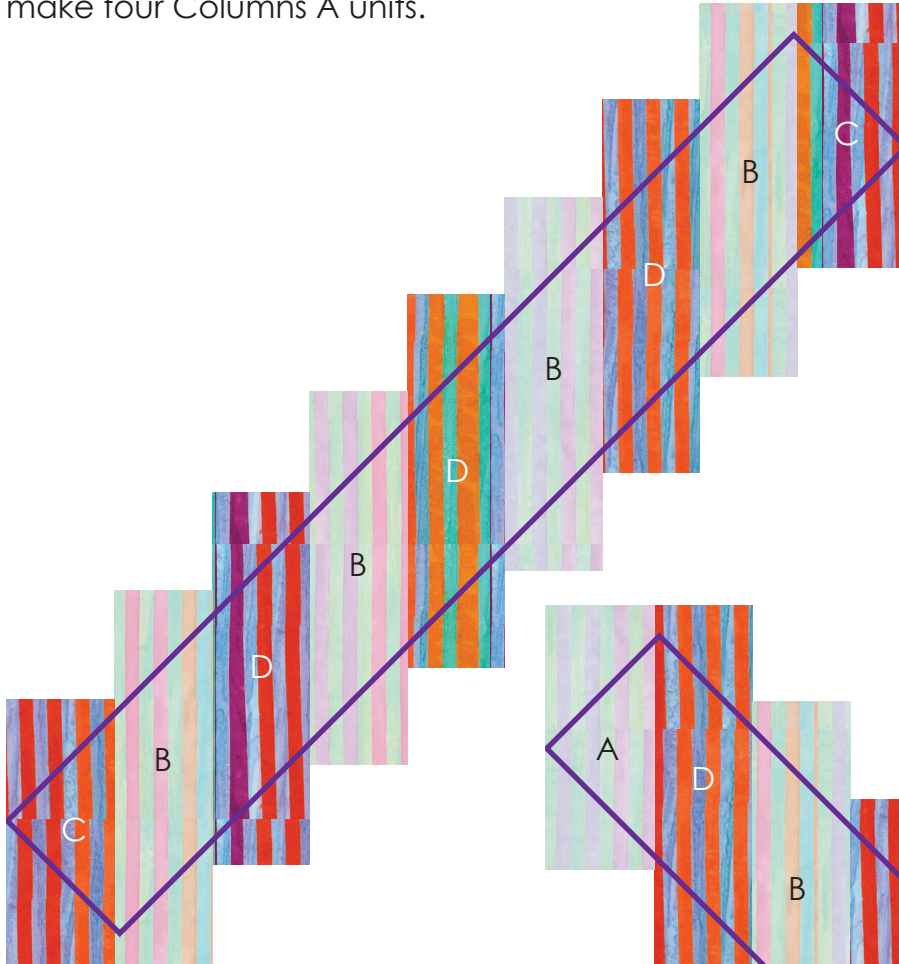
Cut three strips 2-1/4" x WOF for binding.

Assembly

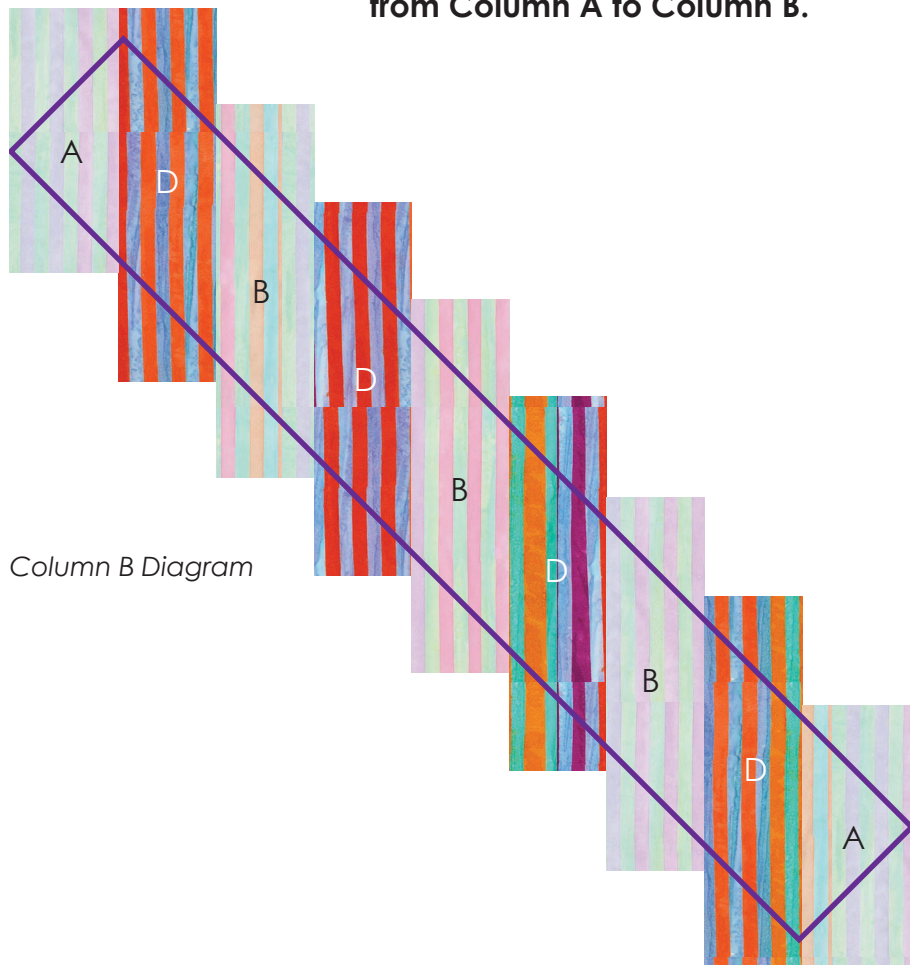
This quilt is made of two sets of columns- four Column A units and four Column B units.

TIP! To keep fabrics in the correct placement, stack fabrics in column units before sewing any fabrics together.

Sew Column A units together, following assembly diagram, using two C, four B and three D pieces. Note that the C pieces are each aligned to a B piece at one end. All other pieces are offset by $2\frac{1}{8}$ ". Press seams to one side. Trim Column A to $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $24\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat to make four Columns A units.

Repeat this process to make the four Column B units. **Pay close attention to the differences in fabric placement and orientation from Column A to Column B.**

Sew columns together, alternating Columns A-B-A-B-A-B-A-B to make the top. Press seams open.




Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

Bubblegum Chevrons

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Cutting Instructions

Fabric A

Cut six strips at 2-5/8" x WOF, sub cut thirty-two A pieces 2-5/8" x 7-7/8".

Fabric B

Cut six strips at 2-5/8" x WOF.

- Sub cut sixteen B pieces 2-5/8" x 5-3/4".

- Sub cut twenty-four C pieces 2-5/8"x 7-7/8.

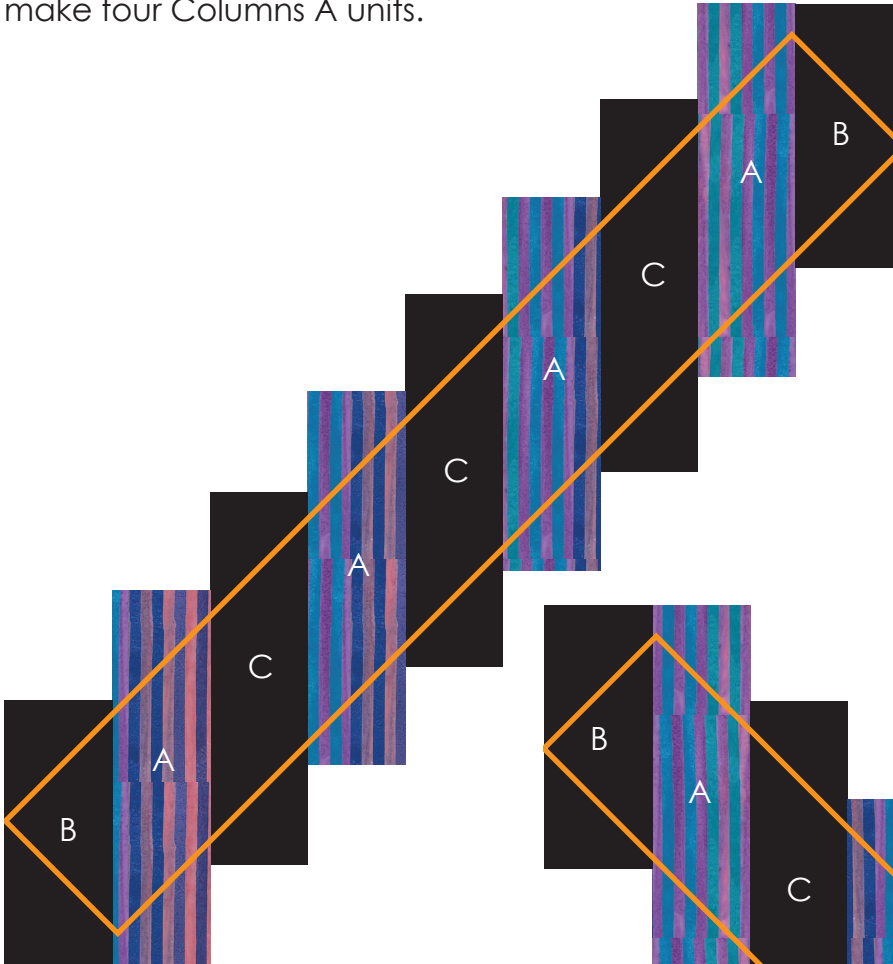
Cut three strips 2-1/4" x WOF for binding.

Assembly

This quilt is made of two sets of columns- four Column A units and four Column B units.

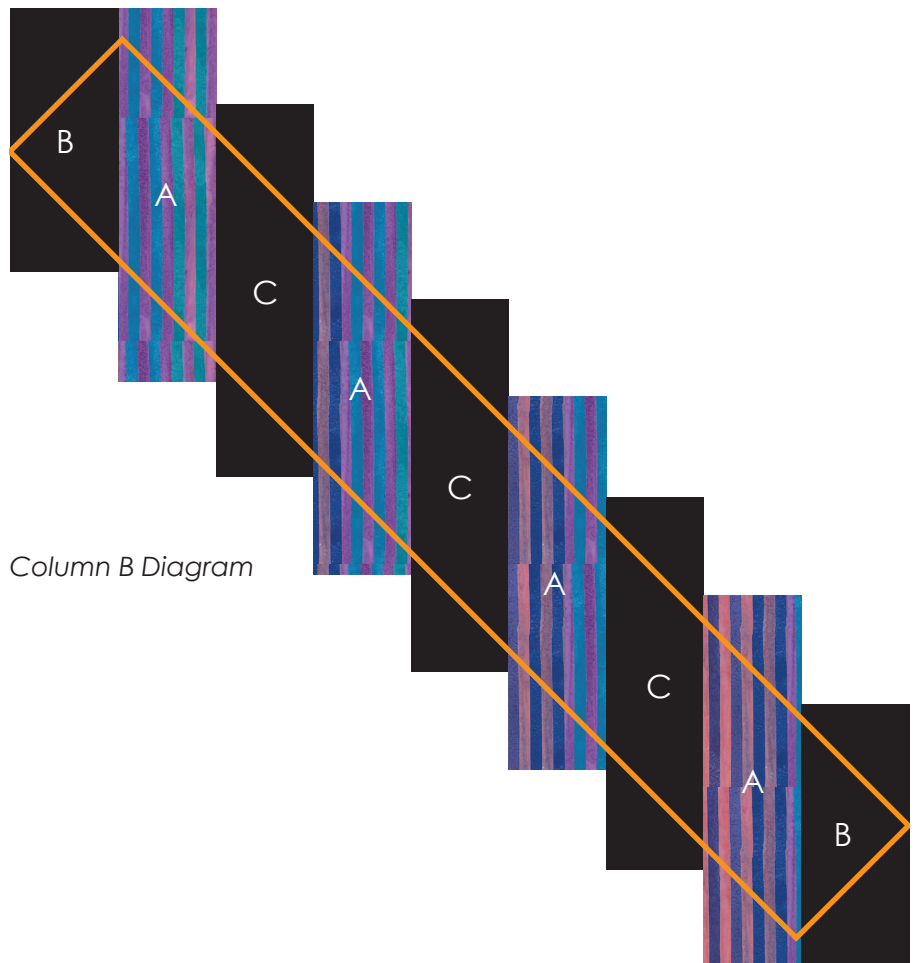
TIP! To keep fabrics in the correct placement, stack fabrics in column units before sewing any fabrics together.

Sew Column A units together, following assembly diagram, using two B, three C and four A pieces. Note that the B pieces are each aligned to an A piece at one end. All other pieces are offset by $2\frac{1}{8}$ ". Press seams to one side. Trim Column A to $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $24\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat to make four Columns A units.



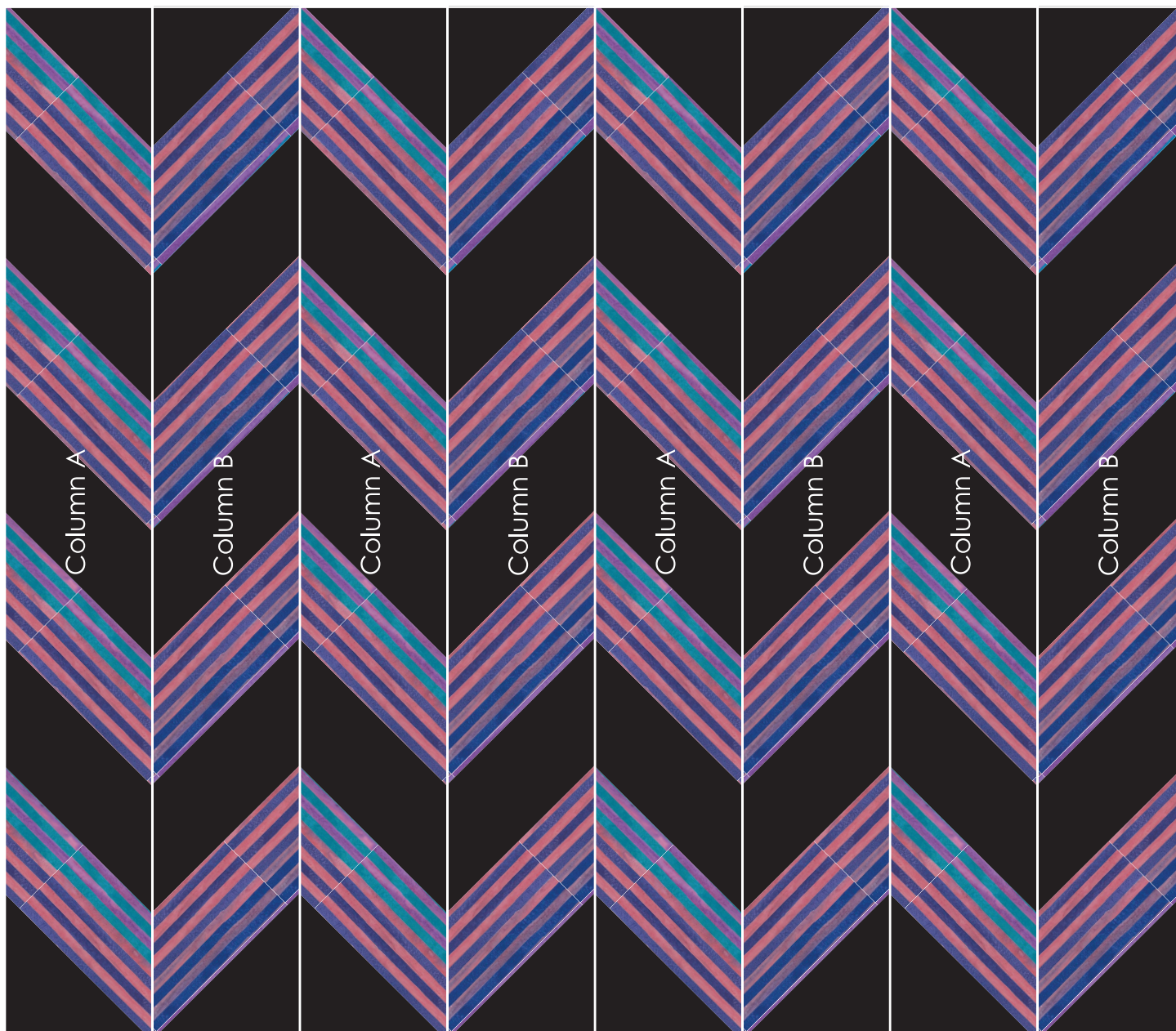
Column A Diagram

Repeat this process to make the four Column B units. **Note that the orientation is a mirror image from the Column A units!**

Sew columns together, alternating Columns A-B-A-B-A-B-A-B to make the top. Press seams open.





Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

Sorbet Ripples

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Cutting Instructions

Fabric A

Cut six strips 2-5/8" x WOF.

- Sub cut eight A pieces 2-5/8" x 5-3/4".
- Sub cut two B pieces 2-5/8" x 7-7/8".
- Sub cut two C pieces 2-5/8" x 14-1/4".
- Sub cut three D pieces 2-5/8" x 12-1/8".
- Sub cut two E pieces 2-5/8" x 22-3/4".
- Sub cut one F piece 2-5/8" x 29-1/8".

Fabric B

Cut six strips 2-5/8" x WOF.

- Sub cut four G pieces 2-5/8" x 7-7/8".
- Sub cut four H pieces 2-5/8" x 10".
- Sub cut two I pieces 2-5/8" x 12-1/8".
- Sub cut two J pieces 2-5/8" x 18-1/2".
- Sub cut two K pieces 2-5/8" x 27".

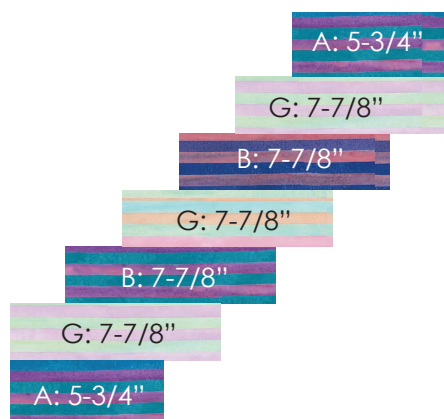
Binding

Cut three strips 2-1/4" x WOF for binding.

Sew the pieces together in four different sections, following the diagram.

TRIMMING NOTE:

Two corners of each section will be slightly too short for the trim size. However, these will be fully covered by the 1/4" seam allowance when sewing the sections together. Remaining two points should meet at seam lines, as illustrated.



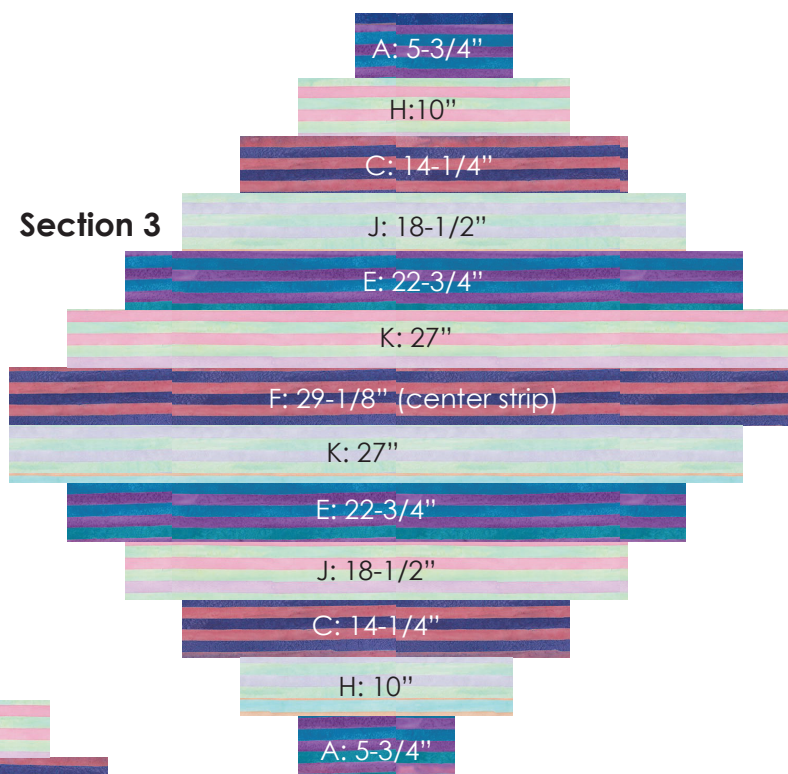

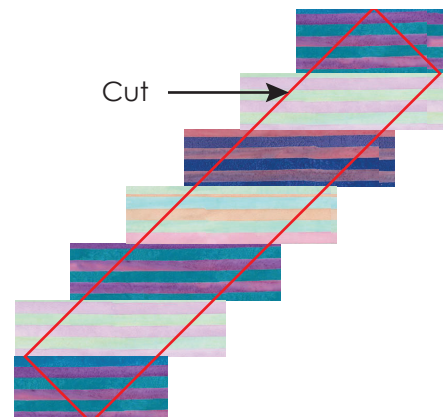

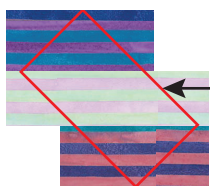


Section 3

Section 1

(Upper Left): Sew together, following assembly diagram, using two A, two B and three G strips. Note that the A strips are aligned to the G strips at one end. All other strips are offset by 2-1/8". Trim Section 1 to 3-1/2" x 18-1/2".



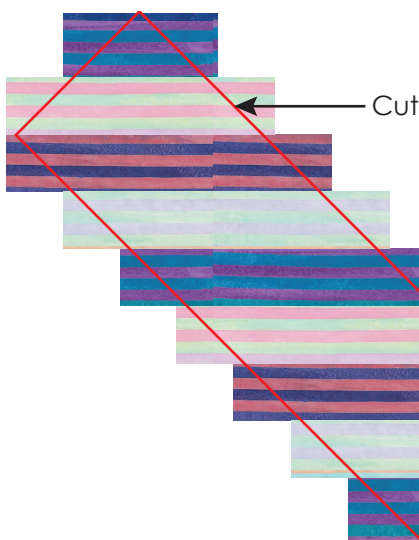
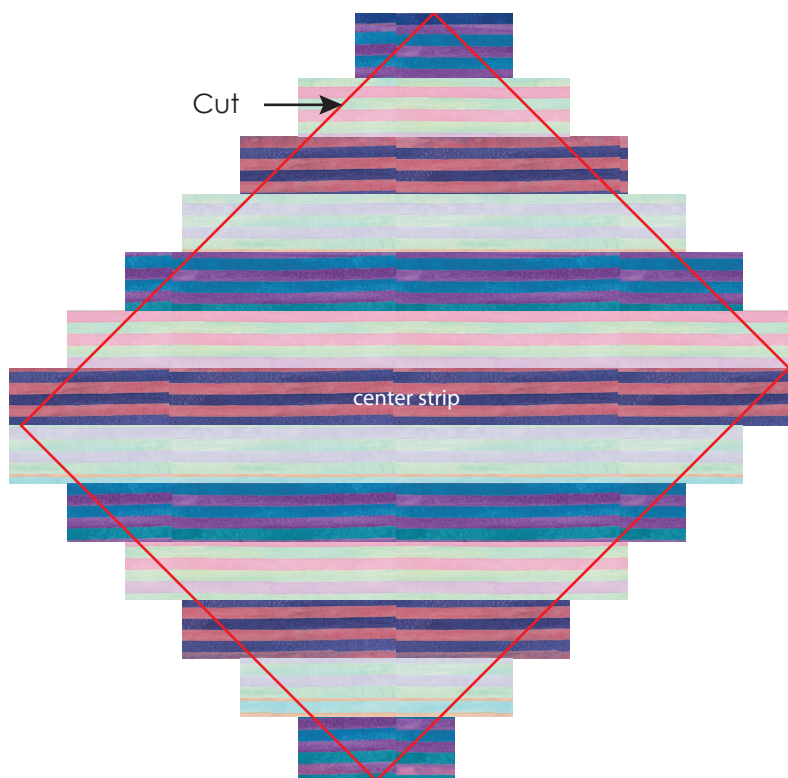


Section 2

(Lower Left): Join A strips along both sides of the G strip, aligning at opposite ends. Trim Section 2 to 3-1/2" x 6-1/2".

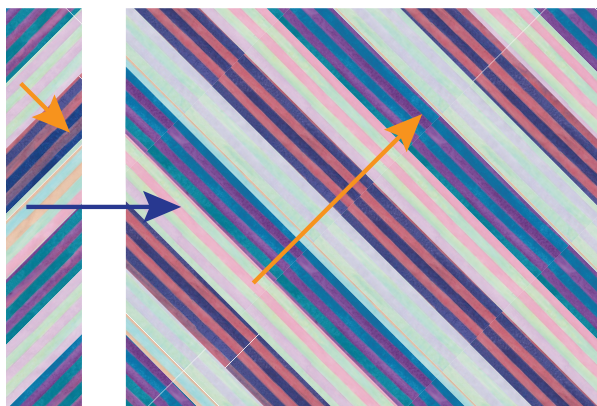
Section 3

(Upper Right): Strips are centered along the lengths before being sewn together. Quickly find the centers of these strips by folding in half and finger pressing, then match the finger pressing marks, pin and sew. Create two halves for this section, then join these halves to the Center Strip. Note that both halves are aligned with opposite ends of the Center Strip. Trim Section 3 to 18-1/2" x 21-1/2".



Section 4

(Lower Right): Sew together, following assembly diagram, using two A, two H, three D and two I strips. Note that the A strips are centered along the length of the H strips. And all H strips are aligned to the D strips at one end. All other strips are offset by 2-1/8". Trim Section 1 to 6-1/2" x 21-1/2".



Press seams to one side for each unit as shown in the diagram to the left. Orange arrows indicate direction to press seams for each section. Blue arrows indicate direction to press seams after two sections have been sewn together.

Sew upper sections together, pressing seam to the right. Sew lower sections together, pressing seam to the left. Sew quilt top together, nesting seams and pressing open.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
