

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

From Fabric A, cut:

three 11-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: nine 11-1/2" squares three 6" squares

one 10-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: one 10-1/2" square five 6" squares

ten 6" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixty-six 6" squares three 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-one 5-1/2" squares

From Fabric B, cut:

two 6-1/8" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 6-1/8" squares four 6" squares

From Fabric C, cut:

two 6-1/8" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 6-1/8" squares one 6" square one 6" x WOF strip. Subcut: seven 6" squares

From Fabric D, cut:

two 6-1/8" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 6-1/8" squares three 6" squares three 6" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-one 6" squares

From Fabric E, cut:

two 6-1/8" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 6-1/8" squares three 6" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 6" squares

From Fabric F, cut:

one 6-1/8" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 6-1/8" squares three 6" x WOF strips. Subcut: eighteen 6" squares

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 6" Fabric A square with a 6" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 5-1/2" square. Repeat to make eight A/B HSTs.

Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make:

*There is one extra A/F that can be discarded.

Assemble the Flying Geese (FG)

Step 3: Pin two 6-1/8" Fabric B squares in opposing corners of a 11-1/2" Fabric A square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.



Step 4: Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.


Step 5: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.


Step 6: Place one 6-1/8" Fabric B square at the corner of a sewn block unit. Draw a diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.



Step 7: Press the seam toward the smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 5-1/2" x 10-1/2" if necessary. Repeat to make eight A/B FG units.




Step 8: Repeat with all remaining 11-1/2" Fabric A squares and 6-1/8" Fabric C-F squares to make a total of:










*There are three extra A/F FG units that can be discarded.

Step 9: Arrange the HSTs, FG units, and squares into fifteen rows of thirteen blocks. Note the fabric placement and orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 10: Sew the HSTs, FG units, and squares together to form rows. Press the seams to the left in the oddnumbered rows and to the right in the evennumbered rows.

Step 11: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy! Assemble the Quilt



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
