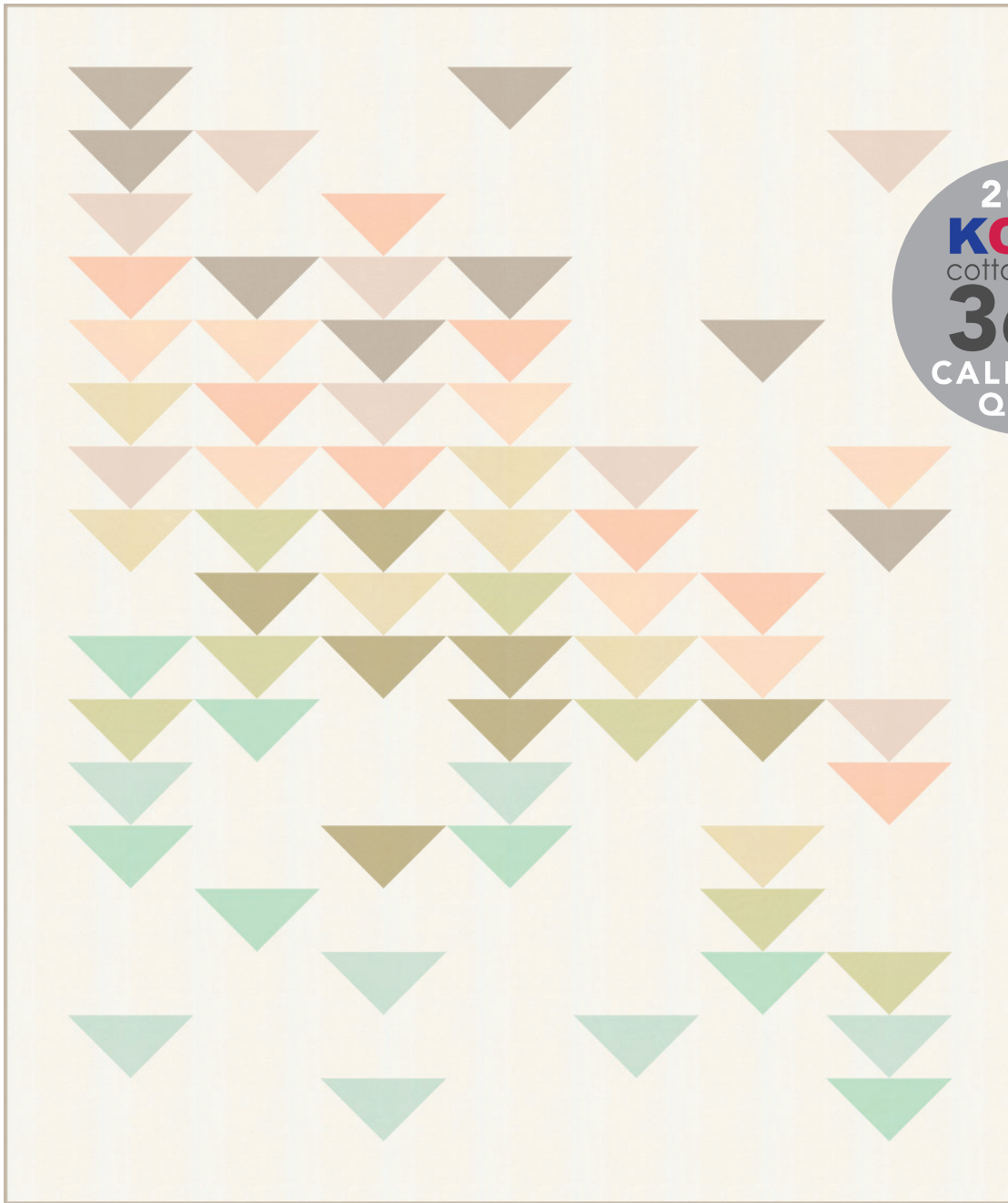

Finished quilt measures: 64" x 76"













Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

six 8-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

- one 8-1/2" x 24-1/2" rectangle
- four 8-1/2" x 16-1/2" rectangles
- two 8-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles
- eight 8-1/2" squares

nine 4-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:

- seventy-two 4-7/8" squares for the Flying Geese

ten 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

- nine 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles

Sew the remaining seven strips together, end-to-end, then subcut:

- two 4-1/2" x 68-1/2" side outer borders
- two 4-1/2" x 64-1/2" top/bottom outer borders

From each of Fabrics B-J, cut:

one 9-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

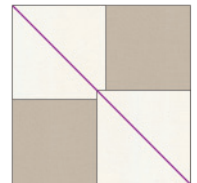
- two 9-1/4" squares for the Flying Geese

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

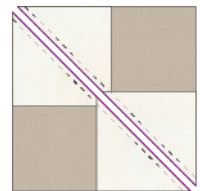
eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Flying Geese

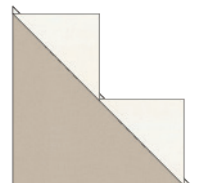
Step 1: Pin two 4-7/8" Fabric A squares in opposing corners of a 9-1/4" Fabric B square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.



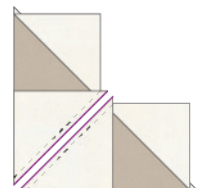
Step 2: Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.



Step 3: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.



Step 4: Place one 4-7/8" Fabric A square at the corner of sewn block unit. Draw diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along diagonal line, creating two identical units.



Step 5: Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" if necessary. Repeat to make four flying geese blocks.



Step 6: Repeat with all remaining 4-7/8" Fabric A squares and 9-1/4" Fabric B-J squares to make a total of eight flying geese blocks from each fabric. Set aside one flying geese unit from each of Fabrics E-J for use in another project.

Assemble the Quilt

Step 7: Arrange the Flying Geese units and Fabric A squares and rectangles to form Column 1, as shown in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Note the fabric placement and block orientation.

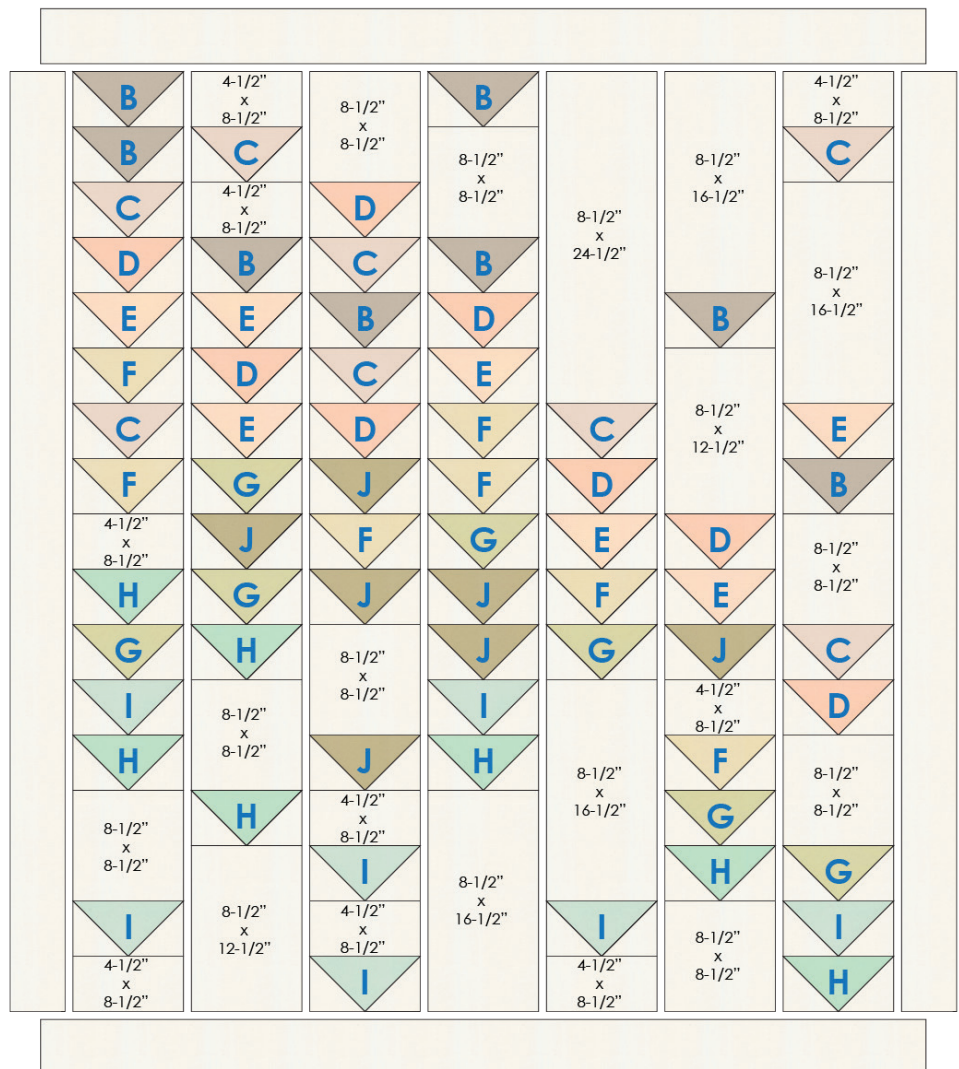
Step 8: Sew the units together to form the column. Press the seams down.

Step 9: Repeat Steps 4 and 5 to assemble Columns 2-7, sewing the units together to form the columns. Press the seams down in the odd numbered columns and up in the even numbered columns.

Step 10: Sew the columns together to form the quilt center. Press the seams open or to one side.

Step 11: Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!



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
