

## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## **Cutting Instructions**

#### Fabric I

- Cut two strips 8-1/2" x WOF.
  - Subcut one strip into two rectangles 8-1/2" x 13" and one square 8-1/2" x 8-1/2".
  - Subcut one strip into six rectangles 5-1/2" x 8-1/2".
- Cut four strips 5-1/2" x WOF
  - Subcut two strips into six rectangles 5-1/2" x 13".
  - Subcut two strips into nine squares 5-1/2" x 5-1/2".
- Cut two strips 3-1/2" x WOF.
  - Subcut into eight rectangles 3-1/2" x 9-1/2".
- Cut two strips 5" x WOF.
  - Subcut into eight rectangles 5" x 9-1/2".
- Cut one square 13" x 13".

#### Fabrics A and F

- Cut one strip 9-1/2" x WOF.
  - Subcut one strip into four rectangles 5-1/2" x 9-1/2" and two squares 9-1/2" x 9-1/2".
- Cut one rectangle 8-1/2" x 9-1/2".
- Cut two squares 5" x 5".

#### Fabrics B and E

- Cut one strip 9-1/2" x WOF.
  - Subcut into two rectangles 9-1/2" x 19-1/2".
- Cut one rectangle 8-1/2" x 9-1/2".
- Cut two squares 5" x 5".

#### Fabrics C, D, G and H

- Cut one strip 9-1/2" x WOF.
  - Subcut into one rectangle 9-1/2" x 19-1/2" and one rectangle 9-1/2" x 22-1/2".
- Cut one rectangle 5-1/2" x 9-1/2".
- Cut two squares 5" x 5".

#### From the Binding Fabric

-Cut seven strips 2-1/2" x WOF.

## Assembly Instructions


## Step 1: Make the Flying Geese Units

- Gather up all of the 5" x 5" squares (two each for fabrics A-H) and draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each square.




- Place a 5" x 5" Fabric A square onto a 5" x 9-1/2" Fabric I rectangle right sides together and with left edges aligned.
- Sew along the drawn line.
- Trim the seam allowance to 1/4" and press flat.
- Place a second 5" x 5" Fabric A square onto the Fabric I rectangle right sides together and with right edges aligned.
- Sew along the drawn line.
- Trim the seam allowance to 1/4".
- Press geese unit flat.
- Repeat steps to make Flying Geese Units for Fabrics B-H (one each).









Step 2: Assemble the Rows



- Assemble Row 1. Sew the smaller pieces in Row 1 together first to make larger units and then sew those units together to make a complete row. Refer to the diagram above.

- Next, make Row 3. It is assembled the same way as Row 1, but the top pieces are smaller.



Next, sew Row 2 together referring to the diagram above.




Completed Row 2


- Row 4 is pieced the same way as Row 2, but you will be using Fabric D instead of Fabric H.



Completed Row 4




- Sew Row 5 together according to the diagram above.

## Step 3: Assemble the Quilt Top

- Sew the five rows together in order. Be sure to match seams so that the "streamers" line up.
- Your top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!



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
