

# Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.


## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## **Cutting Instructions**

#### From Fabric A, cut:

six 8-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty-one Template A pieces



## From Fabric B, cut:


five 8-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-nine Template A pieces

#### From Fabric C, cut:

ten 8-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixty Template A pieces

#### From each of Fabric D-G, cut:

two 8-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: fifteen Template B pieces.



#### From each of Fabrics H-K, cut:

two 8-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: fifteen Template B pieces.

#### From Fabric L, cut:

nine 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Set aside for the binding.

## Make the A Blocks



**Step 1:** Arrange one Template B piece from each of Fabrics D-G with one Fabric A, one Fabric B and two Fabric C pieces. Refer to the Block Assembly Diagram for fabric placement.

Note: To achieve the correct look for the quilt, it is essential that all A Blocks are constructed identically.


**Step 2:** Sew one Template A piece to a neighboring Template B piece, forming four pairs. Press seams toward the Template A pieces.



Sew the pairs together, forming two block halves. Press the seams toward the Template A pieces.

**Step 3:** Sew two half-blocks together, offsetting slightly at the edges so that the center points match after sewing. Press seam open.

Repeat to make eight A Blocks.



#### Make the B Blocks



**Step 4:** Arrange one Template B piece from each of Fabrics H-K with two Fabric B and two Fabric C pieces. Refer to the Block Assembly Diagram for fabric placement.

Note: To achieve the correct look for the quilt, it is essential that all B Blocks are constructed identically.

Repeat the process as in the A Block construction to make seven B Blocks.

#### Make the C Blocks



**Step 5:** Arrange one Template B piece from each of Fabrics D-G with one Fabric A, one Fabric B and two Fabric C pieces. Refer to the Block Assembly Diagram for fabric placement.

Note: To achieve the correct look for the quilt, it is essential that all C Blocks are constructed identically.

Repeat the process as in the previous block construction to make seven C Blocks.


### Make the D Blocks



**Step 6:** Arrange one Template B piece from each of Fabrics H-K with two Fabric A and two Fabric C pieces. Refer to the Block Assembly Diagram for fabric placement.

Note: To achieve the correct look for the quilt, it is essential that all D Blocks are constructed identically.

Repeat the process as in the previous block construction to make eight D Blocks.



**Step 7:** Referring to the Quilt Assembly Diagram, arrange the blocks into six rows of five blocks each. Confirm correct block placements and orientation before sewing blocks into rows.

**Step 8:** Sew blocks into rows, pressing seams to the left in odd numbered rows and to the right in even numbered rows.

**Step 9:** Sew rows together, nesting seams. Press seams open.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
