

Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, fussy cut:

twenty-eight 4-1/2" squares

From Fabric B, cut:

four 5-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty-eight 5-1/4" squares for the Large Flying Geese

three 3-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty-eight 3-1/4" squares for the Small Flying Geese

four 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

forty-four 2-1/2" squares

thirteen 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles

two 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

four 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

one hundred-twelve 1-1/2" squares

From Fabric C, cut:

two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty-eight 2-1/2" squares

six 1-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:

one hundred twelve 1-7/8" squares for the Small Flying Geese

From each of Fabrics D-G, cut:

two 2-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty-eight 2-7/8" squares

From Fabric H, cut:

five 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 1-1/2" x 50-1/2" side inner borders

two 1-1/2" x 46-1/2" top/bottom inner borders

From Fabric I, cut:

two 4-1/2" x length of fabric strips. Subcut:

two 4-1/2" x 52-1/2" side outer borders

From the remaining width of fabric, cut:

four 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

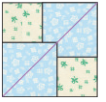
two 4-1/2" x 54-1/2" top/bottom outer borders

From the Binding, cut:

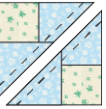
six 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

Assemble the Flying Geese Units

Step 1: Pin two 1-7/8" Fabric C squares in opposing corners of a 3-1/4" Fabric B square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.



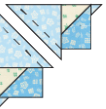
Step 2: Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.



Step 3: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.



Step 4: Place one 1-7/8" Fabric C square at the corner of sewn block unit. Draw diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along diagonal line, creating two identical units.



Step 5: Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" if necessary. Repeat to make four flying geese blocks.

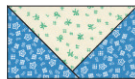


Step 6: Repeat with all remaining 1-7/8" Fabric C squares and 3-1/4" Fabric B squares to make a total of one hundred twelve Small Flying Geese units.

Step 7: Repeat Steps 1-6 with the 2-7/8" Fabric D-G squares and 5-1/4" Fabric B squares to make a total of:



twenty-eight Fabric D/B
Large Flying Geese units

Large Flying Geese units

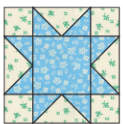


twenty-eight Fabric F/B

Assemble the Star Blocks



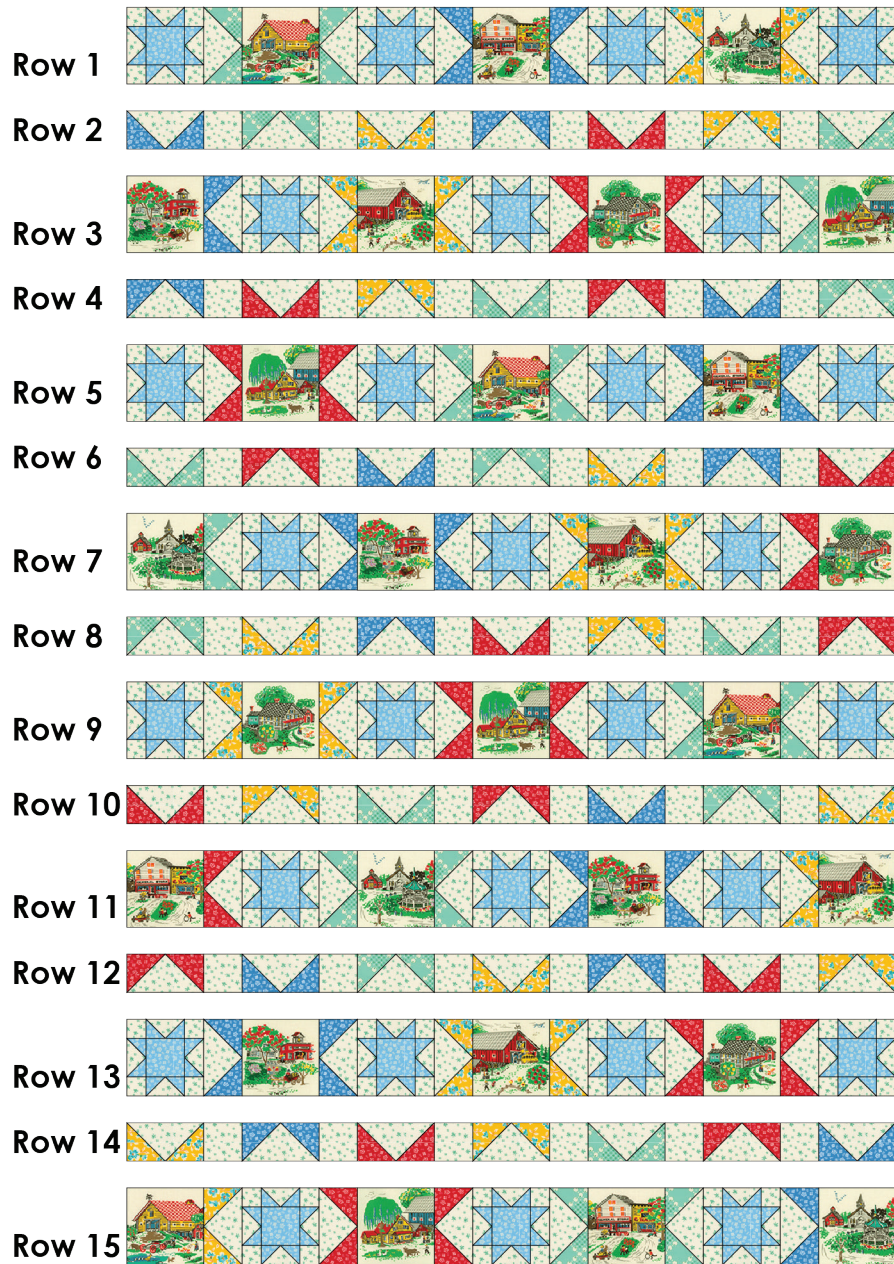
Step 8: Gather:
four 1-1/2" Fabric B squares
one 2-1/2" Fabric C square
four Small Flying Geese units

Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 9: Sew the units together to form the rows. Press the seams toward the squares.

Step 10: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the 4-1/2" square Star Block. Repeat to make twenty-seven Star Blocks.

Assemble the Quilt



Step 11: Arrange the units into fifteen rows, as shown. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 12: Sew the units together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 13: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.



Step 14: Sew the side pieced borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom pieced borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 15: Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 16: Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
